


In addition to the new Shofar Award, The Ner Tamid and Aleph awards will be presented to those Boy Scouts who have completed an exacting course of religious study.

# **Scholarships**

Sister Catherine Roberta. C.S.J., director of admissions at The College of Saint Rose, has announced that applications are being accepted now through February 15 for five four-year, full-tuition scholarships established by the Most Rev. William A. Scully, Bishop of the Albany Roman Catholic Diocese.

Bishop Scully Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic achievement, financial need, and on the condition that recipients agree to teach for two consecutive years immediately after graduation from college in a parochial Catholic school in the Albany Diocese. Preference in awarding the scholarships will be given to students planning to teach on the elementary level.

Any Catholic girl, resident of the Albany Diocese, who meets the entrance requirements of the College, is in the upper fifth of her class, and/or has attained an average of 85%, is eligible.
