



year, from the school children of Albany to the fighting men in Vietnam, as a series of coincidences which might be one of those "Christmas Miracles" led to a truly rewarding experience for a G.I. on duty in Qui Nhon.

Army Specialist 4th Class Mc-Ewan Perkins, who has been in Viet Nam since last July, wrote home early this month to tell his family that a beautifully wrapped gift package had been delivered to him through a Red Cross Field Office in Qui Nhon. It was one of eight boxes of gift items for our servicemen which had been prepared by students at Public School #16, in Albany as a part of project "Operation Shop Early" of the Albany Area Chapter, American Red Cross. Mrs. K. Leonard Perkins, Chairman of the Production Committee for the Albany Chapter is Specialist Perkins' grandmother. On a

whim, she wrote his name and location on the package, never dreaming it would actually get into his hands.

An excerpt from Perkins' letter tells the story:

"I received a call from the Director of the Qui Nhon Red Cross the other day, and he informed me that your packages had arrived. I went down and picked up one box with nine individual presents in it and the rest he will distribute as he normally would, probably to the front line units who surely deserve anything to brighten their days. I am going to save the box of nine I have, and when the Red Cross has their Christmas Party, which I am sure they will, (We have a Red Cross Center that is open every day which serves coffee, kool ade, cards, etc.) I will give them the presents to give out as prizes or





### Two Trees


Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Delmar, will restore a christian custom dating back to the 13th Century. At that time when "Miracle Plays" were used to illustrate the teachings of the Christian Church — two Christmas trees of a unique nature were used.

The tree on the Epistle side of the Altar is called "The tree of Sin." This tree is barren except for 33 apples. It recalls the Fall of Man into sin in the garden of Eden. The 33 apples remind us that Christ spent 33 years on earth to redeem mankind.

The tree on the Gospel side of the Altar is called "The Tree of Life." This tree is an evergreen decorated with 33 roses, 33 can-

Prof. Gwen J. Bymers, economist at the N.Y. State College of Home Economics, said "consumer education must have failed when housewives find it necessary to engage in a boycott to communicate with market management..."

### No Fires!!

"Keep your Christmas merry. by making this a fire-safe Christmas in your home," Robert C. Sowers, chairman of the Eastern New York Adequate Wiring Bureau Board of Directors, cautioned at a recent meeting of AWB members. Mr. Sowers is appliance manager of John G. Myers Co. of Albany and Fowler's of Glens Falls.

During the course of his talk, Sowers offered the following tips to homeowners on how to prevent fires during the busy holiday season ahead:

"Use only lighting equipment carrying the Underwriters' Laboratory label. Unlabelled materials, domestic as well as foreign, seldom meet safety standards," Sowers said, "so use only those sets which carry the UL label. And be sure the fuse on the circuit serving the tree and other lighting is not over 15 amperes.

"For outdoor lighting," he continued, "use only sets specifically listed for outdoor use by Underwriters' Laboratory. And remember to turn off all tree and other holiday lighting before retiring or leaving the house."

Sowers further cautioned homeowners not to rely on selfapplied chemical coatings or solutions to "flameproof" a naural tree. "None of these is completely effective," he said, "so the tree should be kept in the house for the shortest possible period." He added that trees commercially treated with ULlisted fire retardant compounds are satisfactory.

trees." "Artificial Sowers continued, "also need care. Plastic and metalized plastic trees can burn, so when selecting your artificial tree, look for one that is clearly marked as being made of slow-burning materials. And, if you buy one with a built-in electrical system, check to see that it carries the UL label.

"Metal trees, while not a fire hazard, may be a shock hazard, so use only indirect lighting with them. If a string of lights is placed on a metal tree, it may become 'charged' and dangerous.

"Parents should exercise care when selecting electrical toys," he cautioned. "Such toys should also be listed by Underwriters' Labortory to show they have met shock and fire hazard standards."

According to Sowers, home isn't the only place where dangerous Christmas fire hazards can exist. Wherever holiday decorations are used — in schools, churches, hospitals and offices, for example — only non-combustible trees and decorations should be used.


"One of the best precautions you can take is to have your home wiring system checked to be sure it is adequate to meet the extra demands you will be making on it during the holiday season. Simply call an AWB member elec-

trical contractor and ask for a free housepower inspection. Should your home need rewiring, AWB member banks will arrange financing with payments as low as \$10 a month.

"Caution and a complete check of your home wiring system are the best assurance of a merry and fire-safe holiday season," Sowers concluded.



## League News

"The League of Women Voters of New York State will urge the Constitutional Convention to abandon the partisan election of judges in the state Courts and to establish new procedures to govern judicial tenure," Mrs. Robert Herman, President of the-League of Women Voters of Albany County, declared today.

