## BCHS MUSIC DEPARTMENT CONCERT TOMORROW NIGHT

On May 7, the Bethlehem Central Music Department will present its 30th Spring Concert. The program will include the Senior High Concert Choir, Choraliers, Orchestra, Concert Band, and Dance Band. The concert will be held at the Senior High auditorium at 8:00 P.M.

Highlights of the program include orchestral arrangements of both light and serious compositions. Among these are Durand's "Mademoiselle de Paris," Corelli's "Adagio and Allegro," and "The Finale from Beethoven's Fifth Symphony."

The Bethlehem Concert Choir will sing selections from "The Sound of Music" by Rodgers and Hammerstein. The Choraliers have chosen a varied program including "Hello Dolly" by Herman, "Father William" from Alice in Wonderland by Fine, and Maragris "Anthem for Spring." This

The evening's performance will also include a short interlude of light jazz played by the Dance Band.

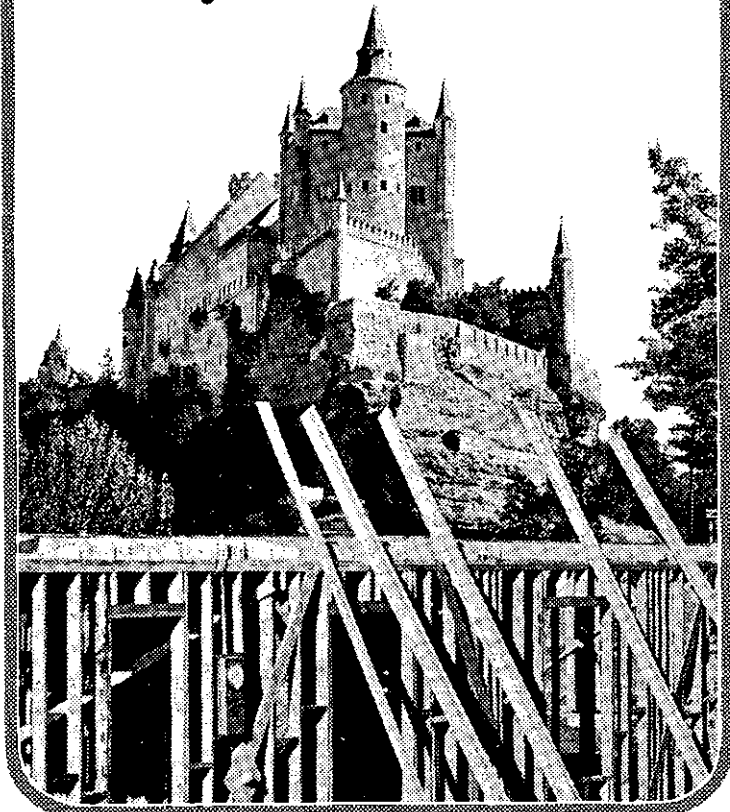

### Summer Course Registration

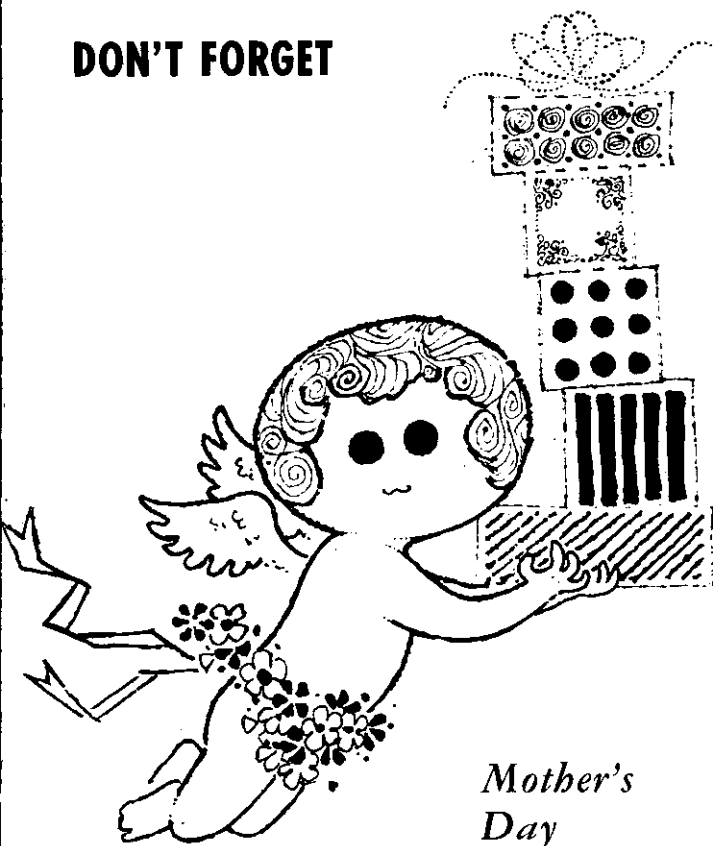
Registration for the summer courses in Personal Typing and Driver Education in the Bethlehem Central School District will begin May 17. Applications will be accepted until Friday, May 21, in the senior high school guidance office.

