

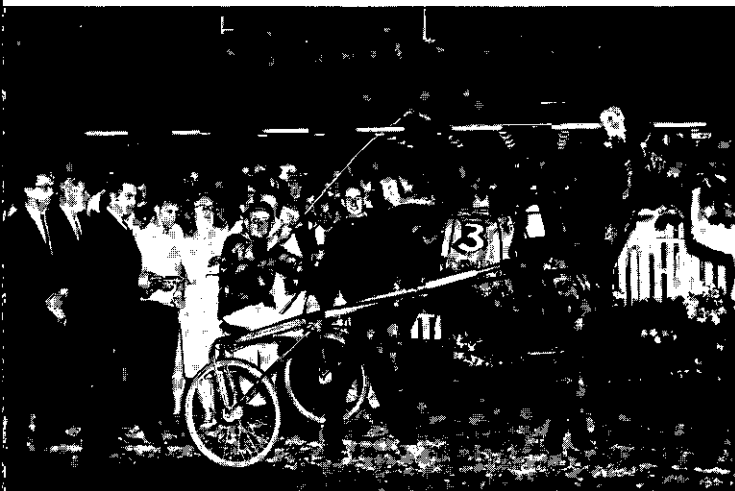

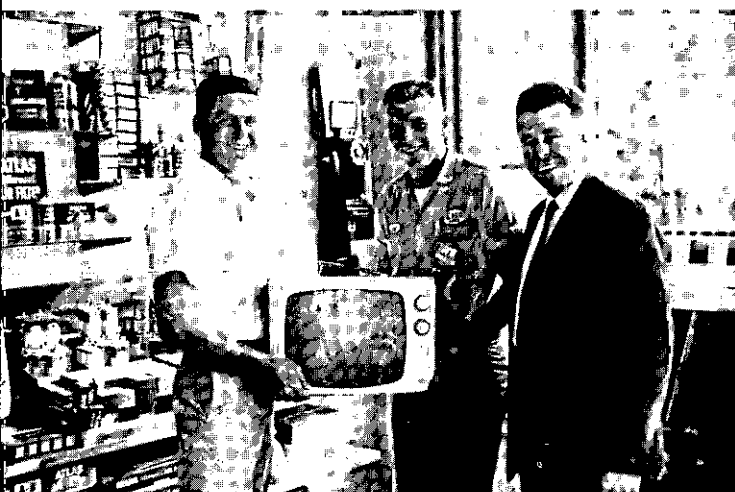

BARBARA HOWE WRITES OF HER EXPERIENCES IN CHILE

Our Community Ambassador to Chile, Barbara Howe, left Bethlehem on June 25. She is now settled with her family for her "winter's" stay. She writes:

La Sarena, Chile
July 7, 1965

Dear Friends,

After several days at a country inn outside Santiago, where we had our first informal meetings, our first Chilean food, our first walk thru the lovely countryside, we came here to Serena. The trip by bus was thru rugged country with winding roads, small farms where the work is done by hand without modern equipment and large stretches of barren land with occasional flocks of sheep herded by men on horses. On one side, we could see the Pacific, on the other, snow capped Andes. It was really lovely.

Here at Serena, a town of about 40,000, the weather is like fall

or spring, but quite cold at night, especially since the homes have no central heating. One sees many horse-drawn carts on the streets. There are many small shops, a large open air market twice a week, and we go shopping every few days for food.

The father in my family is an English teacher in a technical school here, and is teaching me Spanish. His wife stays home to take care of the boys, ages 5 and 3, and help the maid (which is not a luxury here).

We have been to the beach, which is beautiful, out to the small farms the grandfather owns, on a big family picnic in the country, and often we either go out for tea or have guests here for tea, which is served around five to carry us over until dinner at nine.

The outstanding thing is the warmth and friendliness of the people. They have been so anxious to give parties for us, to show us how they live, and talk with us about life in the States as well as Chile. I am anxious to share my experiences with you next fall.

Special Voter Enrollment

Edward Rook, who is engaged in a primary battle for the GOP Assembly nomination, today explained aspects of the Election Law which permit voters to specially enroll in the party of their choice.

He also stated that an enrolled Republican or Democrat who has changed his residence within the county can transfer his enrollment to his new district.

Mr. Rook, who is a lawyer, said that the election law provides that people who will be eligible to vote in New York for the first time in November can now enroll in their parties so that they may vote in

the primary.

Those eligible for special enrollment include persons who will turn 21 by election day; people who were unable to vote at the last election because they lacked residential qualifications, and some people who were incapacitated at the last opportunity to enroll.

Mr. Rook emphasized that this special enrollment must be done before August 15 in order to vote in the September 14 primary. He said that the voter desiring to enroll should call at the County Board of Elections at the County Court House - Lodge Street entrance. "The form is very simple to file and should take only a

minute of the voter's time," Mr. Rook said.

