## 5 Homes in Open House Tour

On Saturday, October 16th, from 1 to 5 P. M., the Town of Bethlehem Historian Association is sponsoring an event of widespread interest in our area, an Open House Tour of five homes in the Hudson River area of the town which have never before been open to the public. The houses to be open are the "Dutch cottage" of Mrs. Chauncey D. Hakes at Van Wie's Point, which is located on the river's edge, for when the house was built this was the main artery of traffic. The kitchen wing is the oldest part of the house and was an original Van Wie property. The area around the Point takes its name from this old Dutch family, who were among the first settlers of our area.

The yellow painted brick farm-estate home of Mrs. Abraham Clapper and her daughter, Miss Meredith Clapper, at Cedar Hill was built in 1840 by Miss Clapper's great grandfather Abraham Westervelt, who was a descendant of early Dutch settlers. The house holds many antiques and cherished family mementos and the large barn across the road from the house testifies to the fertility of the surrounding fields.

The farm-estate of Mrs. Mabel Baker Thorne, also at Cedar Hill, is another home which bases its beauty and prosperity on the good soil of our Hudson Valley. It was built in 1791 by Joab Baker, great grandfather of the present owner. This farm was known far and wide in the early 1900's for "Baker melons" which were served on the tables of the finest New York hotels, and Baker apples took prizes from Albany to St. Louis. The home is filled with cherished antiques handed down through generations of the family and a portion of the dining room

furniture was made by the famed cabinetmaker, Hepplewhite.

The early doctor's residence, now the home of Mrs. John Babcock, at Becker's Corners, Selkirk, was built in 1840 by Dr. John Babcock, pioneer horse and buggy doctor of the Bethlehem area, who served in the Civil War. It is a charming, red brick home filled with interesting and valuable old furnishings and has never been out of the possession of the Babcock family.

The red-painted Victorian home of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Essex of Route 32, Glenmont, is a true "period piece" of the 1850's with plenty of gingerbread architecture. The wood for this house was cut and seasoned on the property and it was built for the daughter of the gentleman who lived on the adjoining farm.

Tickets for the tour are \$2.00 per person and may be purchased at the headquarters of the Historical Association, the Cedar Hill school building, on the day of the tour, or from any member of the Association. Tickets are also available at the Thistle Shop in Delmar, Grover's Stationery Store at the Delaware Plaza, Darbecker's Store and Van Allen Farm Store in Glenmont and Mari-Anne's Soda Shoppe in Selkirk. Proceeds from the tour will be used to further the museum project of the historical association. There will also be a "Country Shop" selling antiques, next to new articles, baked goods, fruits and vegetables, to be open at the Cedar Hill school building on the day of the Tour. Refreshments will also be served at the school.

The "Country Shop" committee chairmen and their assistants are: Antiques — Mrs. John McGinley and Mr. Douglas Mac-

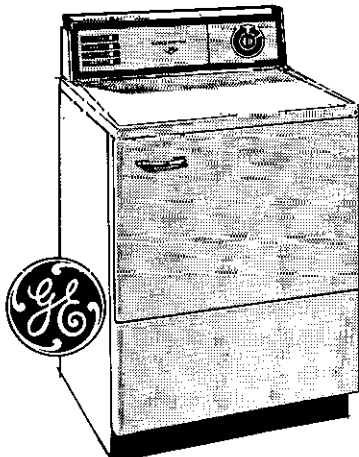

### New Plaza

The Grand Union Company recently announced that a lease for construction of a 12,000 square foot supermarket in the Glenmont Plaza Shopping Center has been signed.

Located at the intersection of Routes 9W and 32, on the Northeast Corner in Glenmont, in the Town of Bethlehem, the Grand Union will be one of 12 proposed stores in the new shopping center. The building will be of modern design and is being constructed to allow for a 6,000

square foot expansion in the future.

The area of the Plaza comprises 6 1/2 acres of land. Parking will be provided for 400 cars in a paved and lighted area.

The Wiggand Construction Company is owner and developer of the land. The Wiggand family are life-long residents of the community.

In addition to Grand Union, planned stores for the plaza will consist of Rheingold's Pharmacy of Albany, a department store, a hardware store, barber shop and other related merchants. Negotiations are under-way at the present time to establish a banking center at the plaza.

The site of the new shopping center has been chosen in conjunction with the intense economic development in the area. It will help satisfy the growing merchandise needs of the modern consumer with its many and varied places of business.

The new Glenmont Plaza Grand Union will be serviced by the Waterford, New York, Distribution Center. This is the company's largest single operating unit. Its 122 stores stretch from the Canadian border on the north down through the north country into Vermont and through the Hudson Valley to Poughkeepsie in the South to Cobleskill in the

West and Greenfield in the East. Each store is unique and like the new Glenmont Grand Union, serves a particular community. Nationally, at the present time, Grand Union is operating 521 Supermarkets and Grand-Way Department Stores.

