Ambassador Letter from Japan

This is the second letter from Bethlehem's Community Ambassador in Japan.

Takaoka City
Toyama, Japan
July 21, 1965

Dear Folks:

I have been in Japan for two weeks now and I have been enjoying every moment of my stay.

We arrived in Tokyo on the afternoon of July 4th and stayed until July 7th at a Japanese Inn for orientation. The eight members of my group traveled on a beautiful and fast train to Takaoka where we have been staying. Takaoka is a city about the size of Albany. It is located in Toyama Prefecture in Western Japan, very close to the Japan Sea. Fushiki Harbor where ships of all nations are docked is only three miles away.

I am staying with the Noto family who are extremely warm-hearted people. My Mother is very kind and gentle. My Father has his own metal business. My elder brother, Shoji is in business

with his father. Shoji is married and has a baby, Tatuaki who is a year old and just adorable. Following the trend in Japan, Shoji and his wife, Harumi have a home of their own, but following Japanese tradition, they are almost always with our family. My other brother, Masaki is 22 and a student at Meiji Yakuin Graduate School in Tokyo, where like a great many Japanese young men, he is majoring in economics. My sister, Michiko is 17 and a student at the Takaoka Senior High School. She studies very much, even though she is on vacation because next fall she must pass an entrance examination for a University. Acceptance at any college in Japan is difficult because of the population pressure.

Our house is right in the city of Takaoka and like most of the homes in the Takaoka area, our home is traditional. In the center is our garden in which there are rocks, statues and stone lanterns. The walls of our rooms are paper and I have my own room where I sleep on the floor under a mo-

squito net with red tassels. There are no chairs except in a small dining room and a western sitting room on the second floor in which there is a buddha and a stereo.

My family is Buddhist and in the living room there is an elaborate solid gold altar. This takes up the entire wall space and is usually concealed by purple silk curtains. The 15th of July was Bonn festival during which the spirits of the dead re-visited their homes. A buddhist priestess came to our altar to pray for the family ancestors. Later we went to the grave of a dead brother and left incense, flowers, and fruit for his returning spirit.

Next week, my sister, Michiko and I will be traveling with the other Experimenters and some one from each of their families to Kyoto, Nara, and Osaka. When we return, it will be time for the Star Festival which is Takaoka's big festival in commemoration of the meeting of two stars who had been lovers on earth. It will be a gay time.

There is much more that I should tell you about my experiences in this wonderful country but I must wait until my return to the United States. Until then,

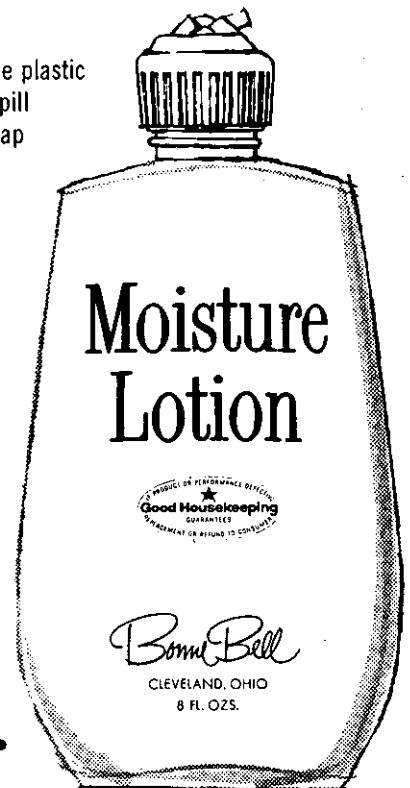

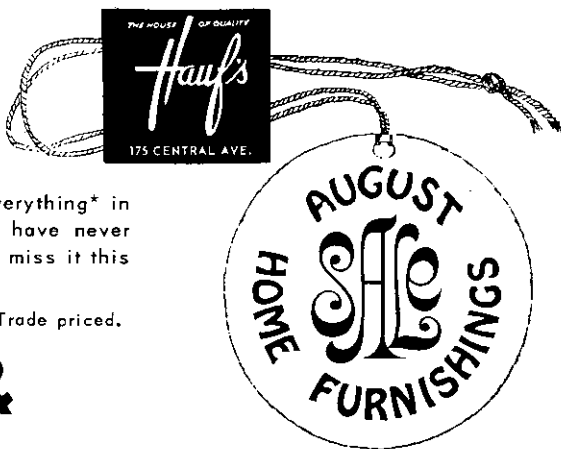

Fastest Truck on Display

Drag racing fans have a new favorite, and it's not a car, but the world's fastest truck! Latest conversion stimulator in dragdom is "The Little Red Wagon," a 90-inch wheelbase Dodge compact pick-up truck, that charges the quarter mile in slightly more than 10 seconds at speeds exceeding 128 MPH.

