St. Rose News

The mathematics department of The College of Saint Rose in Albany, has announced a \$5.170 grant to the college from the National Science Foundation for an in-service institute on mathematics at Saint Rose during the 1966-67 academic year.

The purpose of the proposed program is to give teachers and supervisors an adequate command of the concepts and techniques necessary to teach a more modern arithmetic program in the elementary grades and at the same time be aware of the type of mathematics that students will learn beginning junior high school.

William Berlinghoff of the Mathematics Department will instruct the institute.



The program to be directed by Sister Kathleen Ann, Ph.D., assistant professor of mathematics, will be limited to 30 participants, teachers of grades 4, 5, and 6, principals, and supervisors of any elementary school, public, private and parochial.

There will be no prerequisites, since many certified teachers have had little or no formal mathematics in college. No fees or tuition will be required, and participants will be reimbursed for travel expenses and texts.


A total of six graduate credits

applicable toward a degree of Master of Science in Education may be obtained by completing the program.

Application may be obtained by writing the mathematics department at the college.

Classes will be held at Saint Rose Saturdays from 9 A. M. to 12 noon, from September 24 to May 20.

Each class session will be combined lecture and laboratory period. Material will be supplemented by guest lectures, films and practical demonstrations.