Ground will be broken in April of 1966 and complete occupancy of the 35,000 square foot Glenmont Plaza is expected to be completed by November 1966.

**Bulb Sale**

The Bethlehem Lions Club is now conducting its annual drive for funds through the sale of light bulbs to the community's residents. Beginning last Saturday, the drive will be continued through the next two Saturdays, October 9 and 16. 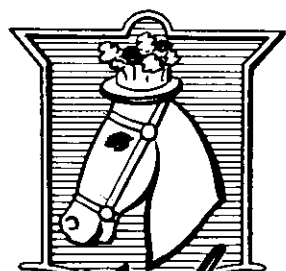

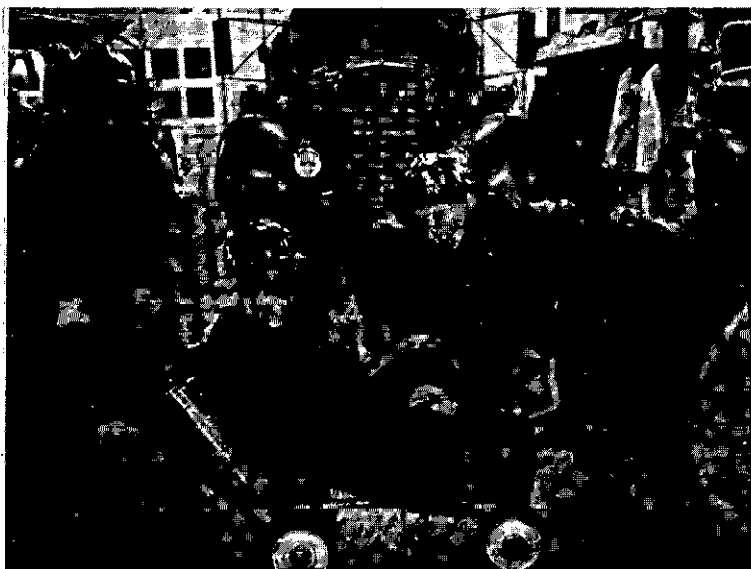

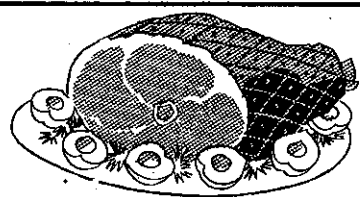

## SS Benefits

About 3,000 Albany County students who receive social security benefits as the children of retired, disabled, or deceased workers can continue to get the payments after age 18 if they are attending school full-time, William P. Gleason, social security district manager in Albany, announced this week.

Under this new provision, contained in the 1965 amendments to the social security law, students can continue to receive monthly benefits until they reach 22 or complete their education, whichever is earlier, Mr. Gleason continued.

Students whose benefits were stopped when they reached 18 and who are continuing their education as full-time students will have to file a new application in order to have their payments started again. Benefit payments can be made retroactive to January 1965.

Young adults who take a full-time vocational course, as well as those going to high school or college full-time, are covered by this provision, Mr. Gleason stated.

In addition to benefits during the school year, payment can continue during a vacation period of up to 4 continuous months if the student will be returning to school afterwards.

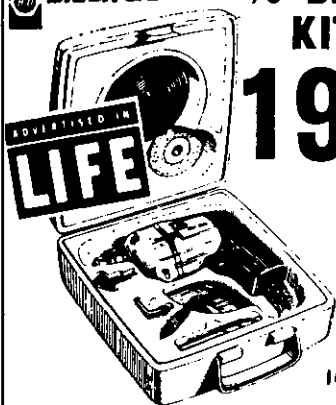

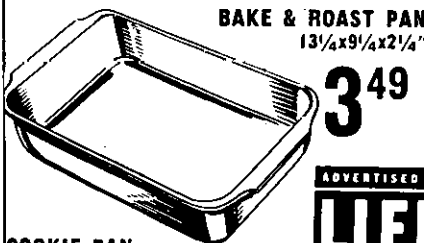

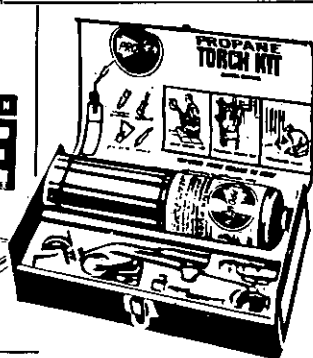

The directors determine the conservation program they want to carry out after studying the natural resource problems and the needs of the people. Employees of the SCS may soils, assist land owners in preparing conservation plans, survey and design conservation practices and help land-owners to apply their conservation plans on the land.

