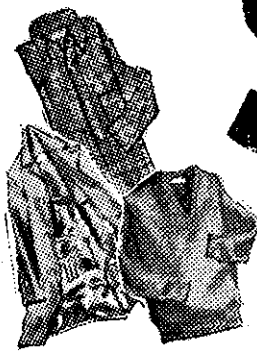

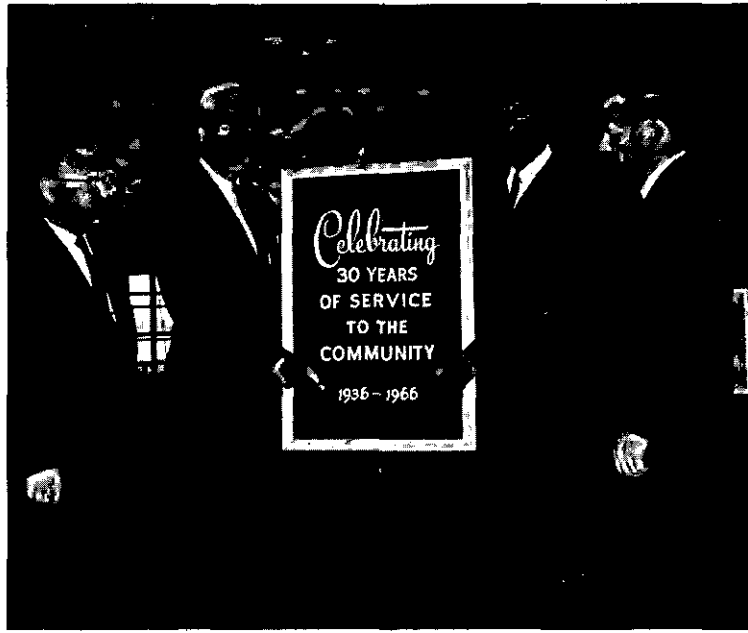

## Success!

The good citizens of our Town, according to a preliminary report by John B. Haker, treasurer of the Bethlehem Community Christmas Festival Committee, contributed a total of \$2,012.30 to the organization's goodwill fund.

This amount represented the collections taken up at each of the three performances of this year's Christmas presentation, "Silver Bells," which totaled \$1,546.65 plus contributions made by individuals, service clubs and businesses throughout the Town amounting to \$465.65. 1966 marked the 25th anniversary of this community

effort to help those in temporary need at Christmas.

Mrs. Arthur G. Dill, who with her husband, headed the White Christmas sub-committee, reported that 36 baskets of food were distributed on Christmas eve to needy families. This included 76 adults and 135 children. Cost to the Festival Committee was \$402.29, and the orders were filled by the Grand Union Market. Medical and dental services were paid for twelve children, totaling \$301, while another \$88.75 was spent for shoes, boots and jackets for eight other children.

**Shutins Remembered**

Mrs. Pasquale Pugliese, chairman of the Remembrance Committee of the Festival said that 182 persons, including shut-ins, those in nursing homes and senior citizens received small gifts of plants, home-made cookies and candy and visits from her members during Christmas week.

**Toy Distribution**

W. Jack Weaver, who heads the toy repair committee operating in the basement of the Masonic Hall, reported that some 800 toys were distributed to 160 children in the area. Because of the abundant number of repairable toys this year, another 450 toys were shared with the Neighborhood House and Trinity Institute for distribution to children in the Albany area.

**Work Continues All Year**

Dr. George F. Foot, general chairman of the Festival Committee, said that the work of the organization continues all year, meeting the temporary needs of families and children in the Town. Through its Clothes Closet Committee, led by Mrs. Robert Denny, servicable clothing is provided. Medical, dental and other services for children is undertaken with the cooperation of local physicians and the school nurses.

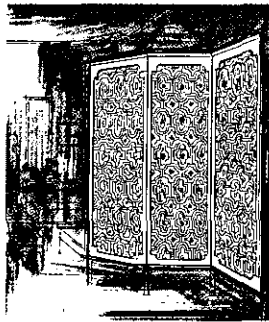

**"Serjeant Musgrave's Dance"  
To Be Presented by SCP**

"Serjeant Musgrave's Dance" will be the Slingerlands Community Players second production of the season at Bethlehem Central High School on Friday and Saturday, January 20 and 21 at 8:30 p.m. Hailed by the New York Times at its New York opening in March this year as an "exceptional work" and "an outstanding play of its generation",

it is the best-known work of 36-year old English playwright, John Arden.

The play is set in 19th Century England under Queen Victoria. Four British soldiers led by Serjeant Musgrave bring a buddy's remains home for burial but are actually deserting from the army. The "Dance" in the title refers to their effort to convert the town to their antiwar attitude. The play takes off from the G. B. Shaw comedy with a similar theme, "Arms and the Man," and its musical version, "The Chocolate Soldier."

Frank Miazga, who directed "Becket" and "An Italian Straw Hat" last year at Albany Civic Theatre, is directing "Serjeant Musgrave's Dance" with the handicap of a true artist: he broke a leg during the performance of his last play and chose the cast of "Serjeant Musgrave" already wearing a cast.

The cast (of players!) is headed by Bill Heenehan (last seen as the lion in the Slingerlands production of "Androcles and the Lion") in the title role of Sergeant Musgrave. Co-featured are SCP favorites Ralph Smith, Charles Losacco, Doug Marone and Martin Barr. The distaff side is graced by Lyn Vooris, another loan from Albany Civic, and Gail Hogan, who has appeared with Arena Theatre at State U.

Other members of the cast are Victor Rosenberg, John Snyder, Steve King, John Hanks, Sam Freeman and Bill Morrison. ("Mary, Mary") Nugent is Assistant Director. The set design is by Bill Morrison and Don Forsythe is in charge of lighting. Authentic period costumes are being created by Ellen Heenehan and Joan Jamison.
