of such marriages fail; only 15 out of 100 have a chance for success. The marriage-failure rate climbs to 100% when the marriage partners are both under 17. The teen-age marriages failed, but not because of infidelity, money, or drinking. The wives blamed family interference and mother-in-law trouble more than any other single reason.

'Boiler room' Bilking Nets \$150 Million

Each year Americans lose some \$150 million in fraudulent stock-selling schemes, the Catholic Digest states.

One of the oldest but most effective schemes of the "boiler room" operator goes like this: he sends a letter to 1,000 persons about Company A stock. The first 500 persons are told that the stock will go down, and the rest that it will go up. A week later the stock has moved one way or the other. The 500 who were advised wrong are ignored. But the other 500 are sent a second letter about Company B; 250 are told that the stock will rise, the other half that it will fall. After the third time, the 125 who have been correctly advised all three times are given a high-pressure sales pitch. On the record of three correct tips in a row, the suckers are convinced that they should get in one the ground floor.



HARVEST FROM SEA COULD END HUNGER

Demographers can see the day when the earth will have to feed ten times as many people as it does now. We must learn how to farm the sea as efficiently as we do the land, they say in the Catholic Digest.

Feeding the world's growing billions on plankton soup is just so much talk. But fish flour is another matter. This is fish reduced to liquid protein, disinfected, and dried to flour. It can be made cheaply, is easily transported, and can be stored without refrigeration. And, it uses the whole fish, even the head, tail, stomach, and intestines. This is a distinct health advantage, for it is the parts of the fish we normally throw away that have the most vitamins.

Eating the whole fish seems repulsive to some, but stop and think. Except for the shell, we eat the whole oyster, mussel, and clam. Few people throw away any part of a soft-shelled crab, and it isn't cleaned before it's cooked. Shrimp are seldom cleaned. Many Americans eat smelt and grunion whole and uncleaned.

Fish flour can be made into fish cakes or become an odorless, tasteless supplement to cereals, breads, and soups. Coarse fish meal is already a popular livestock and chicken feed.

About half of the fish now caught by commercial fishermen are tossed overboard as trash. Another good proportion of the catch is discarded as waste in cleaning. When we learn to harvest the sea efficiently, the commercial production of fish flour will turn all this into a money crop and an important weapon against malnutrition.