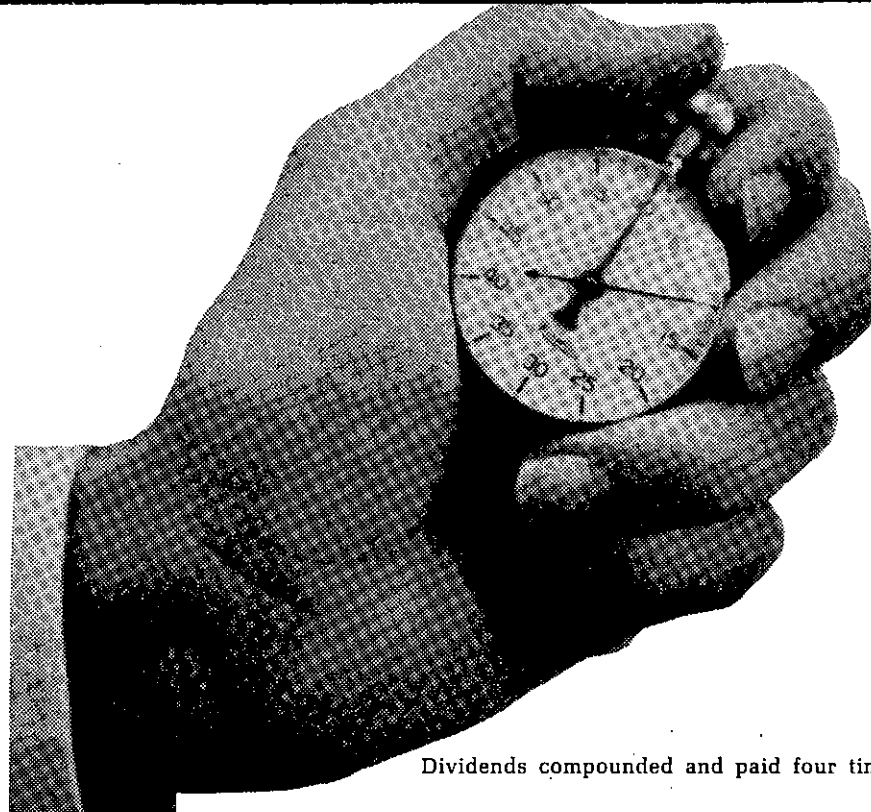

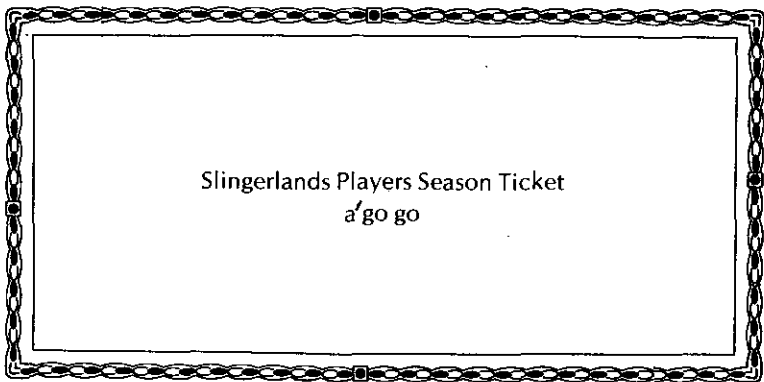

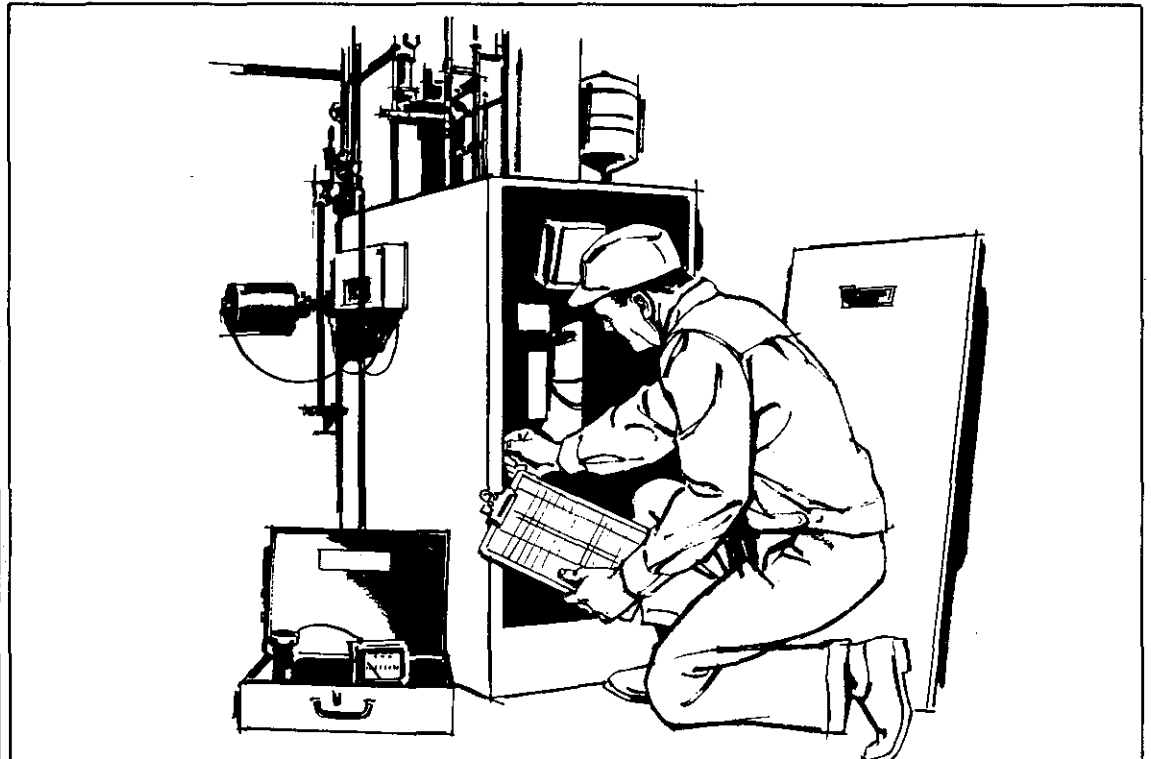

**Human Rights**

The HUMAN RIGHTS PROGRAM SERIES session of October 11, will feature Philip Singer, Ph.D., a Cultural Anthropologist and Assistant Professor in the Behavioral Sciences of the Department of Psychiatry, Albany Medical College, in a discussion of "Prejudice - Libel Without Logic." After Dr. Singer's Presentation at 8:00 P. M., in the auditorium of the Bethlehem Junior High School, there will be a brief question period, moderated by Commissioner J. Edward Conway of the New York State Commission for Human Rights. Then, participants in the series will break up into dialogue groups for discussion and exploration of the myths of racism, the psychology of prejudice and the fallacy of thinking in stereotypes and caricatures.

Dr. Singer taught in the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs of Syracuse University before coming to Albany, in 1961. He has done anthropological field work in India and British Guiana. In India, this work was concerned with problems of religion and leadership; in British Guiana, his area of

concern, was religion, mental illness and indigenous healing practices.

At the Albany Medical Center, Dr. Singer teaches first-and second-year medical students and phychiatric residents. He is the Research-Liaison Officer for the Cross-Cultural-Clerkship held for senior medical students in British Guiana, during the summer.

Dr. Singer is presently Executive Secretary of the Cooperating Committee for Guyanese Development, sponsored by the Albany Medical College. During the summer of 1965, he conducted research into the attitudes and conditions of the poor, in the City of Albany. Articles written by Dr. Singer have appeared in the professional journals and in the New Republic and Reporter magazines; he is an editorial

consultant for the Albany Mirror-The Voice of Poverty.