Students who will be in grades 10-12 as of September 1965 will have the opportunity to study Driver Education if they

are 16 years of age on or before July 10, 1965 and have not earned a New York State drivers license. One major change from the previous years is that the course will be extended from six weeks to nine weeks, beginning July 6 and ending September 3. Two sections will be open to students, one beginning at 8 a.m. and the other at noon. Students

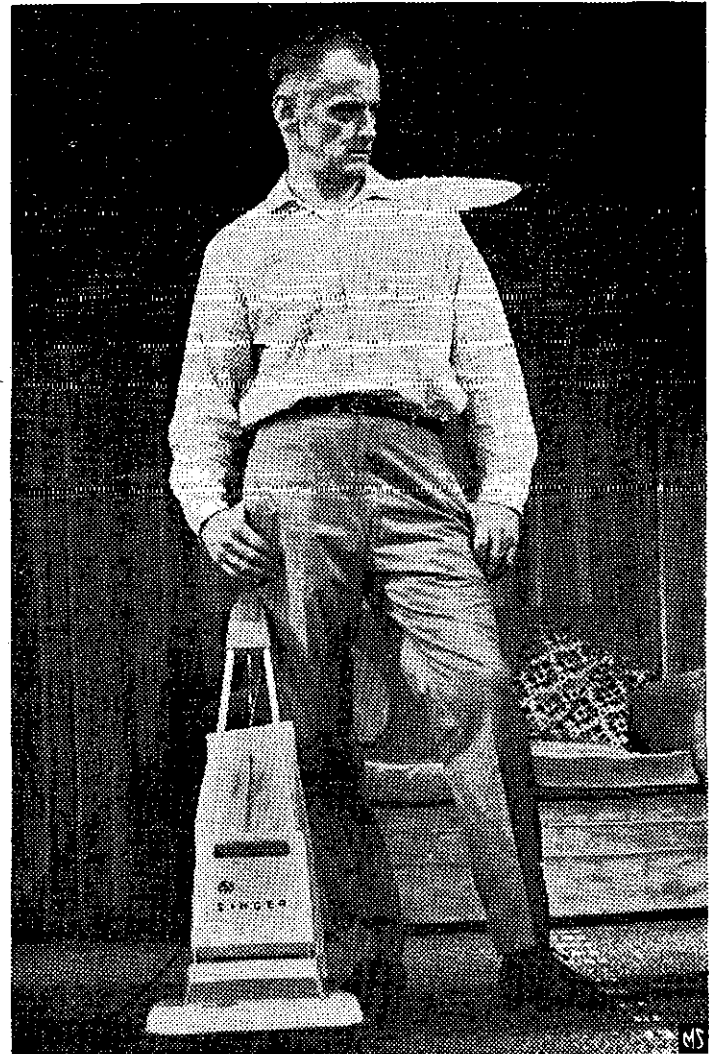

**ART CARNEY CO-STARS IN BROADWAY HIT,**

*"A Long Way From The Sewer," He Says*



Art Carney is a study in housewifely zeal as he vacuums the rug in a hilarious scene from the new Broadway smash, "The Odd Couple." The play, which received rave notices, concerns two men, one divorced and the other separated, who share an apartment and ultimately have the same arguments they had with their respective spouses.

Art Carney has risen from the sewers to a starring berth in Broadway's biggest hit, "The Odd Couple." "And it was Jackie Gleason who put me in the sewers," he recalls.

"About twelve years ago I was an out-of-work radio actor looking for a job. Then The Great One auditioned me. The next thing I knew I was earning a thousand a week playing Ed Norton, the friendly sewer worker on a network television show."

Carney was a regular on Gleason's show for six years. As his popularity with TV audiences became established, he took on other acting chores which demonstrated his enormous versatility. Carney's early acting television efforts in-

cluded "Charley's Aunt," "Panama Hattie" and the leading role in the TV version of the Broadway comedy hit, "Harvey."

"It was a wonderful opportunity to prove that I could be more than a comic," he says.

He began his professional career in 1938 doing comedy bits, novelty songs and impersonations, and made his first Broadway appearance in 1957 in the "Rope Dancers."

Carney's film career will be launched in the soon-to-be-released MGM motion picture, "The Yellow Rolls Royce."

"But nothing can replace the thrill of starring in a Broadway hit like "The Odd Couple," he says with a smile. "Not even working in the sewers."



will make arrangements for scheduling through the instructor. In addition to the one hour of class work, each student will receive one hour of road instruction, alternating between two and three days a week.

