The first Methodist Church of Delmar will enter upon the second phase of its program of progress crusade Sunday, March 6, continuing through March 23.

The crusade, under the direction of the Rev. Charles W. Welch of the department of finance and field service, national

Women Dems To Be Here

Mrs. Nicholas deB. Katzenbach, wife of the United States Attorney General, will be the guest speaker before New York's Women Demoncrats at the closing luncheon of the 15th Annual Political Conference, on Monday, March 7th, at the Thruway Motor Inn in Albany.

Mrs. Mae Gurevich, Vice Chairman of the Democratic State Committee and Chairman of its Women's Division, has called the State-wide Jubilee Conference for March 5th, 6th and 7th. This year's Chairman, Mrs. Diane Tierman, who is Vice Chairman of Nassau County Democratic Committee, will formally greet the anticipated 600 women party leaders and delegates at 2 P. M. on Saturday afternoon, at the opening session.

Following the formal greeting, William A. Zeck will give a short talk on campaign planning. Mr Zeck, former Rockland County Democratic Committee Chairman and formerly State Campaign Chairman, 1965, serves with Mrs. Gurevich as Co-Chairman of "Operation Support" for the President's program in New York State. Following Mr. Zeck there will be a panel discussion, "The Business of Politics, Women's Expanding Role," moderated by Mrs. Helen Rutishauser, State Committeewoman and former Vice Chairman of Montgomery County.

The panelist are Assemblywoman Shirley Chisholm, Assembly-woman Gail Hellenbrand, both of Kings County; Assemblywoman Dorothy Rose of Erie County and the Director of Research for the Joint Legislative Committee, Miss Laura Davis of Nassau County.

Those participating in the Sunday afternoon panel are State Comptroller Arthur Levitt, Nassau County Executive Eugene H. Nickerson, Suffolk County Executive H. Lee Dennison and Canandaigua industrialist Howard J. Samuels, who is Chairman of the Committee for an Effective Constitution.





New Prints At Library

Can a library become an art gallery, too? That is a debatable question, However, the Delmar Public Library can feel the excitement of having an art collection since it recently added six more prints to its group of three. This brings the total to eighteen, a goodly number, indeed. The prints are all world famous each having been chosen for its individual quality as well as for the renown of the artist who painted it. Mrs. Barbara R. Rau, head librarian, quite rightly is pleased that the Library can offer this cultural medium to any borrower holding a blue card.

Among the new additions is Picasso's "Old Guitarist" which illustrates the artist's marvelous ability to express a mood. In this picture it is one of hopelessness, furtility, despair; yet over all, a feeling of acceptance emerges.

"Bowl of Plums," a product of the talent of the French Rococo painter, Chardin, is a simple stilllife so beautifully executed that the crackels and age marks on the bowl suggest an old muchloved possession.

"Starry Night," a tempetuous, impressionistic painting clearly expresses the obsessive quality of Van Gogh and the interest he found in the supernatural, mystical realms of the universe.


A brilliant, clearly outlined work by Gauguin emphasizes his use of strong, pure but not always realistic colors. The two Tahitian women are in repose so typical of many of his subiects.

"Basket Filled with Flowers" is a treasure taken from the Ming Dynasty. It is small in size, sedate and perfect in detail: tralv representative of the Chinese art of long ago.

And for the multitude of Wyeth admirers, "Ground Hog Day" depicts all that is great in the technique of this splendid American artist. The colors are soft; the sun slants through a window high lighting a familiar, homely interior. The wonder of the painting may rest in the outdoor vista glimpsed beyand and again through this window. One feels the cold of winter - the lovely warmth of a February sun.

The prints will be listed in the card catalog and a snapshot of each will be pasted on the individual card.

Ambassador Project will be held at 8 P. M. on March 10, in the library of Bethlehem Central Senior High School. It will offer the most outstanding program which the Project could possibly provide. The speaker of the evening will be Dr. F. Gordon Boyce, President of the U. S. Experiment in International Living and Secretary General of the International Experiment.

He will discuss The Experiment's role in training men and women for the Peace Corps, and he will also look into the future by outlining some areas into which Experiment activities are expected to expand.

Prior to joining The Experiment, Dr. Boyce had been engaged in newspaper reporting and advertising in his home city of Binghamton. After service with the 11th Amphibious Fleet, he became Assistant to the President of Colgate University in 1946. He left this post in 1950 to succeed Dr. Donald Watt, Founder of The Experiment, as President of the organization. His activities since that time include (1951-55) service as President of the Council on Student Travel, and membership on the Executive Committee of the Youth Activities Division of Pres. Eisenhower's Peopleto-People program. He also findstime to be a trustee of Colgate University, the College of the Virgin Islands, Windham College, the American Students' and Artists' Center in Paris, as well as to be a member of the Executive Committee of the U.S.

Committee for UNESCO.

In February 1961, Dr. Boyce was invited to Washington to assist Sargent Shriver in launching the Peace Corps. This was a logical move since Mr. Shriver was himself one of the earliest participants in The Experiment program. Dr. Boyce remained as Consultant to the Peace Corps, on leave from The Experiment, until August 1961. A close cooperation between The Experiment and the Peace Corps has continued since that time and this is one of the topics Dr. Boyce will discuss.

At present, The Experiment is expanding into a variety of fields which its founder never contemplated. These are, however, a natural extension of the philosophy that "By living together men learn to live together." Dr. Boyce will explore these progressively widening areas and it is to be hoped no vitally concerned person in this area will miss the opportundy to hear him.