The HUMAN RIGHTS PROGRAM SERIES, viewed as "an adventure in understanding" consists of six separate programs on the subject of Human Rights, prejudice and racial tension. These programs take the place on successive Monday evenings during October and early November. # Food SECRETS

Whew, I've got a secret — and before I start rushing off to the football game, I have to tell you about it. I know you've tried to feed a crowd after you have come from a game (when everyone is famished as soon as they walk in the door). My secret is a make-ahead, buffet-type dinner.

Yesterday I oven-barbecued a 5-pound brisket of beef. It's easy, just place it in a pan, pour 1 bottle (1 lb. 2 oz.) barbecue sauce with hickory smoke flavor over top, cover and bake at 325 degrees for about 4 hours, or until tender. Then remove cover and bake 1/2 hour longer, basting occasionally to glaze. Today I'll serve it sliced and heated in the drippings from the pan. This will serve 8 to 10.

After the meat was done, I baked the cake. This is a nifty one! Combine 1 package apple spice cake mix with 1 package coconut cream instant pudding,

1 cup water, and 4 eggs. Blend to moisten; then beat 8 minutes at medium speed. Pour into 13 x 9-inch pan lined on bottom with brown paper, bake at 350 degrees for 45 to 50 minutes. This morning I prepared a package of whipped topping mix as directed, adding 2 tablespoons EACH sugar and orange juice before whipping; then blended in 1 teaspoon grated orange rind. I'll serve this spooned over squares of cake.

For the salad I made my favorite molded shredded cabbage and carrot salad — but this time I used the new celery flavored gelatine for extra zip. When it comes to vegetables, I said to myself, "Betsey, you really should serve 2" ( but I knew I wouldn't have time to prepare both). Then I remembered the new frozen vegetable combinations. I brought 3 packages of frozen green peas and pearl
