Mrs. Alton G. Marshall, who lives with her husband and five children at 18 Baybury Road, Glenmont, (Colonial Acres) says it's a hectic life being married to a top state government official, but she wouldn't trade places with anyone.

Her husband was named executive secretary to Governor Rockefeller last October, and since then there's been little normal routine in the Marshall family.

"I keep a suitcase packed for him by the back door at all times," Mary Lee Marshall told me just last week. Mr. Marshall makes frequent quick trips to New York City and other parts of the state because of his constant close association with Governor Rockefeller.

The Marshalls have lived in the Albany area for 18 years, and prior to his present appointment Mr. Marshall was secretary of the Public Service Commission and then deputy director of the Division of the Budget.

Both Mary Lee and Al Marshall are natives of Michigan and they met while both were students at Hillsdale College in that state. Their oldest son, William Alton, 19, is now a sophomore at Hillsdale and belongs to Alpha Tau Omega, his father's fraternity.

Their other children are: Steve, 16, a sophomore at Bethlehem Central and member of the jayvee basketball squad; Bruce, 13, who attends school in Guilderland; Mary Ann, 12, a pupil at Bethlehem Central Junior High School; and John, 9, who attends Glenmont Elementary School.

Mary Lee said her husband is out-of-town on an average of three days each week, and very rarely arrives home from work before 10:30 or 11 P. M. "The children and I miss him, of course," she said, "but he's lots

of fun when he is around."

Mr. and Mrs. Marshall are active members of the Bethlehem Lutheran Church, and Al Marshall makes time each week to teach a Sunday School class there. She is a member of the Ladies Guild and the Altar Guild of the church.

Both are also enthusiastic athletes. Al usually is able to spend a couple of hours playing volleyball at the Glenmont School on Saturday afternoons, and they bowl on Sundays with a mixed league. ("I made the paper last week — high triple," Mary Lee admitted proudly.) They've done some roller skating from time to time, and Al enjoys shooting baskets with neighborhood boys when he can spare a few minutes from his work.

Comparing their life here with where they grew up in the mid-west, Mary Lee Marshall told me they think people in our community are "extremely friendly." She finds time to attend activities of the Legislative Women's Club and gets to some meetings of the local Kappa Kappa Gamma alumnae chapter and the Panhellenic Association.

"This is our home now," she said, "and we love it."

Proposed High School Addition

Residents of the Bethlehem Central School District will be asked next month to approve a bond issue referendum to finance an addition to the Bethlehem Central Senior High School. Cost of the proposed addition, which would increase the school's capacity to 2,000 pupils, is estimated at \$3,500,000.

Voting on the proposed addition will take place on March 22, from 7 A. M. until 9 P. M. at the Junior High School.

At these scheduled meetings, voters will have the opportunity to hear detailed information about the bond issue proposal:

March 3 — Open Meeting — Clarksville Elementary School.

March 7 — Open Meeting — Elsmere Elementary School.

March 10 — Glenmont PTA Meeting — Glenmont Elementary School.

March 14 — Open Meeting — Delmar Elementary School.

March 17 — Open Meeting — Hamagrael Elementary School.

March 21 — Open Meeting — Junior High School.

Representatives of the Board of Education, the Facilities Subcommittee of the Budget Advisory Committee and the School District staff will be present at all these meetings to present the facts and purpose of the plan for an addition to the Senior High School.

The building plan takes into account a resolution passed by the Board of Education last fall to reorganize school grade levels in the school district. If the building plan meets voter approval, the Senior High School would house pupils in grades 9 through 12, the Junior High School would accommodate pupils in grades 6 through 8, and the elementary

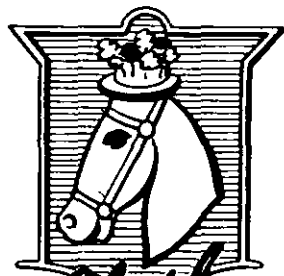

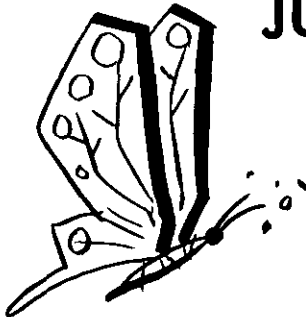
There will be a speaker from the State Education Department to discuss the standards and

