Mrs. Gladys V. Hosey, Chairman of the Business Education Department at Bethlehem Central Senior High School, is proud to announce that Hugh Brown, teacher of Consumer Education and Bookkeeping, and Robert A. Pierson, Coordinator of Distributive Education and Advisor of Distributive Education Clubs of America (D.E.C.A.), have received grants to attend summer workshops.

Mr. Brown will be at the Hofstra University Workshop in Automatic Data Processing during July. He will be one of 35 teachers enrolled from the State of New York who will be studying techniques for teaching data processing. Selection was made on the basis of:

3. A statement saying that he will teach a course dealing with this subject.

Old Tools

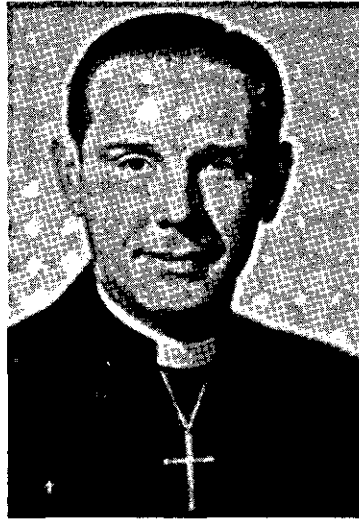

ing acclimated to his new surroundings. He won the Kentucky Derby, the the Preakness. He wasn't nominated to The Belmont but he will be supplemented to the race for a fee of \$5,000.

Over the course of the years eight horses have been able to sweep the Triple Crown. Sir Barton, in 1919, was the first to do it. The others have been Gallant Fox in 1930, Omaha in 1935, War Admiral in 1937, Whirlaway in 1941, Count Fleet in 1943, Assault in 1946 and Citation in 1948.

Kauai King, a \$42,000 yearling purchase, now has a chance to be No. 9. Lightly raced as a two-year-old — only four starts with one victory, one second and one third — he's been a terror in his division this year. He's won eight of ten starts, with one second. His only time out of the mon-

ey was a fifth in the Florida Derby. His second was in the Hutcheson Stakes. His stakes victories this year have been, in addition to the Derby and the Preakness, the Fountain of Youth, Prince George's and Governor's Gold Cup. To date this year he's earned \$369,027.

On Wednesday, June 8, Saint Gregory's School for Boys in Loudonville will conduct its first Commencement Exercise. The school conducted by Catholic laymen, first opened its doors in 1962 with 32 boys enrolled in Kindergarten through the fifth grade. This year, with a student body of 118, Saint Gregory's will graduate its first class of eighth-grade boys. Members of the class are: Peter Joseph Cornell, Van Gerard Falcone, Terrence Thomas Feret, Benjamin Grant Holmes, James Paul Noonan, William Edward Noonan, Jr., Jonathan Hoy Por-

ter, and John Lewis Zimicki Jr. In September, these boys will enter several of the leading boarding schools in New England, as well as local private and public high schools.

The Saint Gregory's Board of Trustees recently made public its plans for further expansion of the school's physical plant. To be erected this summer are a library and auditorium-gymnasium. These facilities are to be followed by the construction of additional classrooms which will provide the school with adequate space to fully provide for its maximum enrollment of 150 boys.

Thomas D. O'Connor of Loudonville is President of the school's Board of Trustees. M. Raymond O'Brien of Troy is Headmaster.

Graduation

Albany Academy for Girls will complete its 152nd year of classes with the graduation of 31 seniors on Tuesday, June 7.

All members of the class will go on to institutions of higher education in the fall, and are enrolled in 25 colleges and universities in New York State, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Vermont, Virginia, Connecticut, Ohio, Maryland and Illinois. Colleges which have enrolled more than one member of the graduating class are Wellesley, Boston University, Hollins, and Hood.

The academy is an independent day school with an approximate enrollment of 310 girls from Kindergarten through grade 12. Its modern buildings on Academy Road are surrounded by twenty acres of lawn, playing fields and meadow. Many classes and activities are scheduled outdoors in the spring and fall, and the younger students enjoy ice-skating and sledding on the grounds during the winter months.

The program of studies emphasizes academic curriculum and college preparation. Small classes, excellent teaching, and attention of individual differences in students create a strong and stimulating educational situation.

The academy accepts a limited number of students each year,

Admission is through personal interview and tests, and appointments may be made through the school office which will be open from 9 to 4 on week days during the summer. School will reopen on Tuesday, September 13.
