Community Ambassador Report

Marjory Reid is spending the summer in Peru as the Bethlehem Community Ambassador. This is her first report to the community.

Dear Neighbors:

It seems unbelievable but at last I am here in Peru. After two weeks of intensive language training at Putney, Vermont, our group flew to Miami, Florida, for several days of orientation and then on to Lima, Peru. I set foot on Peruvian ground at 9:00 July 1. One member of our group is employed by International Business Machines in Endicott, New York. The IBM representative in Lima had been informed of our arrival. We were met by customs by a large welcoming committee.

From Lima we were driven directly to Huampani, a resort about thirty minutes outside the city. The Experiment planned a three-day stay here to acquaint us more fully with Peruvian customs. We were immediately introduced to the Peruvians' habit of eating four and sometimes five times a day. This custom, of course, had our immediate approval. Peruvians generally have a light continental breakfast of coffee leche and rolls with butter or jam. Coffee leche is made by adding boiled milk to a little less than half a cup of strong coffee. It's very popular here, as in Europe.

The most important meal of the day is served at noon and is referred to as almuerzo. Generallv. a salad is served first, followed by soup, the main course of rice and meat, and then dessert. Lunch is served at 5:00 p.m. This meal is equivalent to our snack, or the Englishman's custom of tea in the late afternoon with cookies or jam and bread. A dinner called the comida is served about 8:00 or 9:00 p.m. It is somewhat lighter than the noon meal. It appears as though our group will be heavier when we return to the United States.

In Huampani it was necessary to accustom ourselves to a change in weather. When we left Miami. the thermometer read in the 80's. When we stepped off the plane in Lima, the reading was in the 40's or 50's. It is midwinter in Peru now. The temperature at Lima is usually about 55 degrees and varies little due to the cooling effect of the Humboldt Current. Peruvian homes are not heated. Consequently, suits and heavy clothing are a necessity. The nights are very cool although mid-day can be hot. We are in the tropical zone and the sun's rays are intense. The outdoor swimming pool at Huampani was in frequent use during the afternoon. I understand that much of Huampani's popularity is due to the fog which hangs over Lima continually during the winter months.

Huampani's sun is a refreshing change for many. We think of Peru as a country with just two social classes. However, there is an emerging middle class. It may be small at this time but it is growing. The resort at Huampani caters to this latter group.

Huampani and Lima lie on the western coast of Peru, which is desert. The few cities along the coast are oases, made by diverting rivers which normally flow east from the Andes.

Recently, we took a bus trip from Lima to Trujillo, via the Pan American highway. Trujillo lies approximately 375 miles north on the coast. It is the fourth largest city in Peru, with a population of 100,000. The bus trip takes ten hours through the desert. At points we travelled close enough to the ocean's edge to see the white caps made by the waves below. By moonlight, it is a beautiful sight. There are steep precipices at points along the highway, and it can be dangerous. We often passed a cross erected beside the road to mark the scene of a tragic accident.

Upon arrival, we met our families. The Experiment was unable to find enough homes for everyone, so two of us in our group are living with Senor and Senora Ganoza. I will probably move to a new family in a day or two. Actually, I'm quite lucky. Now I will have two families in Peru. The Ganozas have five children, ranging in age from 6 years to 8 months. Two servants also live in the household. Together, we form a sizable group. Senor and Senora Ganoza are very warm

Tickets are \$1.00 and are available from any member of the company or at the door performance night (Friday or Saturday). The first play begins at 8:15 p.m.


3rd Evening

So it is with grass seed. By law, each package must state plainly what's inside, and this is the message to look for when you buy grass seed.

True, names like ryegrass, bentgrass, fescue, bluegrass, etc., are less familiar to most of us than, say, almonds, cashews, and peanuts, but here is a simple classification of the kinds of grass seed commonly found in mixtures. It will help you choose the right blend for your lawn. Most of us know the relative difference between fine texture and course texture, and it is in these terms that we classify here the different kinds:

> Fine Textured Bentgrass Kentucky Bluegrass Merion Kent Bluegrass Poa Trivialis Red Foscue Course Textured Alta Tall Fescue

K-31 Fescue Meadow Fescue Annual Ryegrass Perennial Ryegrass Red Top

Generally, the fine textured grasses make the best lawns dense, uniform, long-lasting turf - but they may take longer getting started. The coarse-textured grasses often start quickly but are not suited for regular or close mowing and seldom survive for more than two or three years in a lawn - some even less!