A 425-horsepower hemi-charger engine moves the mighty little pick-up out of the hole, and a parachute brings it to a stop. Acceleration which causes the "wagon" to stand on it's tailgate thrills the racing fans more than record runs as was demonstrated January 16 at the Lion's Drag Strip, Long Beach, California. Bill "Maverick" Golden stood the "Little Red Wagon" on its tailgate seven consecutive times in a three-minute performance, and the 1,000 spectators went wild.

The unique little vehicle was first introduced to the drag nation September 19, 1965, at Cicil County, Md. dragway by NHRA summer national champions Dick Branstner and Roger Lindamood, of Detroit. It turned 11.20 at 119 MPH in it's debut. The "Little Red Wagon" will be on display at Albany Dodge, 949 Central Avenue, Albany . . . for one day only, Friday, August 6.

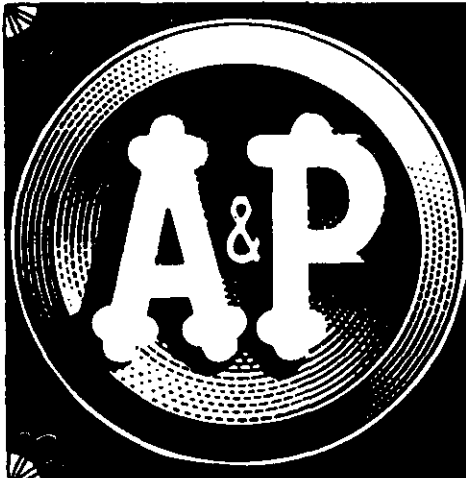

Renovations and Innovations

At Saratoga Racetrack

Saratoga, "The Capital of Thoroughbred Racing," plays host to the best Thoroughbreds in the country for a period of 24 racing days this month. Having celebrated the Centennial of racing at the Spa in 1963, The New York Racing Association has reiterated its confidence in and support of the sport at Saratoga by completing a \$3,500,000 building program since the 1964 meeting closed last August.

A 500-foot addition to the grandstand will bring the seating capacity of the track — seats under cover facing the track — to just under 10,000 or just a shade under one-half the seating at Aqueduct.

The new construction has been limited to the grandstand section. John W. Galbreath, chairman of the NYRA building committee, has said that, "the response will dictate any future plans, but we intend to keep Saratoga, the Capital of Thoroughbred Racing."

With the added grandstand, the plant will be able to comfortably accommodate crowds of from 30,000 to 35,000. To make room for the new grandstand addition the old field stands and the bleacher seats near the head of the stretch have been eliminated.

The outside of the addition to the stands blends in perfectly with the old section in design and tone. However, inside the stand all is modern for greater comfort and accessibility for the fans.

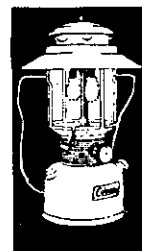
The extension brings to 1,300 feet the length of the entire stand. Stadium type seats have been installed in the new area and with the additional space the mutual window capacity has been increased by 42 percent. The depth of the new area will allow for easy circulation.

The old club house dining areas remain as before, but the grandstand patrons will have a dining area in the new section which can seat 450. Two new sets of escalators have also been installed in the grandstand area, supplementing the one which has been in operation.