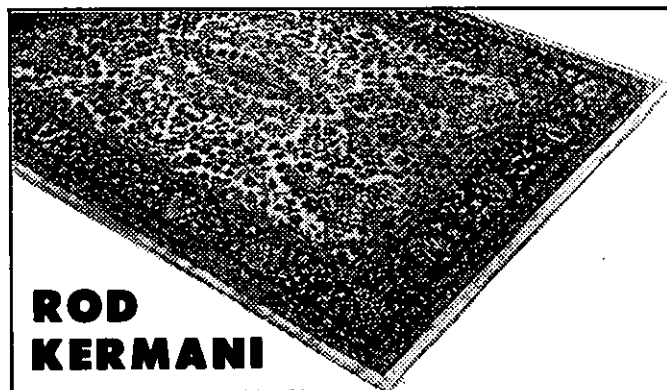
Boating Law

Pleasure boatman should ensure that their gasoline powered boats with inboard and inboard/outboard drives meet the new federal requirements on ventilation by June 1, 1966.

According to a new regulation, all motorboats except open boats are required to have at least two ventilative ducts fitted with cowls, or their equivalent, for the efficient removal of explosive gases from the bilges of every engine and fuel tank compartment. Outboards with a fuel tank compartment under the transom

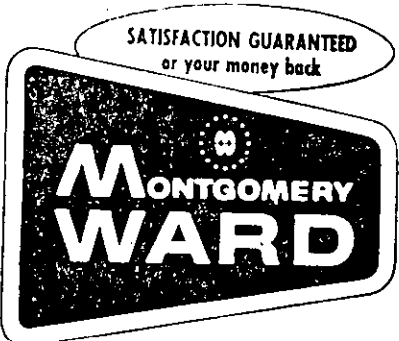

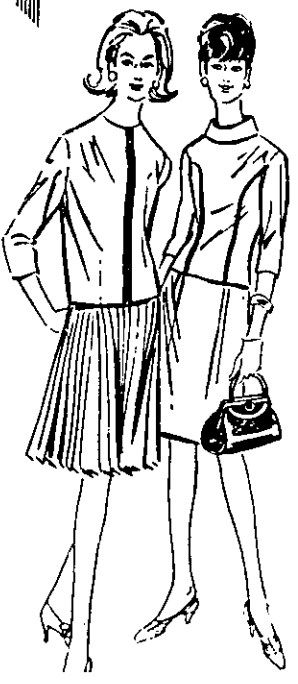

are required to meet the new regulation.

The exhaust duct should be installed to extend from the open atmosphere to the lower portion of the bilge. The intake duct should extend to at least mid-way to the bilge or below the level of the carburetor air intake. The cowls should be located and trimmed for maximum effectiveness to prevent displaced fumes from being recirculated.

The change in the ventilative requirements followed public hearings of the Merchant Marine Council in March 1965. The U. S. Coast Guard was concerned about inadequate ventilation on boats because fires and explosions are the greatest cause of property damage and rank second in personal injury.

The Coast Guard defines open boats as motorboats with all engine and fuel tank compartments and other spaces open to the atmosphere and so arranged to prevent the entrapment of explosive gases within the vessel.

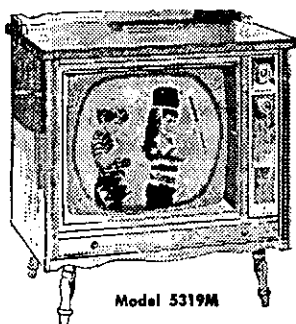

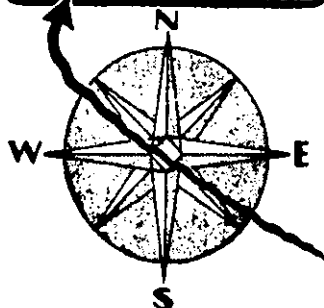