Mr. Rook pointed out that because only party members vote in a primary, the impact of one vote is tremendously increased and the voter has a much greater oppor-

tunity to influence his party and his government. "Primaries really put the controls in the hands of the people and no party member should forego this right and privilege," he said.

Mr. Rook especially urged voters who will be 21 for the November election to "jump in with both feet" and help make politics work for their State and the people in it. "The best way to do this is to specially enroll and pick the people who are going to run in November."

Mr. Rook is seeking to capture the GOP Assembly nomination for the 112th District which includes the Towns of Bethlehem and Guilderland and substantial parts of the City of Albany. Thomas E. Mulligan and Robert H. Rice are also running in the primary in which Mr. Rook is engaged.

Precautions for Hurricanes

The New York State Civil Defense Commission today issued a list of precautionary measures to be taken during the hurricane season months of July, August, September and October.

The Commission outlined recommended measures for vacationists, small craft owners and the average householder to prepare against the perils of storms, torrential rains and floods that normally develop during these months.

"Public awareness of the dangers to be expected is the greatest safeguard against natural disasters," the Commission announced today. "Individuals who take precautionary measures in time can substantially reduce the toll of life and property from hurricanes and floods."

The 79 local Civil Defense Directors in the State of New York will be prepared to have their forces perform emergency duties, should a natural disaster strike. When storm warnings go up Civil Defense workers stand ready to work with the Red Cross and State and local agencies. In recent years, Civil Defense has aided in a wide variety of natural disasters, ranging from snow storms to floods, and was designated by Governor Rockefeller as coordi-

Special Warnings for Vacationists

Because the four hurricane months are also popular vacation months, the following safety measures apply particularly to vacationists and boat owners:

Follow storm warnings carefully.

Tune in frequently on radio or TV before starting on a fishing trip or cruise.

Secure pleasure craft when official storm warnings are issued by the Weather Bureau.

Haul boats to safe locations upon receiving storm notices.

Give vessels at anchor plenty of slack in moorings to avoid swamping.

Add an extra anchor to secure boats.

Secure loose gear.

Leave beaches or other spots which may be threatened by high tides.

Keep a sharp eye out for high water in places where streams may flood from heavy rains.

General Precautions for the Householder

Make sure that portable battery radios are in good working order.

Stay tuned to radio and TV stations for storm warnings.

Use battery radio set or car radio in event of power failure.

Keep your car in top condition with battery, lights, etc., in good working order and with the gas tank at least three-quarters full.

As a safeguard against damage from flooded cellars, check cellar windows and move valuable material to a safe place.

Store canned goods, drinking water, canned heat, can openers, and paper dishes in a safe place.

Check gutters to be sure they are not clogged.

Move furniture and other movable objects on porches and lawns to safe spots.

given, these precautions must be taken at once:

- Board up windows or leave storm shutters in place.
- Use strong lumber for all bracing.
- Sterilize the bath tub, jugs, bottles, etc., and fill with drinking water.
- Put car in garage or park away from trees and poles.
- Close house and garage windows and doors.
- At the first warnings of danger, turn freezer setting up so that, if power fails, food may stay frozen for a longer period.
- Stay away from windows during the storm.
- If out-of-doors, take refuge in a ditch or ravine.
- Avoid all loose wires — they may be live.
- If the center, or "eye" of the storm passes over your area, there will be a temporary lull, lasting from a few minutes to a half-hour or more. Then the wind will resume with comparable violence from the opposite direction. You should not, therefore, leave your protected area until you hear an official announcement on radio or TV that the storm is over.

A Delmar family just returned this month from a year's stay in India, bringing back many happy memories and momentos of their travels and experiences.

Mr. and Mrs. Harold R. Howes and their four children, Betsy, 10, Tom, 8, Margaret, 5, and Sarah, 4, spent most of the year in Allahabad, in the northern part of India. Mr. Howes, who is a professor in the Education Department of the State University of New York in Albany, had a Fulbright grant and spent much of his time there helping establish a student counseling center at Allahabad University.

Allahabad is located at the junction of the Ganges and Jumna Rivers, and is one of the Hindu holy places. Mrs. Howes told me that at certain times of the year large groups of pilgrims came to Allahabad to bathe in the rivers, a holy ceremony.

The Howes' lived in "a lovely brick house" near the university campus, and Mrs. Howes greatly enjoyed having the services of a cook and a "sweeper" — a man who came in daily to clean the premises. The three older Howes children attended Girls High School in Allahabad, where they were the only foreigners except for two others.

"It was a little difficult for the children because they were stared at and made aware of their differentness," Mrs. Howes said, "but I'm proud of them because they made many friends, and I think they really contributed to an understanding of our way of life."

