

The Bethlehem Central Senior High School drama group, Charlatans, is active again this summer. All productions will be presented in an arena theatre with the audience surrounding the stage. In this, its third season, Charlatans' Summer Theatre presents three different shows including a total of four plays.

Tomorrow and Saturday, Thornton Wilder's beloved Pulitzer Prize winner, "Our Town" will be presented in the arena. All twenty-five members of the company have worked feverishly in anticipation of tomorrow's opening night. The play features Herb Mayne as the famous Stage Manager. Having filled the title roles in "Lil' Abner" and "Where's Charlie," Herb feels right at home on stage. Paul Spellman and Nancy Kuivila act as a perfectly matched young couple. You know, just like the one down the street. In supporting roles are Sharon Walworth, Dee Platt, Jon Deily and Cliff Saper. The production is directed by Sydney Turner.

The next show to be presented is another Pulitzer Prize winner. Archibald McLeish's "J.B." will be on stage August 11 and 12 and is being directed by Lolly Geer. Ron Eddo will handle the title role. Charlatans' final production appears on August 18 and 19. It is a combination of two one act plays: "The Lesson" by Eugene Ionesco and "The Zoo Story" by Edward Albee.


Wyman Osterhout and Leighton Hotaling, co-chairmen, say, "Punkintown Fair is the biggest little family fun affair around."



Seventeen area high school


students and seven adult staff members will attend an American Red Cross Youth Leadership Development Center Conference at Manlius Academy, Manlius, New York from August 21 through 25.

In the National Merit Scholarship program, this year's class could not match that of 1965 when 18 pupils became finalists; 7 made it this year, matching last year's performance. But 25 in a smaller class compared to the 26 of 1965 received letters of commendation.

Two-year colleges will get 24 per cent of the graduates. Last year 27 per cent chose two-year institutions.

To College!

Bethlehem Central High School has sent 52 per cent of its 1967 graduates on to four-year colleges.

In 1965, the same percentage went to college but the figure dropped to 47 per cent last year.

Statistics compiled by the high school guidance department show this year's class edged ahead of the stellar 1965 year.


The report shows that 83 per cent of the class of 276 pupils plan to continue their education. This compares to 82 per cent in 1966 and 1965, and 80 per cent in 1964.




