Marjory Reid is spending the summer in Peru as the Bethlehem Community Ambassador.

Hello,

Just after writing my last letter to you I was informed that I had a new family. I am living with Senor and Senora Harmon in California, a suburb of Trujillo, Peru. My "father" owns and operates a company which manufactures stoves. I have two sisters; Mary Ann, 13, and Theresa who is 20 years old. I also have two brothers, Frederick, 10, and George, 17. Only Mary Ann and Frederick live at home. They are both vivacious and lots of fun to be with. George attends a private boarding school in Chiclayo, about 2 1/2 hours north of Trujillo. He is able to come home for a weekend once every few weeks. I have not yet met Mary Theresa, but hope to soon. She works for Braniff Airlines in Lima, and is quite a traveller. My mother showed me numerous photographs of "Poche" (a family nickname) travelling through Europe and the United States. Poche wrote an excellent cover story for a local newspaper about her adventures abroad. I am truly looking forward to our meeting. Poche is not the sole traveller in my family. Senor and Senora Harmon have travelled extensively throughout Latin America and visited the United States.

Both Frederick and Mary Ann

attend private schools in Trujillo as is customary for many children whose families can afford this type of education. All Peruvian children in both public and private schools wear uniforms. Mary Ann has no problem deciding what to wear for the day. Her particular school has an attractive scotch plaid jumper.

Frederick wears a navy blue suit and tie. Boys and girls attend separate schools. At present, my brother and sister are taking semester examinations. In Peru, the school year is from April to December, with a 15-day mid-year vacation in August.

I am very fortunate to have such a marvelous family. Mary Ann and Frederick are studying English in school which is a great help to me. My mother also speaks some English. If they can't understand my Spanish sometimes they can understand my English. We have developed a new language called Spanglish.

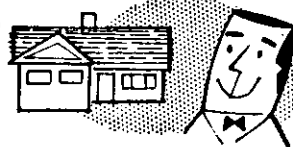
We have a lovely home in a suburb which is relatively new and growing. Iron grillework on the facade of the adobe buildings is very characteristic, but is also a necessity in Latin America to prevent unwarranted entrance. The interior of my family's home is very much like that of a home in Delmar. We have all the conveniences; refrigeration, television, phonograph and hot

water. Hot water is quite a luxury as many homes do not have it. My home is not heated, as is the case with all homes here. It seldom gets so cold in Trujillo as to be unpleasant. The Harmons are now building a new home two blocks away which will be lovely.

My mother and father each has a car, so my mother has been able to show me much of Trujillo and its surroundings. If I want to go into Trujillo I can also take one of the many buses which pass a few blocks from our home. The bus costs one sol, or less than 4¢. Transportation is very inexpensive. The bus ride is an experience in itself. Many buses are very old and seem to run with a prayer and a bit of luck. It is possible to meet quite a variety of passengers. They may be carrying anything from a can of gasoline to a live chicken.

We have taken innumerable excursions. Last week we attended the Russian ballet which is presently on tour in Latin America, and also the Swan Lake ballet, presented by the French Institute in Trujillo. Last night we attended a delightful piano and choral concert. There seems to be no lack of cultural events in Trujillo.

Trujillo is also noted for its beautiful women and after attending last night's concert I must agree. Hairdos are often elaborate. Ready made clothing in Peru, as in most Latin America, is extremely expensive. Therefore, my mother and sister have most of their clothes made,

or have purchased them on visits to the United States. Styles are in vogue with the current fashion and hemlines are at the knee or slightly above.

The American group, with our families, has made several trips to Chan Chan, an American owned sugar cane hacienda, several colonial homes and museums in Trujillo. We also toured a brewery which produces a very popular Peruvian beer. The highlight of this tour came when we were allowed to sample the product, along with peanuts and an interesting chip which turned out to be fried pig skin.

I can't begin to describe the warm hospitality of the Peruvians.

