He has been living with a Polish family in Krakow during most of July and is now visiting other parts of Poland, accompanied by a group of young Americans and Poles and their leaders, under the guidance of the Experiment in International Living. Another of the group members is Bogdan Regulsky, a member of the Polish family Tim has been living with.

August 1, 1966

Dear Friends.

We just missed seeing in person the immense celebration in Warsaw of Poland's liberation and First Manifesto. However, we did watch the great parade, which was the largest Poland has ever seen, on television back "home" in Krakow.

Another highlight on television has been the Polish-Russian track meet. At this writing, the Poles are in the lead and we are all quite elated.

One interesting event in Warsaw that happened while we were still there was the demonstration over Viet Nam at the American Embassy. More on this when I return home.

Tomorrow will bring a big change in scene when we leave the city life of Krakow for Zaccopane, a picturesque mountain resort near the Czech border. We will spend 3 to 4 days there. Hiking and mountain climbing are favorite forms of recreation in Poland so my "brother" Bogdan is really looking forward to it. After that we will spend one day in Warsaw and then go on to Berlin for 10 days.

Perhaps some of you remember Anna Capinski, who studied at BCHS for the 1963-4 school year and lived at the home of Mr. and Mrs. James Lade of Van Wies Point. Bogdan and I paid her a visit one afternoon and we had a very enjoyable conversation. We were both amazed at her knowledge of English. However, no one has made more progress in English then Bog-

dan. Here are a few words from

Dear Friends:

I'm so glad I could become acquainted with American students. The Experiment was unknown to me before, but after coming to Poland the members of the Experiment group became very nice surprise.

Idea of exchanging youth between other countries is modern and helps to understand many problems. It helps young people to look objective at world. I welcome in future with pleasure next useful ideas like this, because in my mind friendship is one of the most important things.

I would like to thank Mr. Thornton and all the Experiment for wonderful meeting in Poland and I hope that our friendship is and will be fruitful. I was very pleased.

Donald Bardole, a senior at Bethlehem Senior High School, has loaned his collection of old pipes and inkwells to the Delmar Public Library for a monthlong exhibit. A gift of a tiny hand carved bone pipe showing two stags started Don on his hobby.

From there the collection has grown and includes a clay bowl carved in the image of the Bibical Jacob; a German pipe featuring a hand painted outdoor scene on a China bowl; an intricately carved wooden Italian pipe; two German pipes having the very long stems, one with inlaid mother of pearl; and a clay pipe that obviously was carved long ago when an ancester "just wanted a smoke."

The inkwells are as facinating.

Two of pale green glass are typical of those seen in pictures of

Washington at his desk, so must date from the days of the Revolution. Another is a tiny carved wooden Swiss chalet; a single and a double one alike in design, date 1879; and most unique of all is a crudely hand-carved soapstone well that again suggests necessity caused its making.

Don's mother, Mrs. Marion Bardole, a member of the Library staff, is an avid antique collector herself. Perhaps his interest in his hobby began after his grandfather's gift of the little Meerschaum and developed as a small boy waited for his parents on antiquing tours. The lure of "Antiques for Sale" probably developed in pure self defense and helped while away the hours in shops all over New England.

It is especially gratifying that the August exhibit belongs to a teen-ager whose hobby ties in with the history of our country.



Dear Friends,


My name is Gabriela Lopez. I am from Talca, Chile, and have just returned home after spending a year in Delmar as an American Field Service exchange student.







New Flag

A modern-day Betsy Ross and her military historian husband, Col. Robert E. Mulligan, have combined their talents to give the New York State Guard its first official flag.

It took 49 years for the New York Guard, a reserve land force, to complete its military image by authorizing an official Color for its headquarters.

The flag was presented to Maj. W. Reynolds Carr, New York Guard commander, at a ceremony in the Washington Avenue Armory, where the flag now is on display.

"The New York Guard will be forever indebted to Colonel and Mrs. Mulligan for their outstanding contribution, which is certain to strengthen the already high morale and espirt de corps of our State Guardsmen," General Carr said.

· Col. John L. Cunningham, of Ellenville, New York Guard chaplain, officially blessed the flag and dedicated it to the service of peace.

The design for the new flag

was coordinated by Colonel Mulligan, of 7 Brockley Drive, Delmar, a newly-elected Fellow in the Company of Military Historians and commanding officer of the Third Area Command. In civilian life he is employed by the Bill Drafting Commission of the New York Legislature.

Early this year Colonel Mulligan submitted a watercolor drawing of the proposed flag to Maj. Gen. A. C. O'Hara, chief of staff to the governor, for ap-

Mrs. Mulligan was recruited to sew the flag "because there was no other way of getting one."

She spent nearly 200 womanhours-or about 8 weeks-embroidering and appliquing the flag. She is no amateur seamstress, but a many-time blue-ribbon winner in homemaking competitions.


Mrs. Mulligan has made a parade flag, 3 feet by 4 feet, of Irish linen, and the official flag of silk, 4 1/2 feet by 6 feet.

The flags have a background of two blue and gold horizonal stripes (the colors of the State of New York). In the center is the shoulder-sleeve insignia of the force, 22 inches in height. The crest of the insignia is Henry Hudson's ship Half Moon, full rigged and sailing on an orange and blue wreath.
