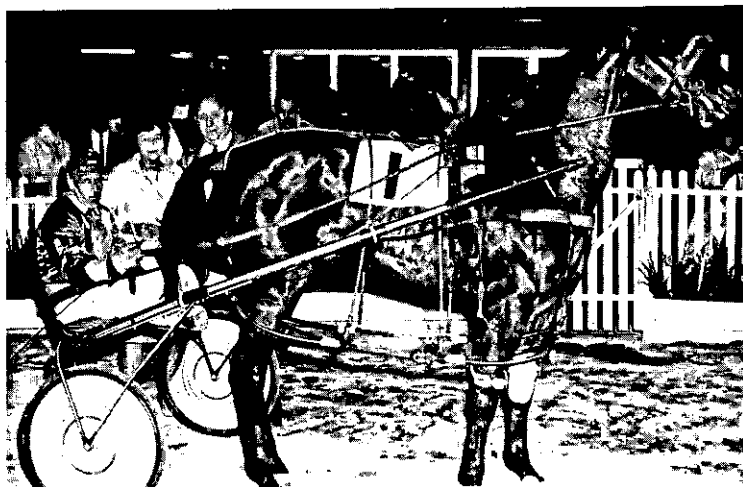

"Day to Explore"

June 1 will be a "Day to Explore," in Bethlehem.

Involved in the event are students from the fourth grade at Clarksville Elementary School and from the fifth grade at Hamagrael Elementary School; parents, teachers and twelve consultants of wide experience and accomplishment in outdoor science and conservation education.

Overall, the "Day," which will be held at Clarksville School, is structured to encourage the continuation of nature studies, good conservation practices and a deep appreciation of the natural environment in which we live.

In general, consultants will work with small groups of children and two or possibly three adults. They will share their knowledge, encourage in the students and their parents a broader appreciation of nature, and a knowledge of, and respect for, good conservation practices.

There are expected to be a good many lasting results from the "Day," such as:

Teaching children and the adults of the need for cooperation in their community, as well as at the state and national levels, in the preservation of wildlife and the beauties and wealth of nature.

Development of guidelines and collection of materials to aid the Bethlehem faculty in directing its own fully self-sufficient workshops.

And while most of the day will be spent in the field, the area business community has contributed resources and materials which will create a total atmosphere from the time participants meet at the school.

Verstandig's Nursery is setting up a natural garden in the Clarksville school entryway; Delmar Lumber is providing an

exhibit of the uses of wood in buildings; and International Paper is providing a display of its use of forest products.

Movies and slides appropriate to the day will be shown and information from the National Wildlife Federation will be available. Wild animals will also be part of the display.

The children are hard at work on such materials as insect nets and baskets for collection of specimens. Ten microscopes from the Senior High will be used for on-the-spot examination of field specimens.

Consultants for the day are:

Outdoor Science: Dr. Donald L. Collins, State Entomologist; Dr. William Isachsen, Research Geologist, State Museum and Science Service; Dr. Eugene Ogden, State Botanist; Dr. Ralph Palmer, ornithologist, State Museum and Science Service and Beverly Waite, author of the newspaper column "On the Wing."

Conservation Education: From the State Conservation Department — Arthur W. Holweg, Supervisor of Game Management; Eli Dietsch, Regional Fishery Manager; Chuck McNulty, Regional Conservation Educator; Victor Schrader, District Forest Ranger; Robert Van Wie, Stream Improvement; and Earl Westervelt, Conservation Education. Frank Leavitt, a Soil Conservationist from the U.S. Soil Conservation Service, will represent the Federal Government.

Directors for the "Day" are Ronald Bover and Mrs. Donald Forsyth of the Clarksville School and Rudi Alec and Miss Sammie Ives of Hamagrael.

Approximately 110 children and 40 parents are expected to participate in the "Day" in a joint sharing of an unique educational experience.

