

A wide range of country living — with barns, horses, breath-taking views — will be shown at homes on the tour — most of which are in the Slingerlands-New Scotland or Feura Bush areas.

The tour, with "A Day in the Country" as its theme, will take place May 7. Homes will be open from 1 to 5 P. M. A preview or unique decor, formal living, and the country atmosphere is given by the pictures on this page, taken at three of the homes to be shown.

One of the main attractions at the New Scotland Road home of Dr. and Mrs. Jesse Kaye will be the master bedroom.

The art display is a theater collection willed to Mrs. Kaye by the late Garrison Sherwood, who directed plays for her when she produced the Shelly Players.

Among the treasured photographs in the collection are those of Marlene Deitrich, John Barrymore, and the Prince of Wales. There are also autographed pictures of Rudolph Valentino, Lillian Russell and Anna May Wong and pictures of Blanche Yurka and Una Merkel, and other old-time silent-movies stars.

The home of Dr. and Mrs. Ray A. Elliott, Jr., is a house built for gracious country living. It is spacious, light and inviting with its lovely curved stairway and blend of old and new furnishings.

Upstairs there is a separate wing for children consisting of three bedrooms, a playroom and bath. A barn adjacent to the house contains the four riding horses kept by the Elliotts.

The Slingerlands home of Dr. and Mrs. Irwin Conroe, "Edgewood," is highlighted later in the spring with Dr. Conroe's garden containing prize iris. A century-old dwelling, it was built by Col. Hendrick and owned by his daughter, Mrs. Charles Thaddeus Terry, until 1954.

Dr. and Mrs. Joseph T. Doyle will show their home on Font Grove Road, Slingerlands. Fine furniture and superb decorating by Mrs. Doyle have transformed this six-year-old house into a home in the finest Early American tradition.

Also in Slingerlands, "House on the Green," will be shown by Mr. and Mrs. Albert Hessberg, 2nd. It is set far back from the roadway in the midst of a lovely lawn.

The piece-de-resistance there are original prints of Goold carriages in the dining room and in the family room a miniature of a Goold railroad car. The James Goold Company, carriagemakers, was founded in 1813 by Miss Hessberg's family. It built a carriage for Lafayette and cars for the DeWitt Clinton Railroad Engine.

Refreshments will be served at the Hessberg home from 1 to 5 P. M.

The newest and most contempory in style of all the homes on the tour will be that of Mr. and Mrs. Albert S. Hartheimer in New Scotland. It was designed by its architect-owner and is geared to the young modern family.

Dr. and Mrs. Ewald Nyquist will show one of the oldest homes on the tour. Located on Rowe Road, Feura Bush, it was built in 1756. Tour-goers with country nostalgia will find a farm atmosphere here. Barns house Herefords, horses and Karakul sheep. Mrs. Nyquist uses the wool of the sheep in her weaving, and her weaving cottage will be open to visitors.

Wellesley club members will be hostesses at each of the homes.



### Poppy Day

Wednesday, May 11th, is Poppy Day in Delmar and the bright scarlet flowers will be worn by countless patriotic citizens of the area as a tribute to our nation's defenders who have fallen in battle. Sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary, the annual observance provides all America with a direct and sincere method of expressing their gratitude to our war dead.

Poppies will be distributed throught the area Wednesday by women of #1040 Unit of the American Legion Auxiliary, working as volunteers under the direction of Mrs. Given S. Hynds, Chairman of the Poppy Day activities of Blanchard #1040 Unit in the Delmar area.

"The memorial flowers to be offered to the public Wednesday are hand made by disabled veterans who are paid for their work by the Auxiliary. All other work done in connection with Poppy Day is on a volunteer basis," Mrs. Hynds pointed out.

The funds collected during the Poppy Day activity here pro-

vide the means of continuing the long-standing Rehabilitation Program for disabled veterans and aid to the widows and children of our war dead, the Auxiliary leader pointed out. Personal needs, equipment and articles not provided by hospitals to disabled veterans, and aid to needy families of veterans with special emphasis on the requirements of their children are supplied with the contributions made by the American public on Poppy Day.

"The people of Delmar have always opened their hearts to this worthwhile community activity and we are confident their dimes and dollars this year will insure a continuation of our assistance programs," Mrs. Hynds added.

### A Giant In Selkirk?

More than 75 officials of the New York Central Railroad and the Pennsylvania Railroad have been hard at work for more than a year preparing plans to merge the two railroads and one result of their efforts is a set of engineering drawings for a giant new automated freight yard for Selkirk.

The Selkirk Yards will be the big gainer of the merger, which was approved recently by the Interstate Commerce Commission. The New York Central has stated in the past that almost \$20 million will be spent on the Selkirk Yards.

The decision will insure the installation of a new electronic freight car sorting system.

The merger plan is designed to handle the combined freight networks of the two railroads.

The new electronic system would replace the manual sorting system currently in use at Selkirk. Some 2,300 freight cars pass through the yards on an average day at present.

Substantial tax benefits will accrue to the Town of Bethlehem and to the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Central Schools with the construction of area facilities.



### Cook Book

Did you ever want to eat cookin' "Just like Moms? Here's your chance! The New Salem Volunteer Fire Department Auxiliary (we're Moms) have finally done it: Put together in one cook book all their favorite delicacies. ### Vegetable Gardening

Many people are now planning and getting a start on their vegetable gardens. We don't always have a big choice of where to put a vegetable garden, but fortunately a garden will grow wherever weeds will grow. If possible, avoid steep slopes, stoney soil and areas that are low and wet. A loamy soil is best, but heavier or sandier soils may be used. The heavy clays and the sandy soils can both be improved by adding organic matter such as farm manure, compost, peat moss, etc.

Sunlight is needed by all plants, and most vegetables need a minimum of 5-6 hours of full sunlight in the middle of the day. If there is a choice, put the root crops, tomatoes, corn, potatoes, cucumbers, and melons in as full sunlight as possible. Broccoli, snap beans, cabbage and the leafy crop can tolerate some shade.

Before you dig your garden, it it advisable to have your soil tested for lime needs. Many soils in Albany County are naturally too acid for most vegetables. However, the only way to determine whether or not you need to add lime and how much lime is needed is to have your soil tested. This can be done in a few minutes at the Extension office or at most garden centers. If you do need lime, apply half

of it before you spade the garden and rake the remaining half in after spading.

A complete fertilizer is needed annually in most gardens. Two or three pounds of a 10-10-10, 12-12-12 or similar fertilizer for each 100 square feet of garden should be enough. Most of this can be applied in a trench three inches to the side of the row and at least 2 inches below the seeds or plants. This puts a supply of nutrients close to the young plant. If you use manure, use one bushel of manure for each 50-75 square feet of garden and spread one pound of super-phosphate over the same area. This much manure will replace the commercial fertilizer.

### Paper Plans

Even the most experienced gardeners find that it is worth while to plan their garden on paper. This can eliminate mistakes like over planting one crop and then finding yourself without space for another crop. When you plan your garden, keep these points in mind:

1. Group plants according to size to prevent shading.


- 2. Garden rows may be either east and west, or north and south. However if they are east and west, plant the tall growing crops on the north to prevent shading.
- 3. If the garden is on a hillside, run the rows across the slope to prevent erosion.
- 4. Remove refuse of early crops and replant with other crops that will mature by the end of the season. For example leaf lettuce can follow beets, fall spinach can follow peas and the late broccolican follow early cabbage. A second application of fertilizer will be needed if you "double crop."
