The graduate level cooperative program between Siena and Saint Rose will be continued. Under this plan, with the permission of their respective deans, students may take up to 12 hours on the campus of the other college, to be counted toward degree requirements in the home institution. Courses being offered under this program are: Colonization of North America, The World in the Twentieth Century, and Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary and the Succession States.

In the undergraduate level, courses in biology, chemistry, astronomy and physics will be offered. As in other years, the undergraduate program will also include the variety of other fields such as music, philosophy, sociology, business education, economics, and German.

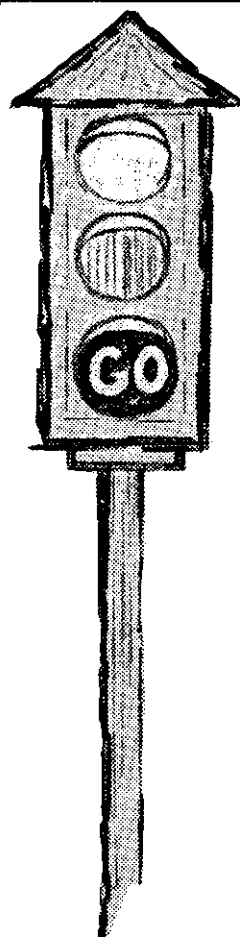

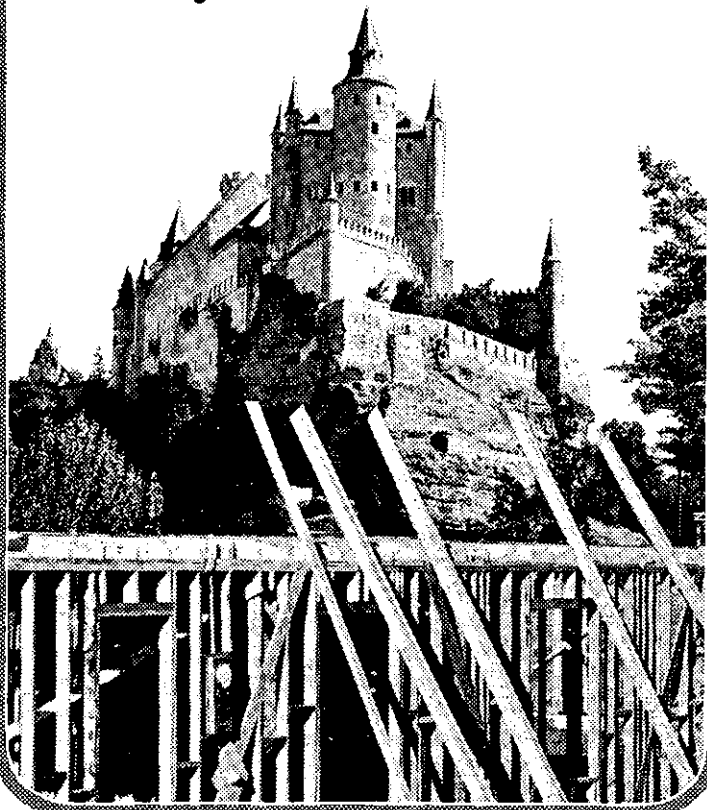

Compositions written by the Music Literature Study Group range from an impressionistic piano piece to a string trio for two violins and viola.

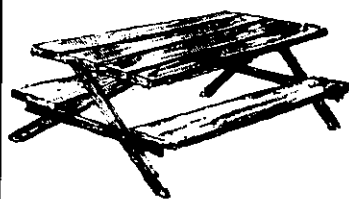
