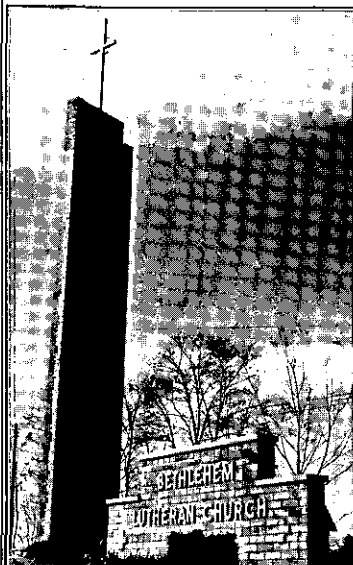

of the City of Albany as reflected in envelopes and letters carried through the mails. The letters date back to the pre-Revolutionary period and include envelopes with the first Albany postmark used in 1771.

In addition to the collections on display and the temporary post office, where obsolete commemorative stamps may be purchased, a number of prominent stamp dealers will have booths at the exhibition which will be open for business or browsing.

The club has also prepared a set of 2 historical envelopes which depict the first Albany postmark and also Bill Winne, Albany's penny postman from 1795 to 1832. These envelopes will be stamped and mailed from the exhibition hall. Also available will be a specially printed envelope in tribute to the 20th anniversary of the USS Albany, which will be mailed from the post office on board ship. This set of envelopes is available for 50 cents, either at the exhibition or by sending remittance to the Cachet Committee, Box 7111, Capitol Station, Albany, N. Y. The price includes the envelopes, postage and an explanatory enclosure. Profits from the sale of these envelopes will go to the ship service fund of the USS Albany.

The general public is invited to attend the Exhibition at the Knights of Columbus Hall and the Hall will be open from 10:00 A. M. to 10:00 P. M. on Saturday, April 16 and from noon to 7:00 P. M. on Sunday, April 17.

St. Rose Fellowships

derstanding about the Montessori method," one of the local association members told me recently. "Many seem to think — incorrectly — that it strives to turn all kids into prodigies, by teaching them to read at age two, for example."

Advocates of the educational system point out that the Montessori schools teach the whole child, by offering a "prepared environment" in which they learn to relate to other children and to the materials they are given. The teachers are specially trained, but do not assume the position of importance they have in most classrooms.

The area Montessori nursery school will be located in or near

Albany, and already a great many applications have been received. "We honestly don't need to advertise," a spokesman said, "because the interest already generated has been tremendous."
