





Winners



Moles

Moles and the tunnels made by moles can become quite a problem on lawns. They are unsightly, make walking somewhat hazardous, and do a lawn no good.

A mole is a persistant animal and if you want to eliminate him you have to understand him. A mole digs tunnels in search of food and his favorite food is grubs. Where there are no grubs there are rarely any moles. So instead of fighting moles directly, eliminate their favorite food.

Grubs are mostly the larvae of various beetles including the Japanese beetle. They live in the soil and feed on the roots of plants. By getting rid of them you avoid grub damage and send moles (and skunks and raccoons) on their way to dig elsewhere.

The insecticide chlordane. when applied to the soil as directed, will grub-proof your lawn for about five years. Even some of the crab grass preventors help to grub-proof lawns. Both Bandane and Zytron will grub proof your lawn for one to two years.

If you are bothered by moles, your best bet is eliminate their favorite food and make them dive elsewhere.



call the Council Office at 869-0961, and get more details. The cost is \$250 which includes all meals, lodging, transportation, equipment, supplies and the Philmont fee.

Tool Exhibit

A very fine and extensive collection of early tools has been on display at the Town of Bethlehem Museum in the Cedar Hill School building, Route 144. In order for as many people as possible to see this collection it has been decided to continue the same exhibit for the month of July. The museum is open to the public, free of charge, every Sunday afternoon from 2 to 5 P. M.

A corner of the museum has been set up with early black-smithing equipment taken from the shop of John Martin of Glenmont. Mr. Martin is deceased, but the equipment is in the possession of his nephew, John Comstock, the present postmaster of Glenmont. The old blacksmith shop of Mr. Martin now houses the present Glenmont postoffice. On exhibit are the big anvil from the old forge, along with pony and horse shoes in varying sizes

as well as "ice creepers" put on the horses' hooves to keep him from slipping on the icepacked roads, as well as an infinite variety of smithing equipment. Also included in the display are the contents of a wheelwright's shop, for the old time blacksmith also made wheels in all sizes for wagons and buggies.

Household equipment and tools from several area families are also included, with familiar names like Baumes and Walley showing tinware, bellows, flatirons and fluting irons, as well as iron "peels" used in taking baked goods from the oven.

There are also several tables of early carpenters' tools on display, many of them also owned by Mr. Comstock, who was a prominent local home builder for many years. All types of planes, saws, hammers, and other tools of the carpenters' trade are carefully preserved and exhibited for the visitor to the museum.




A Venture in Human Understanding
