Lighting will be under the direction of Don Forsyth, assisted by Ted Lefton. William Bubb will be in charge of sound effects. Donna Bardwell will head the

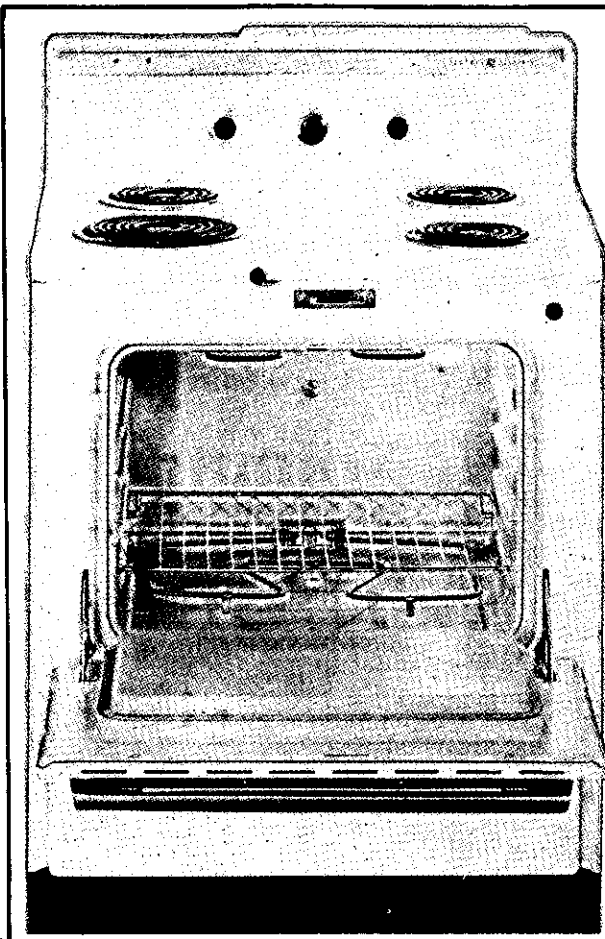