Despite the influx of construc-

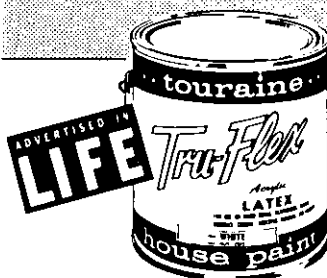

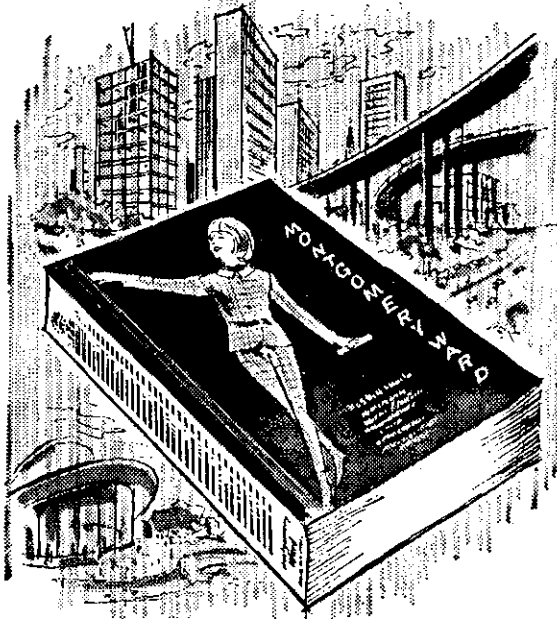

tion men, the trees in the paddock area have not been disturbed and patrons will still be able to see the horses saddled in the atmosphere which means Saratoga.

Meanwhile, the high caliber of the racing at Saratoga will be maintained. The NYRA is offering 19 stakes races in the 24-day period with total added money of \$597,00.


As is usual at Saratoga, the two-year-olds receive prominent display. Seven of the stakes races are for juveniles, climaxed by the 61st running of the \$75,000 Hopeful Stakes on the closing day of the meeting, August 28.

The big race for three-year olds at Saratoga is the \$75,000 added Travers on August 21. To be run for the 96th time this year, the mile and a quarter Travers is the oldest stakes race in the country. It was first run in 1864, the


first year of racing on the present location. Thoroughbred racing had come to Saratoga the year before - 1863 - across the street from the present track at the training site now called Horse Haven.

Older horses have their "big" race on the first Saturday of the meeting in the \$50,000 added Whitney. In this race it is expected that Bohemia Stable's Kelso, Horse of The Year the past five years, will try again to win the mile and a furlong event. He won it in 1961 and in 1963. Last year's Travers winner, Rokeby Stable's Quadrangle, also is expected in the Whitney.

The second Saturday of the meeting, August 14, will see the 85th running of the \$50,000 added Alabama, a mile and a quarter for three-year-old fillies. And, two-year-old fillies have their "Hopeful" in the 74th Spinaway,

berg Ring, the famous, picturesque car racing site.

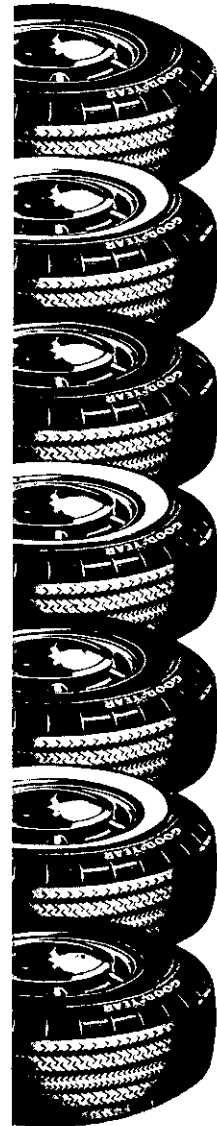
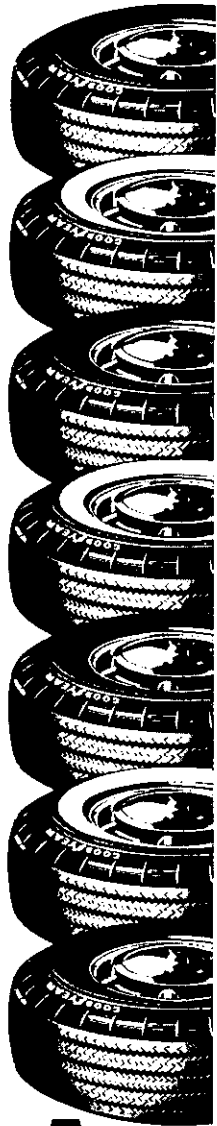