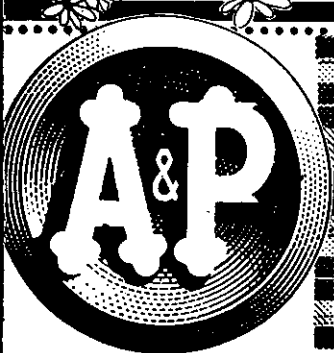

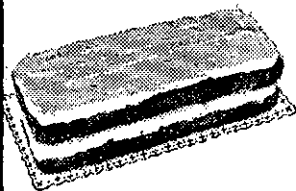

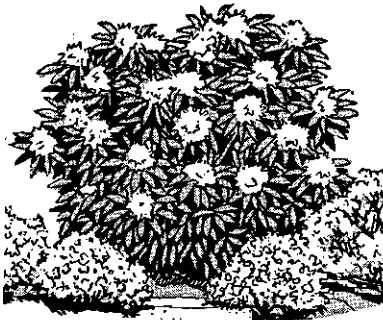

#### Rienows Publish New Book

Robert Rienow and Leona Train Rienow, of Selkirk, are authors of a new book, *Of Snuff, Sin, & the Senate*, published by the Follett Publishing Company.

The volume treats the buccaneer history of the U.S. "Senate of Shame" from 1875 to the passage of the 17th Amendment which provided for the popular election of Senators. It is a study of the links of state bossism with the Senate of the United States, and across its pages stride such notorious figures as the red-bearded, handsome Roscoe Conkling of Utica whose feminine conquests helped to destroy him; the cat-like Tom Platt, undisputed boss of New York; droopy-eyed Matt Quay of the infamous Pennsylvania political machine; and many others.

Earnings of the veterans making poppies, who are the only paid workers in the poppy program, were estimated at \$300,000.

The poppies are shaped from crepe paper with wire stems, and resemble closely the European wild poppy which bloomed in the battle fields and cemeteries.

**Fact:** Only for a short time. Dry cleaning offers no lasting guarantee.

**Fiction:** The odor of sulphur, candles, cedar, newsprint, tobacco, and tar paper kill moths.

**Fact:** Old wives' tales, all. Only the fumes of a chemical agent like Solvay para crystals available at your local drugstore and supermarket, are powerful enough to kill eggs, larvae and moths all in one swoop.

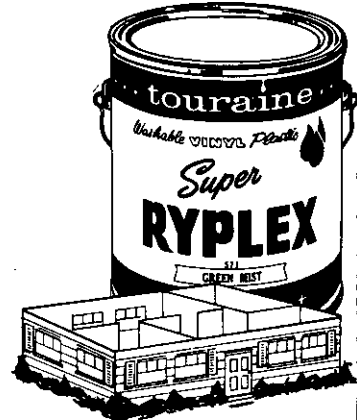
**Fiction:** Stored clothing must be sent to the cleaner to remove the moth ball odor.

Three Tri-Village men don't have to just dream, in Walter Mitty fashion, about piloting an airplane. They've turned the dream into a reality, and today are licensed pilots and members of a local flying club. They take to the skies whenever time - and weather conditions - make it possible.

The local threesome includes Dr. Levon Bedrosian, Mr. Raymond A. Dechene, and Mr. E. Richard Hannmann. They belong to Upper 15, Inc., a flying club originally organized by students at Siena College. Club members now number about 25, and they own two planes which are based at the Albany County Airport.

Dr. Bedrosian, an Albany obstetrician known as "Lefty" to almost everyone, told me he's always been interested in flying, but he didn't have time to get his license until four years ago. He pointed out that it isn't as easy to fly a plane as it is to drive a car - contrary to some advertising messages - but he's

attracted to flying because of "the thrill of being in the air."

His enthusiasm for flying is matched by Mr. Dechene, an accountant for George Dorfman & Co., who took up the hobby about two years ago. "People who are afraid of flying lack knowledge of how a plane operates," he maintains.

Mr. Dechene and Dr. Bedrosian just returned last week from a flying trip together to California. Gary Bedrosian and Mark Dechene, both 13, accompanied their fathers on the Easter Vacation trip.

Mrs. Bedrosian and Richard, 9, made the trip both ways by train - and turned out to be the tortoise that beat the hare. Bad weather kept the Piper Cherokee from making good time, and so hampered the flyers on the trip home that they had to leave their craft in Youngstown, Ohio, and go back for it a few days later.

Mrs. Bedrosian doesn't yet share her husband's great interest in flying, confessing to a few

fears, but the family trip was made to visit Dr. Bedrosian's family in Fresno, Calif.

Mr. Dechene and Mark took the trip for the fun of it, and to do some sightseeing on the West Coast.
