

Public Hearing

Supervisor Bertram E. Kohinke announced today that a Public Hearing has been set for July 20 to consider the new law providing for a partial tax exemption of real property owners by certain persons with limited income who are 65 years or over.

In order to qualify for an exemption, the following requirements would have to be met:

- 1) All the owners of the real property must be 65 years of age or over on the date the application is filed.
- 2) Title to the property must have been vested in the owners of the property for at least five years prior to the date of application.
- 3) The property must be used exclusively for residential purposes and be occupied in whole or in part by the owner or owners and be their legal residence.
- 4) The income of all the owners must have been \$3,000 or less during the 12-month period immediately preceding the date of application — where title to the property is vested in either husband or wife, the combined income of the husband and wife may not exceed \$3,000. "Income" includes all Social Security and Retirement payments, interest, dividends, rental income, salaries or other earnings including income from self-employment. It does not include gifts or inheritances received during the 12-month period. The burden of proof is upon the applicants to show eligibility and they may be required to obtain and submit copies of their latest Federal and State income tax returns, Social Security statements, etc.
- 5) Where a child resides on the property for which an exemption is sought, no school tax exemption may be granted if such a child attends public school within the school district.

Letter

Dear friends,

Amidst considerable confusion while enroute, we arrived safely in Krakow at 2:00 A. M. on Friday, June 24, where my Polish brother, Bogdan Regulski, and his friends waited to greet us. Bogdan, 21, is a student at the Fine Arts Academy, and he is a specialist in graphics, his father's occupation. Our nice apartment is located across the Vistula from the center of town, not far from the famous castle "Wawel." Already our group has visited many interesting historical sites together, including the Kosciot Maryjeca, or St. Mary's church, at Rynek, the large town square.

On Thursday, June 30, our group, consisting of nine Americans besides myself, and our Polish brothers and sisters, will begin its tour of the country. First we will visit Scztetcin (Stechin) which is part of the territory Germany lost to Poland after the war. Our next stop will be Gdanxk and Sopot on the Baltic Sea, then on to Warsaw, and finally, to the beautiful mountain resort south of Krakow known as Zakopane.

Today, the 28th, we traveled about 50 kilometers by train to Oschwezem, or Auschwitz, where our entire group was greatly moved by the memories preserved within these gates. I discovered how different it was to read about atrocities than to stand next to a Polish peasant woman bearing flowers in memory of her husband.

I'm sorry I haven't time to tell about all that has happened, but it's almost time to start the next letter so I had better mail this one. Goodbye for now, or Dowydsenja.

She will attend the Senior Girl Scout East-West International Conference in Honolulu, Hawaii, August 7-23, a project of the government of the United States in cooperation with the University of Hawaii.

The conference will bring together 128 Senior Girl Scouts and Girl Guides from the United States, Asia and the Pacific Islands for the purpose of developing mutual appreciation of East-

ern and Western cultural values.

Loretta will leave Delmar July 15 and travel by car with her family to San Francisco. From here she boards a plane to Honolulu. She will arrive in Honolulu on August 1 and, like all the other girls in the conference, will be the guest of a Girl Scout family in Hawaii for one week preceding the opening conference session.

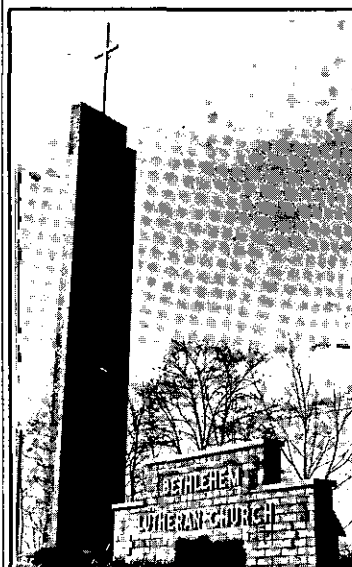
