

## Don Cossacks at R-C-S Feb. 28

The original General Platoff Don Cossacks Chorus and Dancers will appear in the RCS Junior-Senior High School Auditorium, Ravena, New York, on Tuesday, February 28, 1967 as the second in a series of three programs sponsored by the RCS Community Cultural Council.

This marks the 21st Anniversary Tour of this famous chorus. The group was originally organized in the Czechoslovakian capital



of Prague in 1933. Ever since its inception the chorus has been headed by Mr. Nikolos Kostrukoff who acts simultaneously as the chorus leader and its administrator.

The chorus is comprised primarily of white Russian emigres who fought communism in Russia as early as 1918-1920. All of the 25 members of the chorus are now American citizens. The Don Cossacks have toured all six continents and have appeared in 65 countries.

The program will consist of Russian liturgical music and folk songs, Cossack melodies, battle songs and American songs. Dances will include the Knife dance and the authentic dances of the Cossack regiments: "Kozatchok."

Approximately 200 tickets will be available for this outstanding attraction. They will be sold on a first come, first served basis. They may be purchased at Grover's Stationary Store, Delaware Plaza or at the Delmar Pharmacy at the Four Corners. All tickets are \$3.00.

## Gardening Talk

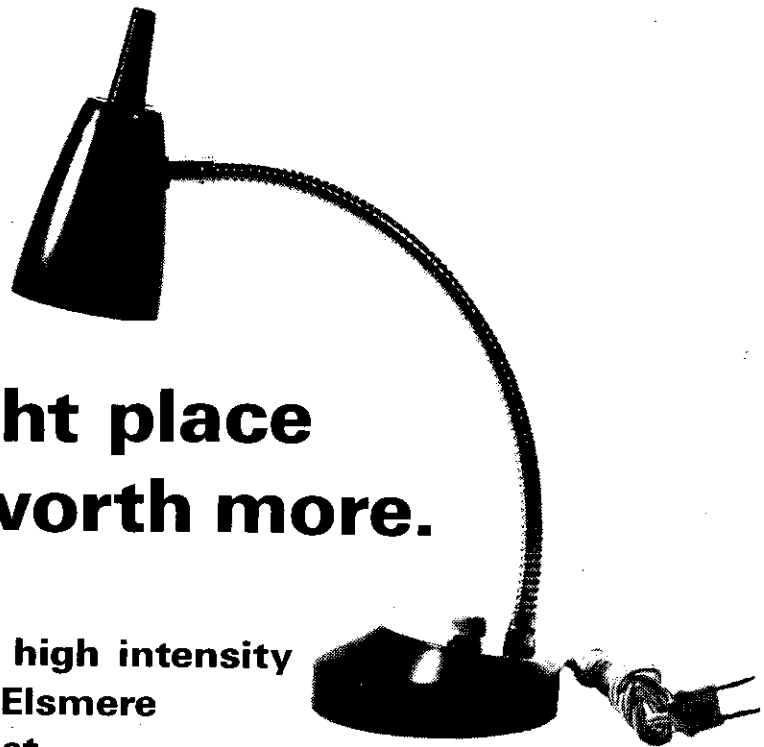

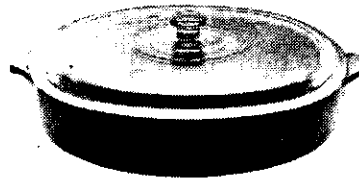

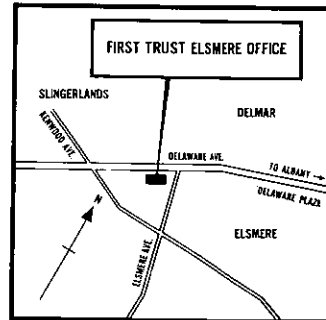

Making and dressing the Ethiopian dolls is a part of this program.

## Bankers Meet

The Annual Shareholders' Meeting of National Commercial Bank and Trust Company was held on Friday, February 3, at the Bank's Heartland Building. In his address to shareholders, Lester W. Herzog, Jr., president, noted that 1966 was a year marked by heightened economic activity and tight money conditions. An increase in the prime rate reflected the pressure on banks to meet strong loan demands from all segments of the business community.

President Herzog announced that deposits, earnings and capital funds rose to new highs in 1966, surpassing the record levels attained the previous year. He stated that new operating earnings increased 14.9%, or \$3.32 per share on a weighted average, compared with \$3.09 in 1965, and that total resources were up \$16,201,967 to \$605,977,485 at year-end. Cash dividends of \$2,321,689, plus a 3% stock dividend were paid during the year, and in view of favorable earnings, the Directors also declared an extra dividend of \$0.10 per share which was paid in January, 1967. On December 31, 1966, the Bank's loan portfolio stood at \$314,948,443.

President Herzog also noted that National Commercial continued to handle more student loans in upstate New York than any other bank, and remained one of very few in the region to offer all three types of mortgage loans during the year. Emphasizing the importance of customer service, he pointed out the establishment of a new International Department and the introduction of Bancardchek service, as well as refinements in trust and investment services. In all categories, there was a substantial increase in the volume of services performed by the Bank.

Two branch offices were opened in 1966, and demolition of buildings at the site of a new office in the South Mall complex is nearing completion. National Commercial Bank now has 51 offices serving the Heartland area of Northeastern New York.

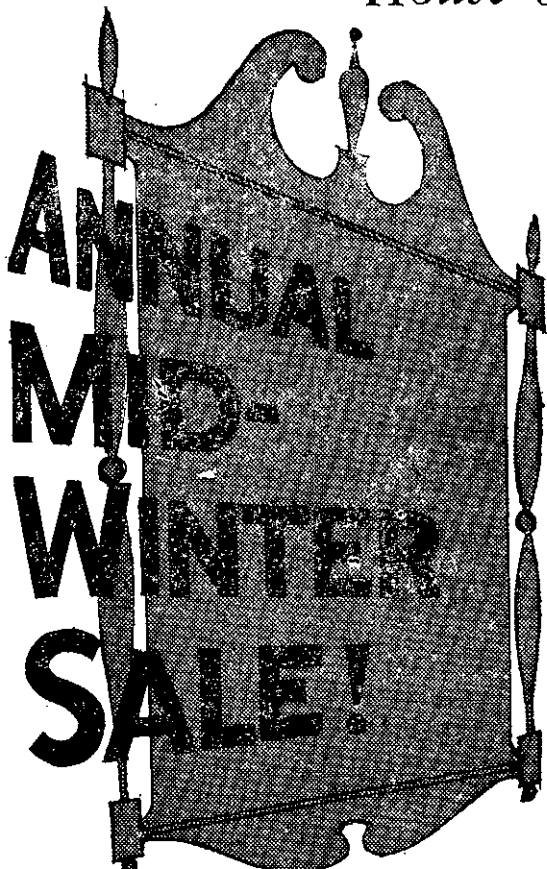

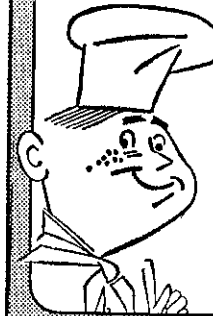
