to those Boy Scouts who have completed an exacting course of religious study.

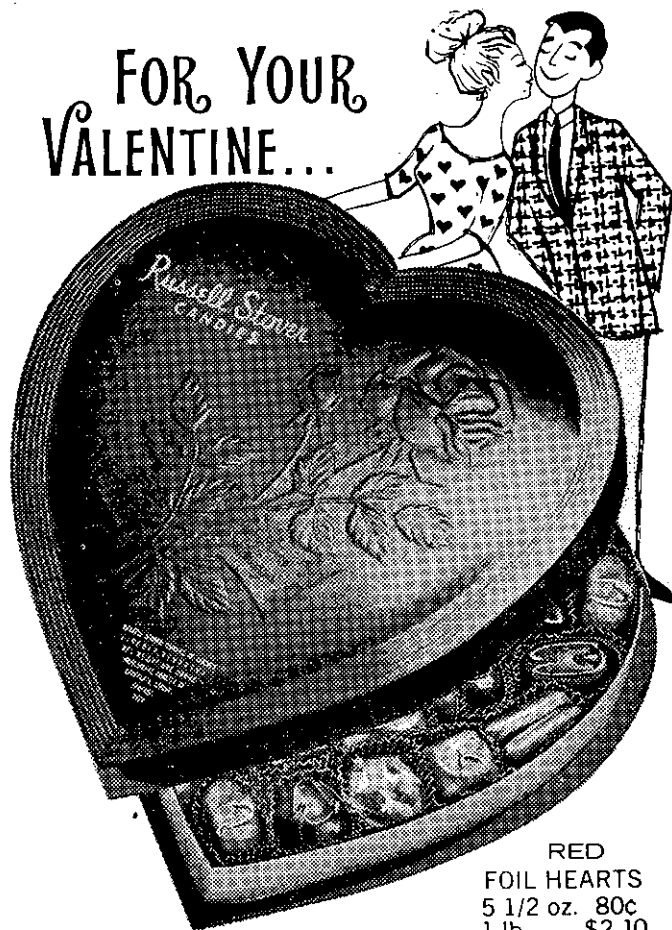
Rabbi Herman Kieval of Temple Israel will conduct the Friday night service with emphasis on Brotherhood and Scouting.

Troop #33, headed by Scoutmaster Howard Lasker, will

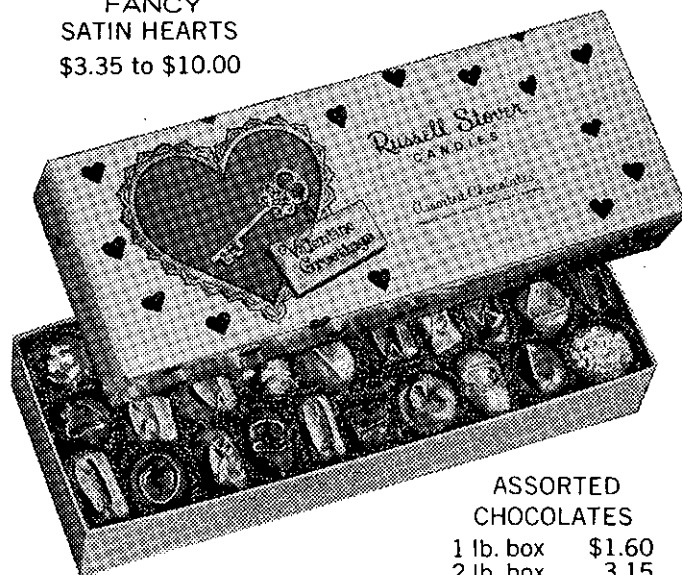

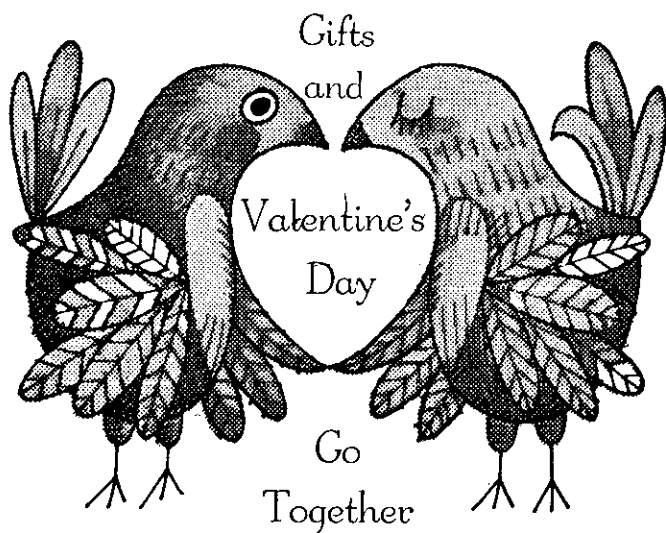

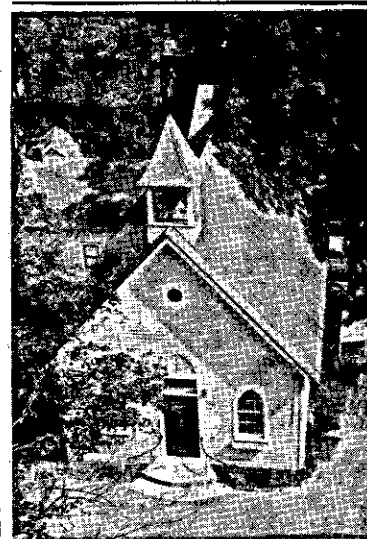


be sure, it is only a small bowl of paper narcissus but the exciting thing is - they look and smell like April. That suggests outdoor days are soon to come.

The government had been trying to prove the worthlessness of it over a number of years. The jury listened to nine months of testimony and deliberated 47 hours and fifty minutes in reaching their final verdict. In Memoriam