Mrs. Herman explained that the Albany County League, participating with Leagues representing members in small and large cities, and in towns and villages and suburbs, have studied judicial selection methods

and tenure procedures in New York and other states. After 18 months of study, League members of 89 communities throughout the state are squarely behind an all-out revision of the Judiciary Article of the State Constitution. Since 1957 the organization has been in the forefront of the drive for court consolidation and the establishment of strong central administrative and fiscal controls for the judicial branch of government.

Mrs. Herman said, "There should be a system of merit selection and appointment for judges in all of the State courts. We propose that nonpartisan, lay/professional commissions be established in each county and New York City or in each Supreme Court district. These nominating commissions would present lists of candidates for judicial vacancies from which the Gover-

nor or the appropiate authority in the counties and New York City would be constitutionally required to fill vacancies."

The League of Women Voters proposes that the people should have the control of judgeships through a 'retention vote'. After a judge has served for several years, the voters should be asked to vote on the question "Shall ..., Judge of the ... Court, be retained in office.'"

"We believe that the vast majority of New York's judges are hardworking and conscientious, but the procedures to deal with the few who are not — or for the average citizen to voice a complaint — are inadequate."

"We advocate the establishment of tenure commissions, similar to the nominating commissions, to receive complaints about judicial conduct or disability from any source — from liti-

gants, lawyers and fellow judges and to investigate them. All investigations should be conducted in the strictest confidence and their reports and recommendations should be submitted to a duly constituted court of law. No judge should be publicly repremanded, forced to retire against his will or removed without due process. Nor should he be submitted to the full glare of publicity on charges not proven, as is presently the case."

Mrs. Herman stated that the tenure commissions could perform an additional function by giving needed guidance to the voters considering the retention of a judge in office by preparing a factual, documented report of the judge's record.

Mrs. Herman's statement is the result of concentrated study by judicial chairmen and their committees throughout the state.


# The Psychology Of Music

"Music hath charms to soothe the savage beast/To soften rocks or bend a knotted oak . . . " wrote the 17th century poet William Congreve. Today, more than 250 years later, psychologists are investigating this quality in music which can create as well as relieve moods, and are putting it to use in both the hospital and the home.

The ability of music to create moods which are, in effect emotional states has long been recognized in the arts where it is listened to exclusively - or used in conjunction with other art forms, like motion pictures, to create atmosphere. Can anyone conjure up a picture of the "Lone Ranger" bravely astride his white horse without hearing the pulsating strains of the "William Tell Overture" - or viceversa?

Many companies, drawing on the experience of the movies and radio, are now installing sound systems which pipe background music into factories and offices. Industrial psychologists report that quiet, peaceful music will absorb some of the clatter as well as ease tensions and create an atmosphere of sernity - or in some cases gaiety (with an appropriate change in tune). The use of music to ease tension is probably the housewife's "rule of thumb" - and most homemakers, when occupied by chores, do them to the accompan-

iment of radio, phonograph or tape recorder.

At the end of the 19th century, the famous American author Edward Bellamy wrote a novel called "Looking Backward" in which he described his idea of Utopia. One of the things he said was: "If we could have devised an arrangement for providing everybody with music in their homes, perfect in quality, unlimited in quantity, suited to every mood, and beginning and ceasing at will, we should have considered the limit of human felicity already attained." In Bellamy's pre-radio world, the ideal of having music at will and uninterrupted was indeed a dream. Though there was a wealth of good music written and performed in his day, only the very rich could enjoy it regularly. It was a precious commodity.

With the advent of radio, this

problem was solved and ingenuity and technology have worked since perfecting fidelity and transmission.

The most recent development was stock tape cartridges, for home use. But a major drawback seemed to be that the cartridges were not standardized by the recording industry and most machines could only play one size cartridge. A national manufacturer, Arvin Industries, has solved this last difficulty by providing a tape cartridge stero system that plays all major 4 and 8 track cartridges and automatically adjusts to changes in size. Arvin "Four 'N Eight" players automatically eject and turn off the power when the cartridge is completed.

Another important innovation occurred in 1960 when most radio and television stations switched to the use of automatic tape



cartridges thereby doing away with the massive problem of record storage and facilitating handling and program control. Music at will - in 1888 a far fetched dream - is now a working reality.

Aside from the psychological benefits and delight of music which have been recognized by poets, philosophers and playwrights since the beginning of written history, psychologists and physical therapists are discovering the therapeutic value of music. Music therapy which was experimented with a Veteran's Hospitals some fifteen years ago is now used extensively in various forms of therapy with deaf children (who can respond to and learn from the vibrations produced), and with crippled and retarded children to teach them body coordination and movement.

Music with a special "appeal" for you is comparable to any other form of physical stimulant that works on the senses; it can satisfy, delight and exhilerate. The value of music in this sense is due partly to the enormous variety available - something for everyone - or as the 18th century poet George Lillo put it: "There's sure no passion in the human soul/But finds its food in music."

# New Year's Customs

While you may raise a glass While you may raise a glass of sherry from Spain and sing "Auld Lang Syne" when the clock strikes 12 on New Year's Eve, your Japanese counterpart may sip cola from America while singing "Otanjobi Omedeto Gozaimasu" ("Happy Birthday To You") — for the stroke of midnight means it's everyone's birthday!