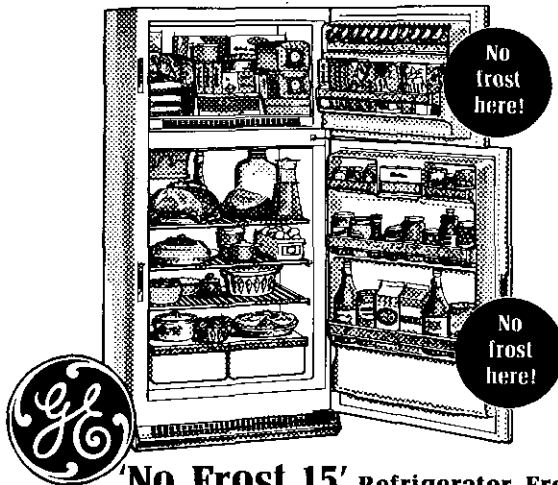

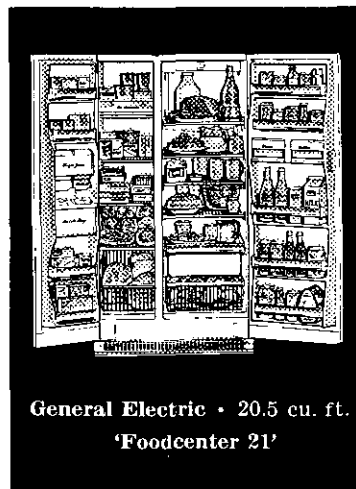

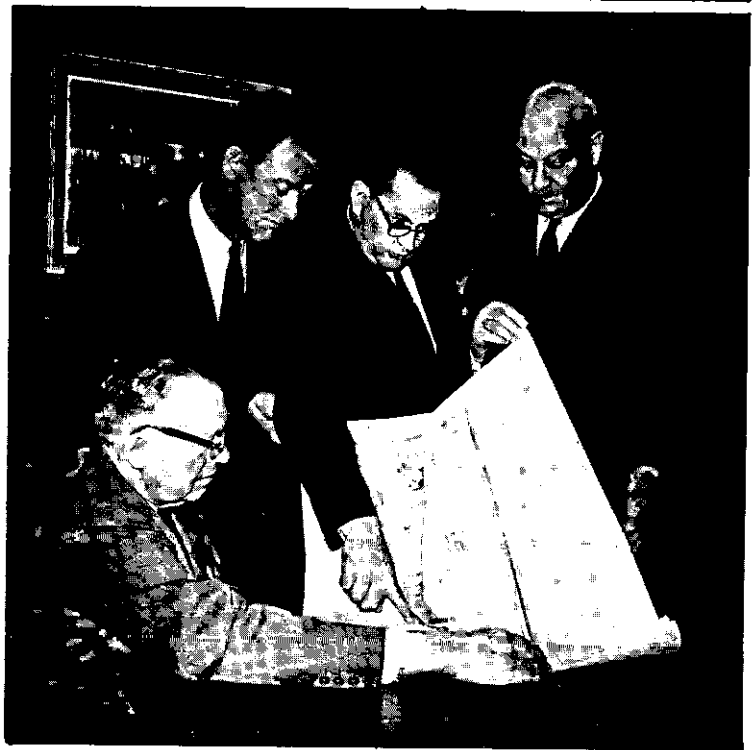

New Plant

A new facility of 65,000 square feet will be built by Killip Laundering and Dry Cleaning Company in the West Albany Industrial Park, it was announced by Richard W. Klemm, President of the 91-year old firm.

Mr. Klemm said that the new plant is located on a six-and-a-half acre plot and will be completed by the last quarter of this year.

The Company is the largest laundry and dry-cleaning company in the Capital District and the largest in central upstate New York.

