Bethlehem Grange #137 on Route #396, Selkirk, New York has been in continuous operation for more than ninety-three years and has served its membership and the rural community in many ways. In bygone years it operated a General Store where it bought and sold car loads of coal, flour, fertilizer, all types of farm supplies and household necessities. Its bi-monthly meetings were always occasions for fellowship and "get-togethers" and after the business meetings, educational programs were sponsored after which the ladies enjoyed a good friendly visit and some of the men indulged in Pinochle, Dominoes and Checkers; and good old fashioned Square Dances were enjoyed by all.

Nearly a hundred years of history sees many changes in any organization, community and governments also. Likewise there have been many changes in Bethlehem Grange — the meetings are still held the second and fourth Saturdays at 8 p.m., the ritual is still nearly the same, educational programs are still presented, but the folk are too busy these days to linger long after the meetings to play pinochle; the shopping too has gone to the super market, as there is no longer a need for the store; housewives now buy their flour in 5 lb. bags and not by the barrel, and coal is no longer used for heating fuel.

But one thing that has not changed at Bethlehem Grange is the traditional STRAWBERRY FESTIVAL — HAM SUPPER — BAKE SALE. A delicious Ham dinner is served family style with creamed potatoes and all the extras and at about the point where you wonder how you could possibly eat another mouthful, you are served a generous helping of Home Made Fresh Strawberry Shortcake with whipped cream. This is really a traditional treat, which you are invited to enjoy on Saturday, June 17 at 5:00, 6:00 and 7:30 p.m. The Worthy Master, Winston Raynor has appointed his good wife Helen, who is Secretary of the Grange, as General Chairman of this Annual Strawberry Festival; Mrs. Marilyn Cross will be in charge of the Dining Room and Mrs. Florence Drebner in charge of the bake sale.

Explorations in Drama

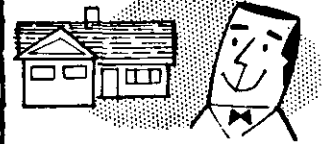

The Foundation Planting

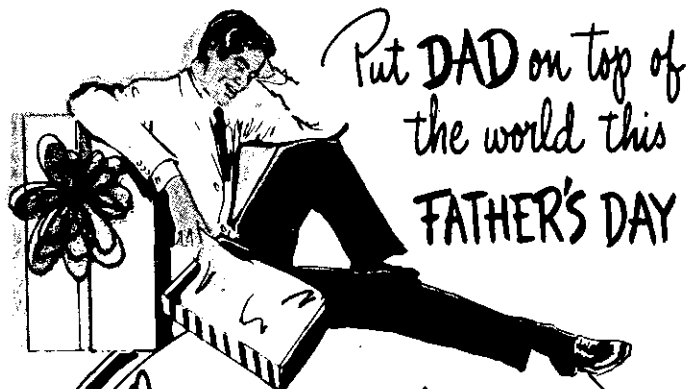
A house must be attractive both inside and out to be a real home. It may be modest and simple, but it must be neat and in good repair. In addition, its external appearance must give the feeling of belonging to its surroundings. Nothing contributes so much to this appearance as appropriate plantings about the foundations.

A house rising directly from the bare ground or even from a good lawn with all the foundation showing is usually unattractive and uninviting. If on the other hand, even an old lilac bush has run wild at one corner of the house, and if but an elderberry

bush and blackberry tangle have clothed another corner, the severe straight lines are softened and the house has a look of belonging in its surroundings. The transformation from a bare and uninviting building to a home-like picture is easily accomplished by appropriate plantings about the foundation.

The most important locations for plant groups are the most prominent points. These are the front corners of the house or of the porch, or a large bare wall unbroken by windows. At these points the largest or most conspicuous plants should be used. Of lesser importance may be the entrance steps or angles in the house, where smaller plants are usually appropriate.

A good general guide for your foundation planting can be reached by drawing two lines, beginning at the middle of your

front doorstep and running one line to each front corner of the house ending at a height half way between the eaves and the ground. You might draw this on a snapshot of the house, or on a line drawing made to the proper scale; or you might anchor a string at the middle of the front doorstep and, angling it upward, attach the ends to the outside corners of the house half way between the eaves and the ground. Your foundation plants, when they are fully grown, should fall within these lines.

If the door is in the center of the house, the lines will be symmetrical; if the door is to the side, one line will rise more steeply to the corner, indicating that taller plants on that side will help to achieve a balanced effect. If you would like your house to appear wider, place plants beyond the corners of the house that will grow to a height within a continuation of your lines from the doorstep.

A few well selected shrubs can help make your house a home that belongs in its surroundings.

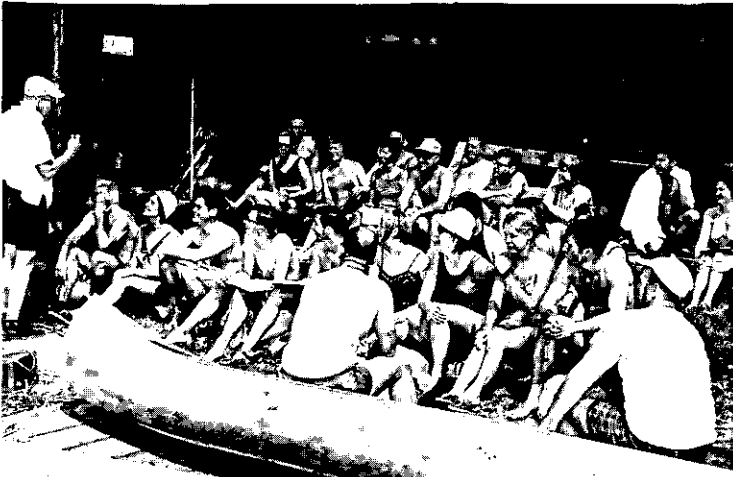

Although most sportsmen are bravely getting into the swing of the fishing season, Conservation Commissioner R. Stewart Kilborne today reminded hunters that the 1967 big game gunning season for deer and bear will start Oct. 25 in the northern zone and Nov. 20 in the southern zone. Both zones will close Dec. 5.

"Inquiries being received by the Department indicate that hunters are already planning their fall trips," the Commissioner said, "and now they can bracket in the dates for taking time-off."

In the northern zone, the archery season will get underway Oct. 11, while in the southern zone archers can go afield Nov. 4. This is a slight change for southern zone archers as a result of legislation enacted this year. In the past, the archery season in the southern zone started two weeks prior to the gunning season but for 1967, bow and arrow devotees will have a 16 day period of "quiet woods" hunting before the shooters take over.

Commissioner Kilborne pointed out that under existing statutes, the regular northern zone gunning season begins Oct. 25 and ends on the first Tuesday in December (Dec. 5, this year) The legal formula for the southern zone provides for the season

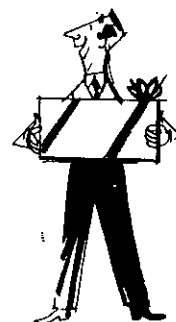
to start on the third Monday in November (Nov. 20, in 1967) and close on the first Tuesday in December to coincide with the end of the northern zone season.

Sportsmen are advised to check the Department's "Hunting-Trapping-Fishing Guide" for specific information about exceptions, exclusions and special regulations. The 1967-68 edition of the "Guide" is expected for

distribution around mid-September.

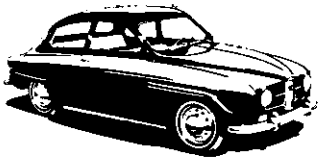
