Dedication of New Church

On Sunday, December 19, at 11:00 A. M. the congregation of the Clarksville Community Church (Reformed) will gather to dedicate their new church.

The Clarksville Community Church was formed in 1958 by a merger of the First Methodist Church and the Reformed Church in the village. Since that time a continued need has been shown for new and more modern facilities.

The Christian Education Building was completed in 1962. It is used by the more than 175 children attending Church School, all other activities of the church and many of the community.

In 1963, a seven-room brick ranch home was purchased on land adjoining the new Education Bullding for use as a parsonage. With the completion of the sanctuary, the third and final phase of the building program will be completed.

The new church designed to fit into the architecture of the village is a modified A-Frame, using brick and white clapboard.

The interior is of modern design with an open-decked roof and laminated arches; the furnishings are of red oak. It will seat 265 and has a full basement for other church activities. The architect was H. James Sidford, Jr. and the General Contractor William Heilmann and Son. The Roy, James A. Neevel has been pastor of the church since 1959.

On Sunday, January 16, at 3:30, a special community Vesper Service, reception and open house will be held at the new church.


Leonard Price, owner of the business, was born in Halfway, Michigan; educated in the schools of Bethlehem and Voorheesville; he entered the Navy in 1945.


This will be Lee Dougherty's







TRY THIS CHRISTMAS TURKEY TREAT



While roast turkey has become a holiday tradition, so has the problem of what to do with the leftovers. But here's a tasty suggestion from Austin Nichols home economists that yoùr family will be sure to "gobble up": the sandwich loaf, a perfect hot dish for those cold winter days when the family comes home hungry.

GOURMET SANDWICH LOAF

4 hardcooked eggs

1 cup finely chopped cooked turkey

1/4 cup chopped sweet pickles or pickle relish

1 can (10 to 12 oz.) cream of mushroom soup

Salt and pepper 12 slices bread

2 Tbsp. soft butter or margarine

¼ cup milk

Chop 2 of the eggs. Combine with turkey, pickles and half of the soup. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Trim crusts from bread and cut slices in half to make 24 pieces. Place 6 pieces of bread close together on baking sheet or heat-proof serving platter. Spread with turkey mixture. Top with layer of bread. Repeat until there are 3 layers of turkey and 4 layers of bread. Brush top with softened butter. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) until light-







STRAIGHT FACTS FOR TWISTED THINKERS

America is suffering from an epidemic of carping and whining about our foreign policy. "Do we belong in Viet Nam... do we have the right to interfere in South America?" But, I wonder why no one asks "Do the Red belong in Viet Nam... Do the Reds have any right to interfere in South America?"

Why do so many Americans placidly accept the Reds' interference in free world countries and yet question our right, or duty, to help those governments remain free?

The answer is simple. A large number of Americans have come to accept the Red myth that the Viet Nams, the Congos and the Santo Domingos were start-

ed by local people. Somehow, they've forgotten the basic fact that these wars were carefully planned and directed by Moscow. Peiping and Havana. When the United States goes into Viet Nam, for example, it's not to stop a rebellion by local people, but to stem the relentless tide of Communism that is wearing away the foundations of the free world. Communism is out to conquer the world; we are out to conquer no one, but merely to contain world Communism. If we were out for conquest, Korea, Japan, Italy and Germany wouldn't be free today. Nor would the Philippines and Cuba have had the chance for selfgovernment. Have the Reds ever



relinquished their hold on a satel-

Now, it's often heard that we should let the Viet Namese or Santo. Domingans "choose for themselves" between Communism and the West. But, this is in fact what we're doing. The United States is trying to keep these countries free so they can



choose for themselves. If we stay out, Mao Tse Tung, Castro or Brezhnev will decide the issue for them. And Communists don't allow any choice. For instance, it has been shown by Professor Scalapino, of Columbia University that Red Viet Nam was made Communist by less than five hundred determined terrorists controlled from Peiping. Systematically beheading the mayors of some 6000 villages, the agitators chopped their way to power. And this is how these Viet Namese villages "choose" Communism!

Certainly, the Berlin Wall is ample proof that the people of East Germany have not "chosen" Communism. The rush of refugees in Trieste, Mocao, Hong Kong and the Bermese jungle is all one way: toward freedom and the West.

But take a look at any nation on the globe and you'll find a virulent Communist organization. Every country is infested with a hard core of trained agitators gathering and cultivating a cell of malcontents. How do they do it? The Reds play to any cause that comes to hand. In Pakistan, it's religion; in Venezuela, the inequality of wealth; in the U.S. A., it's civil rights or ban-the-bomb. The Reds promise the people anything, and find a following because the people often have a legitimate gripe. Consequently, we are often put in the embarrassing position of supporting political leaders who are less than perfect. But, all this should not obscure the real danger. Each country that falls into Communist hands brings the Reds closer to their goal: a Communist world. And, a Communist world means world slavery. We may support an unidealistic leader here or there, but for us to withdraw our help

would support the Communists.

The important thing is that Communism is being forced on these countries from outside. For the last 20 years each outbreak of terrorism and war has been described as another example of "the people" trying to "choose" Communism or "agrarian reform." And, in each case, the truth was shown to be the opposite. The British spent ten

years putting down a guerilla operation in Malaysia, and were reviled during those ten years for not letting the Malaysians "choose" Communism. In the end it was found that a small hard core of terrorists from outside Malaysia had engineered the entire uprising.

Everybody was so shocked to learn that "Doctor" Castro was a Communist and not an 'agra-


Most of the families will receive food baskets containing all the ingredients for a fine Christ-





Some of the money collected at the three festival presentations goes into a continuing fund, to be drawn upon throughout the year when an underpriviledged child needs medical or dental care, or when one of these families needs something such as a basic piece of furniture.

The fund is being administered by Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Dill of 532 Wayne Place in Delmar, members of the White Christmas Committee for two years and co-chairmen since October. "A-



bout two days after we took over as chairmen," Mrs. Dill told me recently, "a school nurse called and said a child needed dental care costing about \$70. We paid it."