The climate in Allahabad was hot and humid through September, but was "simply beautiful" in October and November, according to Mrs. Howes. In mid-March — after the weather had turned quite cold — the Howes family moved to south India, to Kodai Kanal, where they stayed

with all the Fulbright families then in the country, a total of 108 Americans.

They had the opportunity to travel throughout most of India, to Madras and Madurai in the southern part, and to Delhi and Musoorie farther north. In most sections of India, Mrs. Howes said, you find all levels of living conditions, from almost unbelievable squalor to modern neighborhoods similar to our suburbs.

The population of India is increasing at the rate of 12,000,000 per year, and the expanding economy is just about able to keep

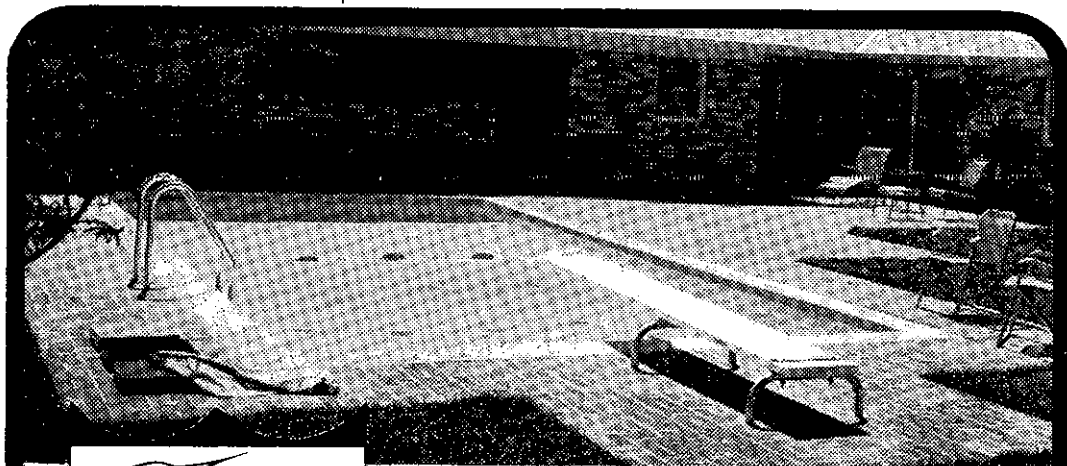

Shopping opportunities in India are "out of this world," raved Mrs. Howes. The government has organized work centers in the larger cities and encourages a high standard of workmanship on all handcraft products, which make good use of native talents. The prices are very fair, too.

Now adorning the Howes' Van Dyke Road home are two cashmere rugs, a brass coffee table, beautiful carved wood decorations, and some Indian dolls.

Mrs. Howes also brought back a number of beautiful saris.

After leaving India, the Howes family spent five weeks traveling throughout Europe. They made both trips across the ocean by boat.

The year away from home was "a wonderful experience" for the whole family, said Mrs. Howes, but they are all delighted to be back in Delmar. The children can't wait, she said, to go back to their classes at the Slingerlands Grade School. And they can tell all their friends what it was like to sit on their front porch and watch the camels go by.

Mrs. Ball is a graduate of Russell Sage and the Albany Medical College Division of Physical Therapy, and has done work in physical therapy and also taught physical education.

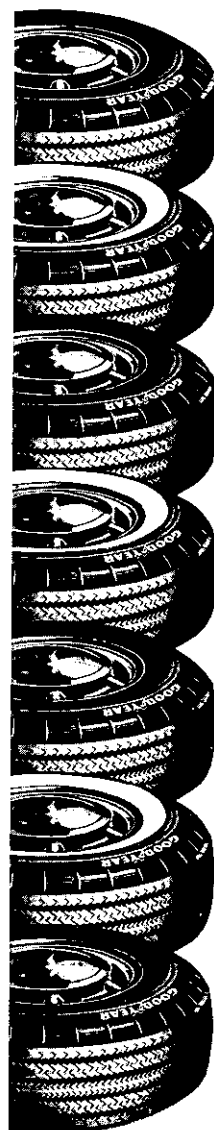
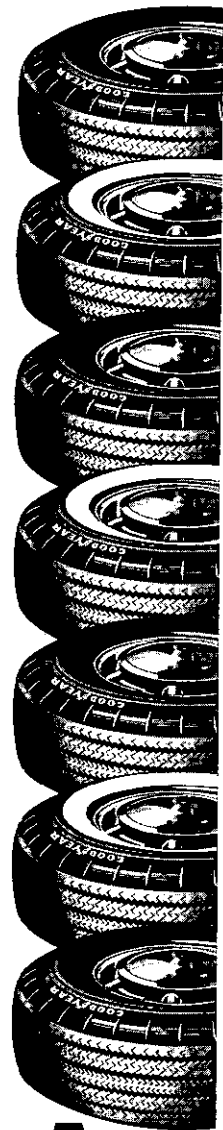
