Dedication of New Church

On Sunday, December 19, at 11:00 A. M. the congregation of the Clarksville Community Church (Reformed) will gather to dedicate their new church.

The Clarksville Community Church was formed in 1958 by a merger of the First Methodist Church and the Reformed Church in the village. Since that time a continued need has been shown for new and more modern facilities.

The Christian Education Building was completed in 1962. It is used by the more than 175 children attending Church School, all other activities of the church and many of the community.

In 1963, a seven-room brick ranch home was purchased on land adjoining the new Education Building for use as a parsonage. With the completion of the sanctuary, the third and final phase of the building program will be completed.

The new church designed to fit into the architecture of the village is a modified A-Frame, using brick and white clapboard.

The interior is of modern design with an open-decked roof and laminated arches; the furnishings are of red oak. It will seat 265 and has a full basement for other church activities. The architect was H. James Sidford, Jr. and the General Contractor William Heilmann and Son. The Rev. James A. Neevel has been pastor of the church since 1959.

On Sunday, January 16, at 3:30, a special community Vesper Service, reception and open house will be held at the new church.

America is suffering from an epidemic of carping and whining about our foreign policy. "Do we belong in Viet Nam . . . do we have the right to interfere in South America?" But, I wonder why no one asks "Do the Red belong in Viet Nam . . . Do the Reds have any right to interfere in South America?"

relinquished their hold on a satellite?

Now, it's often heard that we should let the Viet Nameese or Santo Domingans "choose for themselves" between Communism and the West. But, this is in fact what we're doing. The United States is trying to keep these countries free so they can



choose for themselves. If we stay out, Mao Tse Tung, Castro or Brezhnev will decide the issue for them. And Communists don't allow any choice. For instance, it has been shown by Professor Scalapino, of Columbia University that Red Viet Nam was made Communist by less than five hundred determined terrorists controlled from Peiping. would support the Communists.

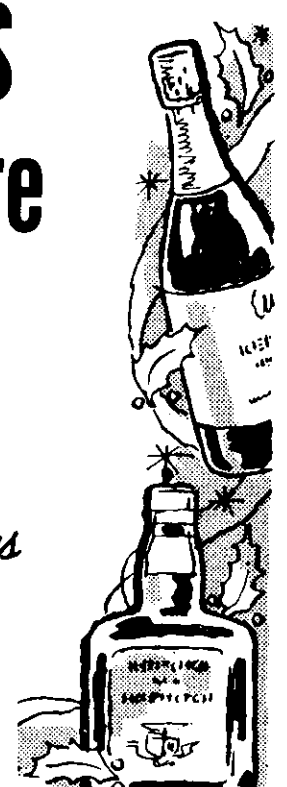

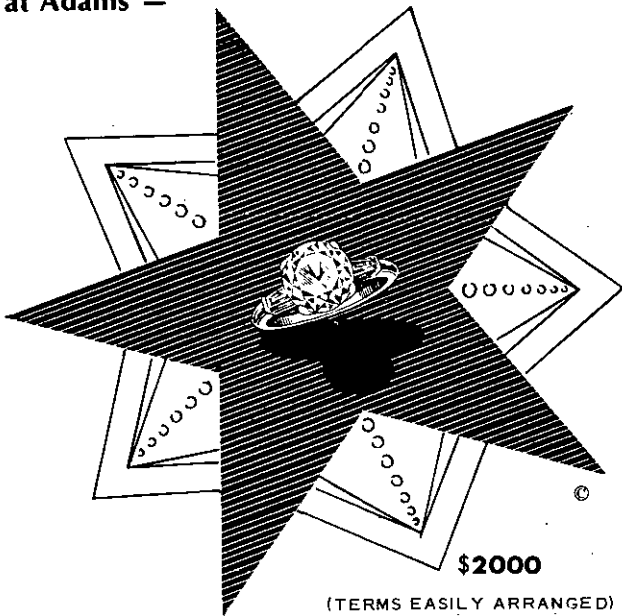

Now, why does one so seldom hear this common sense viewpoint? I think it's because the

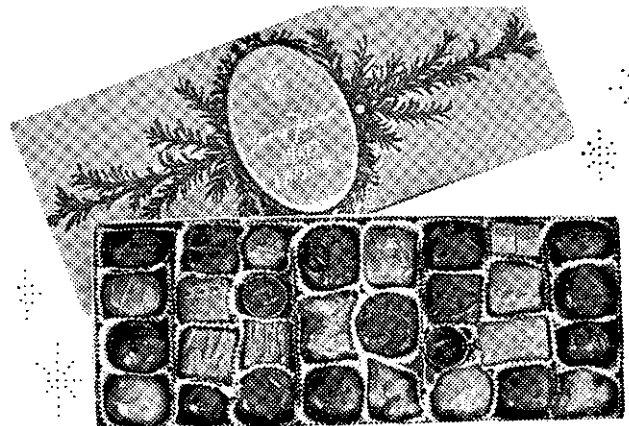

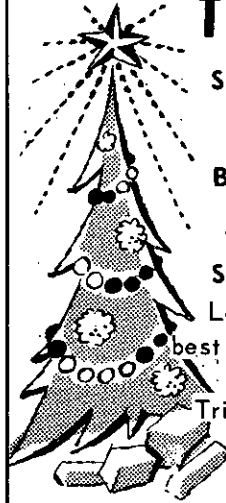
mas dinner. Where there are children - and many of the families have seven or eight little ones - Mother and Dad have been invited to come in to the Masonic Temple and choose a few of the toys that have been donated by persons in the community and made whole and shiny again by our Senior Citizens.

Coast Guard

The deadline for application from college seniors and graduate students for the U. S. Coast Guard Officer Candidate School, Yorktown, Virginia, is December 24, 1965. The class begins February 13, 1966.

Successful candidates will be commissioned as ensigns in the Coast Guard Reserve upon graduation. They will be required to complete three years on active duty.

To qualify, the men must be between 21 and 26 years of age with a bachelor's degree upon acceptance of the program.

The officer candidates will receive 17 weeks of intensive, highly specialized training in navigation, seamanship, gunnery, damage control, antisubmarine warfare and other service subjects. In addition, graduates

will be eligible for flight training.

The newly commissioned ensigns will join 3,000 Coast Guard Officers who serve worldwide in a variety of interesting duties. These include oceanography, search and rescue, law enforcement and merchant marine safety.

According to legend, when a lad claims his kiss under the mistletoe, he must remove a berry and give it to the grateful maiden. When the last berry is removed from the plant, the mistletoe loses its power and no more kisses may be bestowed beneath it. and gold of the magi, reached forth His tiny hands for the blossoms, and smiled as the shepherdess heaped them at His feet.

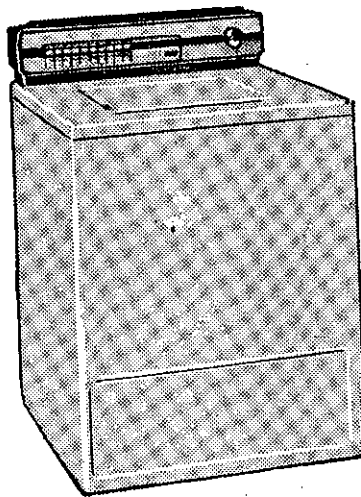