Celebrating the first day of a new year is an age-old custom. Nearly all peoples have marked the coming of the year. However, the time selected as New Year's Day has varied widely. The First Day has been celebrated as early as the autumnal equinox, about September 21, and as late as the summer solstice, about June 21.

In most European countries

during the Middle Ages, March 25 was the beginning of the New Year. And legend has it that El Cid, the great hero of Spanish liberation from the Moors, once won a great battle on New Year's Day by giving his tired horses generous gulps of Spanish sherry the night before (apparently giving them a head start).

Since antiquity, Jewish people have celebrated their New Year's late in September or early October. The special name which was given this momentous occasion, Rosh Hashanah, means "The Feast of the Trumpets."

With just as much of a roar, the Russian people, long ago, welcomed the New Year in with a hundred cannon shots at midnight.

In ancient China, people took a different approach to the First Day. They cleaned house, paid

debts and closed their shops. Then they shot off their fire-crackers... and who can ever forget a New Year's in Chinatown of a big American city, with its colorful procession and fiery paper dragons breathing good cheer to everyone!

Near China, in old Japan, New Year's was a time for everybody to don new clothes, take three days off from work and visit their friends. Each gatepost would be adorned with green pines and bamboo. And over each door would hang red lobsters, crabs and scarlet tangerines, standing for long life and happiness.

Gypsies in Spain used to marry on New Year's Eve. The 18th century writer George Borrow tells us that a main feature of the bridal ceremony was the feasting associated with it. Once the Gypsy couple took their vows, guests swirled down sherry and ate and sang and danced throughout the night and day.

Not to be outdone, Italians just considered January 1st as part of their Yuletide festival, and so revel until Twelfth Night, 12 days after Christmas.

In Vive-La-France, New Year's Day is so singular that adults let Christmas pass by and exchange presents on January 1st.

And New Year's Eve celebration in England has never quite been the same, ever since Sir Francis Drake brought Spanish sherry to his country for the first time. John Ruskin, noted 19th century critic, once toasted the New Year's in by saying: "I consider just and tolerable the drinking of sherry from dawn to dusk . . . Happy New Year!"

Tradition has it that in Scotland the first one in a house on New Year's Day gets a big big bear hug. Why? Because he has

## **Be Choosy**

"Will your Christmas tree this year be a Scotch pine, a balsam fir, white spruce or Douglas fir?" asks a Cornell University forester.

It will probably be one of these four if a natural tree is selected and you live in New York State, said Prof. Alex Dickson, N.Y. State College of Agriculture. And the chances are good that it will be a Scotch pine since this tree accounts for nearly 50 per cent of the more than 4 million trees sold in the state, he said.

Also this year, those who like to follow tradition by choosing and cutting their own tree will find more growers have opened plantations to meet this growing demand.

Dickson said buyers will find more trees wrapped in plastic netting this year, too, making them easier to carry and set-up in the home.

Douglas-fir is the luxury tree, according to Dickson. It is slow growing, does well only in a limited number of places in the state, and therefore, is quite scarce. It's foliage is soft and fragrant, making it a most desirable tree. The needles are single, soft, flat, and pointed, and it has reddish-brown, pointed buds.

To make sure a tree is fresh, Dickson suggests bouncing the cut end lightly on the ground to see whether the needles fall easily. And he reminds that the trunk should be cut off an inch or two above the original cut and the tree placed in water until it is removed permanently from the house.

A tree will absorb a pint to a quart of water each day, so the container should be checked daily, he warned.

Last year about 10,000 wrapped trees were sold in the first year's trial but Dickson expects three times as many will be available this year.

# Miss Glenmont Diner

A tree from outside the state that has become a favorite with apartment and trailer dwellers is the black spruce, according to the forester. This small tree is native to the swamps of Washington, Minnesota, and Wisconsin. It is always painted and is found in supermarkets in its own metal stand containing a patented liquid to keep it fresh.

Artificial trees are on the market this year in an even greater variety. Dickson pointed out that some people like them for their cleanliness, uniform qual-

ity, and because they can be used over again for many years. Most of them are not flammable, Dickson said, but warned that some imported plastic trees can burn violently.

If buying a natural tree, a shopper can recognize Scotch pine by its pairs of twisted needles that measure from one-and-a half to three inches in length, said Dickson. This tree has gained in popularity because it holds it needles well, he added.

Balsam fir, which is fragrant in a warm room, will cost more than Scotch pine because it is slower growing. This tree is known by its flat, singly attached needles which give off a tangerine-like odor when crushed. The buds of the tree are round.

Spruce has a woodsy fragrance and makes a nice appearance but Dickson warns that it looses its needles rapidly. Its needles are stiffer and pricklier than balsam and are square in cross-section. It can be treated by one of several substances now on the market to help it hold its needles.