The firm has always been located at Green and Hamilton Streets in Albany. "With the South Mall projects well under way," Mr. Klemm said, "we chose the Industrial Park because it would be convenient for our customers and to our salesmen who service the Tri-City area. We are convinced that this location will soon become the

nucleus of service companies for the Capital District. We also expect a complete transition in the character of downtown Albany where high-rise apartments will replace industrial plants. Albany will more and more become a governmental, educational, and research center, and we expect our company to grow as the increasing number of professional people want the type and quality of service that we, and other merchants, offer. Our employment growth likewise is projected sharply upward."

Construction of the new building is being done by Modular Structural Systems, Inc., Latham area builders of Butler Pre-engineered Buildings. The facility, with exterior color scheme of blue with white accent, is one-story, with a mezzanine office area. William P. Seduski, President of Modular, said that there is a 60-foot span between columns in the work area, and that the facility is the largest in the country to be designed exclusive-

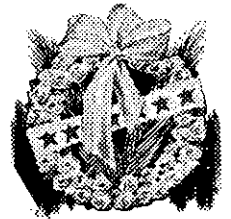

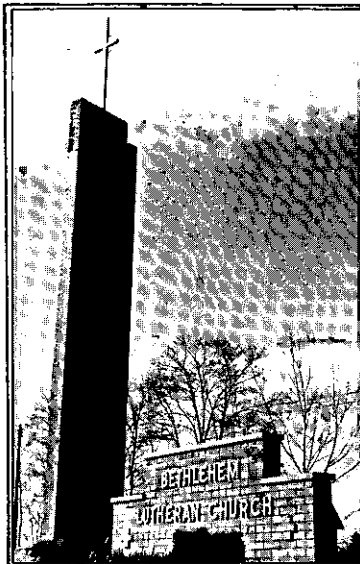

Committee members in charge of tickets are Mrs. Morton, Mrs. Peter P. Baruch and Mrs. Anthony.

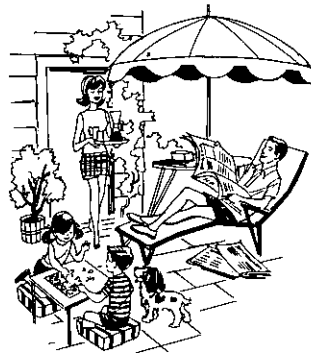
"This is the last chance for Hamagrael P-TA members to get together before the summer recess," Mrs. Giordano said, "and I hope all members will make an effort to attend."

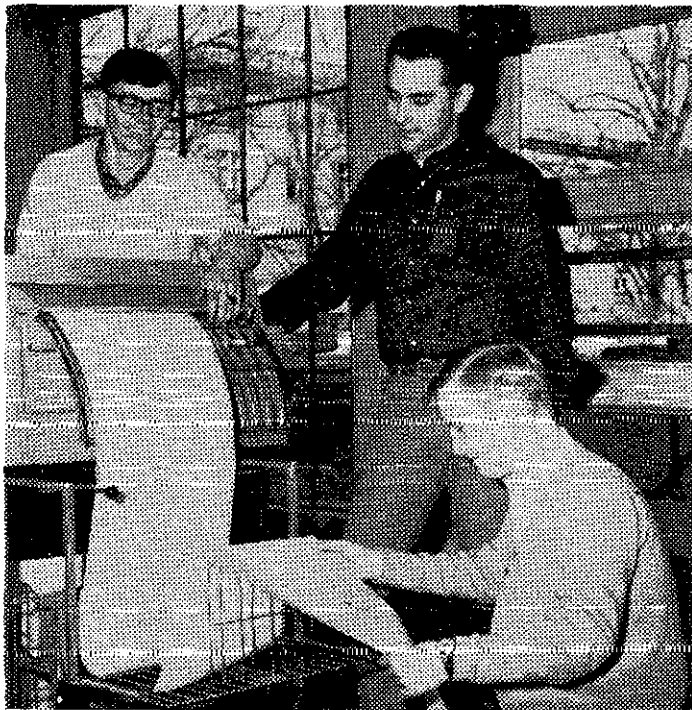