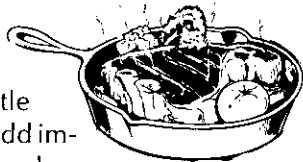

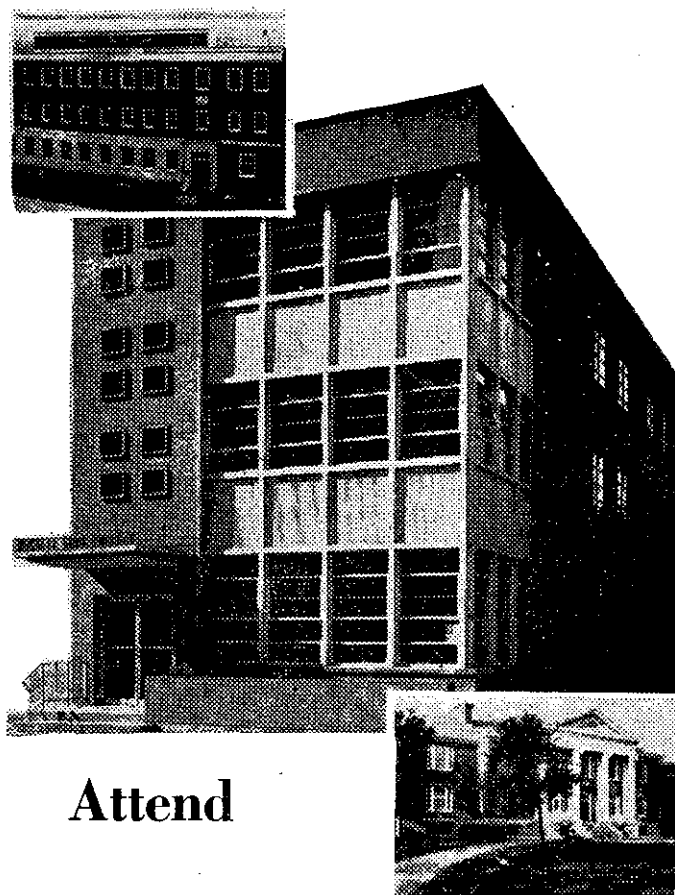

**R-C-S to Open
September 7**



The graduate level cooperative program in history with Siena College will be continued. Under this program graduate students may take up to 12 credit hours in the cooperating institution.



best seed may fail under adverse conditions, if not properly planted and cared for. Last week we considered the choice of the best lawn seed. This week we are concerned with WHEN to plant it.

In Spring, the impulse to plant

is almost irresistible and that is the time when most of us think about seeding and repairing our lawns. Under normal conditions, with an adequate mixture of moisture and sunlight, Spring-time seeding will usually succeed

if you start early enough to permit the young plants to become established before the onslaught of the summer sun, weeds and crabgrass.

But how many Spring seasons are ever really "normal?" Some-

thing unexpected is almost always happening — several weeks of cold, wet weather (like last Spring), when nothing seems to grow, or a prolonged dry spell, like the Spring of 1966.

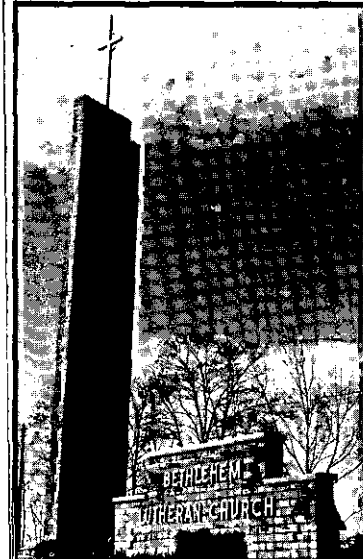

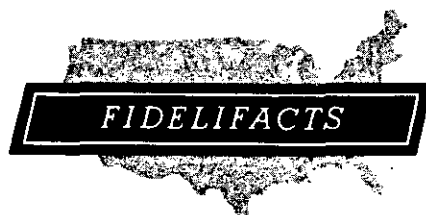
