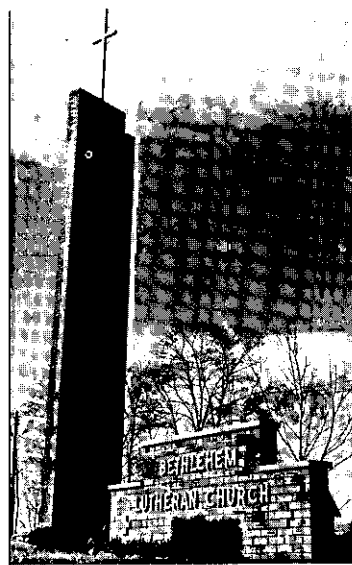
Table Talk

Mrs. Eleanor Wages, assistant home demonstration agent in Albany County, will demonstrate the preparation of holiday yeast breads on **TABLE TALK** on Wednesday, December 15 on Channel 13 at 7:30 A. M.

Many homemakers consider bread baking an art — something only grandmother could do — and consequently have never attempted to bake a loaf of bread. Only few simple techniques in mixing and kneading are

required to achieve a good loaf of bread, and Mrs. Wages plans to demonstrate these techniques. Emphasis will also be placed on the proper temperature required for optimum yeast growth.

Another community called Bethlehem is contributing in a unique way to our own Town of Bethlehem Christmas Festival.

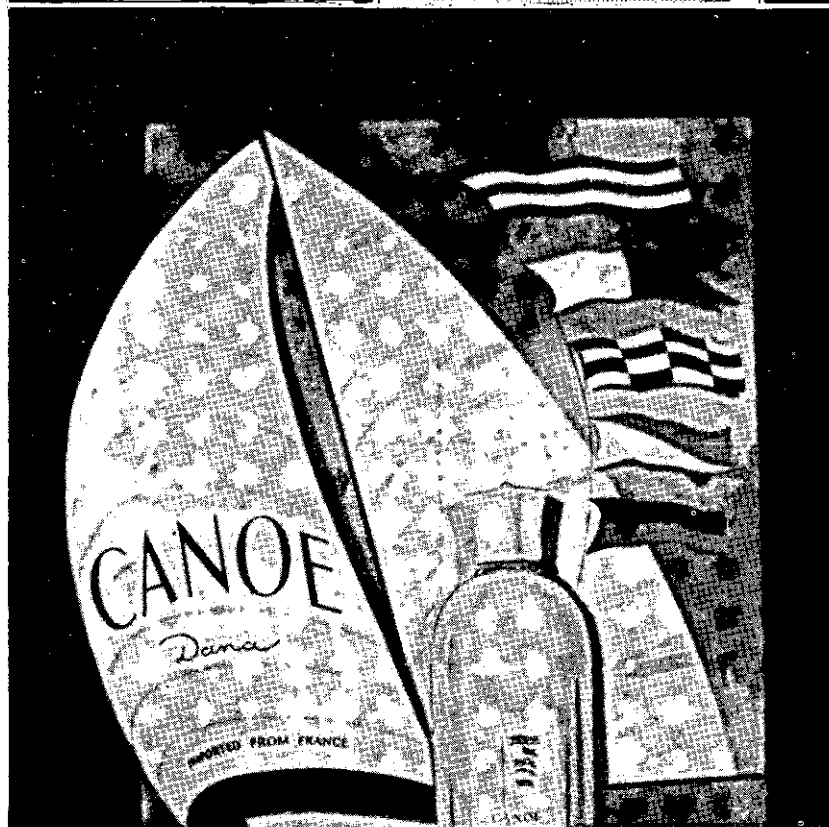
Mr. W. T. Miller of Bethlehem, Pa., has lent the festival decorating committee one of his hand-made Advent stars, to be placed in the foyer of the high school as illustration of the festival theme: "Star Over Bethlehem."

Mr. Miller, who is 81 years old and a former employee of the Bethlehem Steel Company, is the father of Mrs. Frank W. Sterrett of 7 Burtonwood Place in Delmar.

A man of considerable artistic ability, Mr. Miller's main hobby since his retirement has been designing and constructing Advent stars. The stars are a Moravian custom, and even today if you drive through Bethlehem, Pa., a city of about 75,000 people, you will find Advent stars at this time of year decorating almost every private home.

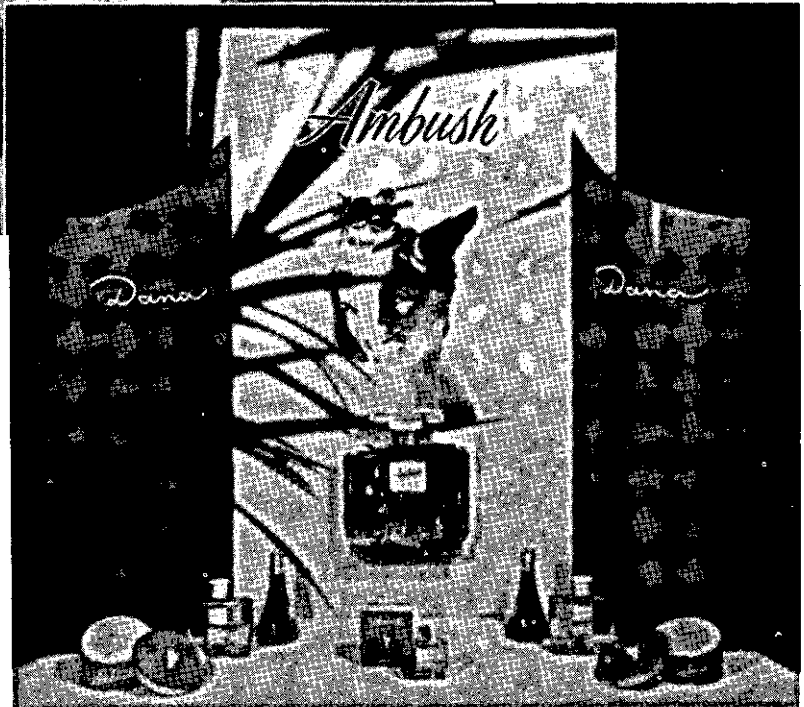
Mr. Miller has invented the forms for Advent stars, which are lighted from the inside in different colors and which come in various sizes. The one we have borrowed has yellow lights and measures four feet across.

Churches all over the county have requested and received Advent stars from Mr. Miller.
