will conclude the first part of the program conducted by Mr. James Rhodes.







Rienows Publish New Book

Robert Rienow and Leona Train Rienow, of Selkirk, are authors of a new book, Of Snuff, Sin, & the Senate, published by the Follett Publishing Company.

Summer Swim Program

The Bethlehem Board of Education and the Town of Bethlehem jointly sponsor the summer swimming program at the Bethlehem Central Junior and Senior High School pools for the children and residents of the school district. The program includes class instruction for all levels of swimming, recreational swimming for youth and adults and will run for 8 weeks beginning June 27 and closing August 20.

Joseph A. Guerrera, District Director of Health, Physical Education and Recreation, announces that parents may register their children during the month of May for the instruc-tional program in the neighborhood schools, St. Thomas School and the Junior and Senior High Schools. Brochures describing registration procedures and registration forms to parents will be issued to all pupils enrolled in the schools.

Bus transportation for instructional and recreational swimming will be provided by the school district throughout the summer.

Adult and family swim sessions will be held at the Junior High pool each Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7:30 tc 9:30 P.M. and on Sundays from 1:30 to 4:30 P. M.

The program officially opens on June 27 with a family swim session.

That "affliction" is moths those devious little pests who are usually brought to mind in the fall when a hole appears in that stored garment. But the time to think and do something about them is in the spring during the annual cleaning. Then put them out of your mind with your clothes for the rest of the vear.



With spring cleaning just around the corner, here are some common myths along with some truths about moths which may surprise you:

Fiction: Moths are a menace only during the spring and summer.

Fact: Unfortunately, the little critters chew up your clothes year round. They thrive in warm, dark places and humid weather encourages them.

Fiction: Moths eat only wool.

Fact: They aren't that discriminating. Hair, fur, feathers, wool blends and some manmade fibers appeal to their sweet tooth: And they'll chew through plenty of other things to get at them.

Fiction: Adult flying moths are the most dangerous.

Fact: By that time, they're more or less retired. It's the larvae who do the damage.

Fiction: Clothes that have been freshly cleaned are mothproof. Fact: Only for a short time. Dry cleaning offers no lasting guarantee.

Fiction: The odor of sulphur, candles, cedar, newsprint, to-bacco, and tar paper kill moths. Fact: Old wives' tales, all. Only the fumes of a chemical agent like Solvay para crystals avail-able at your local drugstore and supermarket, are powerful enough to kill eggs, larvae and moths all in one swoop.

Fiction: Stored clothing must be sent to the cleaner to remove the moth ball odor.

Fact: Yes-unless you use para crystals. Para (called paradi-chlorobenzene by the chemical industry) vapors disappear with just a short airing on the



Three Tri-Village men don't have to just dream, in Walter Mitty fashion, about piloting an airplane. They've turned the dream into a reality, and today are licensed pilots and members of a local flying club. They take to the skies whenever time - and weather conditions - make it possible.

His enthusiasm for flying is matched by Mr. Dechene, an accountant for George Dorfman & Co., who took up the hobby about two years ago. "People who are afraid of flying lack knowledge of how a plane operates," he maintains.

Mr. Dechene and Dr. Bedrosian just returned last week from a flying trip together to California. Gary Bedrosian and Mark Dechene, both 13, accompanied their fathers on the Easter Vacation trip.

Mrs. Bedrosian and Richard, 9, made the trip both ways by train - and turned out to be the tortoise that beat the hare. Bad weather kept the Piper Cherokee from making good time, and so hampered the flyers on the trip home that they had to leave their craft in Youngstown, Ohio, and g back for it a few days later.

Mrs. Bedrosian doesn't yet share her husband's great interest in flying, confessing to a few




