"The Devil has stolen from us . . . Christmas, the day of our spiritual redemption, and converted it into a day of worldly festivity, shooting and swearing." So wrote Bishop Chase of Ohio to his wife in 1827.

How can we best keep Christmas? By renewing within us the radiance of the inner meaning of the season in a little town called Bethlehem, in our own day and area where groups of citizens with faith in mankind are now working to celebrate the 26th anniversary of the White Christmas Festival.

The idea of this festival began 26 years ago in the Town of Bethlehem when Mrs. Sydney L. Smith and Mr. Roland Truitt felt that a program should be instituted whereby the town citizens could share time, talent and worldly goods to keep alive the true spirit of Christmas, that of caring and sharing for those in the area who are in need. A clothes closet where needy persons may find extra wearing apparel is open all year. There is a special emergency fund for use in providing necessities for school children (such as glasses, special medical care, etc.) Food baskets are provided at holiday time and a huge toy supply is available for the less fortunate children

and shut-ins are remembered throughout the year.

All citizens are urged to share in the joy of this Christmas festival and to be present when the curtain goes up at the Bethlehem Central Sr. High School at one of the three performances on December 14, 15 and 16. The Theme this year, "Light From Bethlehem," tell how three great lives were affected by the wondrous light that came from the East and how these people dedicated themselves to the ideals of Peace, Brotherhood and Goodwill. There is no admission charge, donations made during the collection enable the Town to care for the needy all year round.

themselves "The All Bethlehem Citizens Committee for Equitable Assessments," charge that they are being victimized by the town's assessment policy and demand, therefore, a town-wide re-assessment for the purpose of raising assessments on homes of the long-time residents and shifting to them a greater share of the tax burden. There are a few facts of town history that the spokesman for the committee has overlooked.

Shortly after World War I, during the twenties and early thirties, there was an influx of new residents in Bethlehem, principally in Delmar and Elsmere, which necessitated new and larger school buildings in both hamlets, an enlarged water source, and a completely new and enlarged water distribution system.

The homes purchased by us newcomers of those years were assessed on the basis of the then current market values, and our assessments were around twice those on comparable properties of older residents who had purchased before the war when building costs were only half as much. We newcomers were aware of the town's assessment policy and considered it fair enough since it was we who created the need for new and larger

school and water facilities, and additional public services. We wanted to enjoy the advantages, pleasure, and satisfaction of residing in the Tri-Village area and were willing and happy to pay for it.

We, who were the newcomers of the twenties and thirties, are now the long-time residents of the sixties. Up to the late forties we were sitting pretty, with adequate, first-rate school, water, and sewer facilities and other public services. Then came the great influx of new residents in the fifties and sixties, necessitating a mammoth new water storage basin in the Heldebergs, a multi-million dollar senior high school, more elementary schools, additions to the older elementary schools and the junior high school, and so on.

Through the increased tax rates, which have more than doubled over the past seventeen years, we long-time residents are already making a substantial contribution toward the cost of these additional facilities necessitated by the influx of new residents, and are paying more taxes than we would be paying if the new residents had not moved it. Yet these recent house purchases, through their committee spokesman, charge that they are being victimized. Clearly, they are not being victimized at all. In fact, their position is quite the opposite.

New residents have always been welcome in Bethlehem. Those who are now protesting the town's assessment policy are

all wonderfully fine people, undoubtedly motivated by the best of intentions when they say that all they want is equitable assessments. The town's assessment policy is already equitable. What these good people really are demanding, wittingly or unwittingly, is the right to enjoy the advantages, pleasure, and satisfaction of living in Bethlehem at a still greater expense to the longer-term residents.



## Board Examines Building Needs

The pupil population upsurge makes it urgent that Bethlehem Central School District's budget advisory committee produce recommendations on new schools and additions, a board member declared recently.

John Clyne said the school district probably is "a year behind" in meeting building needs since it "bogged down on the high school addition" issue. Mr. Clyne made his remarks during board meeting with the citizens budget advisory committee's steering committee.

Some redistricting will have to take place to keep classes the desired size, Superintendent Richard Moomaw said. The facilities subcommittee will recommend the possibility of temporary facilities. The population forecasting committee will project enrollment figures. A school facility committee will make its recommendations related to pupil housing needs.

Dr. Moomaw reported that

there are a few classes in the district now with 20 to 35 pupils and next year the enrollment might push them to 35 to 40 pupils.

School population forecasts made for the 1967-68 term all underestimated the pupil load in kindergarten through sixth grade levels. Herbert Stander said. Actual enrollment was 133 pupils more than predicted by the 1965 committee, Engelhardt report and Dr. Moomaw.

## Turkey Story

This Thanksgiving there are more turkeys than ever before. The turkey crop topped the 125 million mark this year, up nine million from last year. This a record crop, according to a Cornell specialist.

Prof. Glenn H. Thacker, poultry scientist, at the N.Y. State College of Agriculture, Cornell, predicted that about half of the crop will be consumed during the Thanksgiving and Christmas

season.


About 25 per cent will go into further processing for soup, pies, and meat rolls. Another 25 per cent will form the frozen turkey supply.

"The bumper crop has created a genuine turkey surplus, not just a weakening of the market," Thacker said. The surplus has led to lower prices for turkey producers. Last year the price was 22 cents per pound. This year it is about 19 cents.

The more than 400 million

pounds of turkey in storage is the highest surplus on record.

The increase in production is, primarily, because farmers have learned to produce larger flocks



more economically, Thacker explained. An increasing percentage of gobblers are raised in confinement in a carefully controlled environment.

High production has been accomplished by increased consumption of turkey. "Thirty years ago each American ate





about two pounds of turkey a year. Now we eat about nine pounds each," Thacker says. "One reason for this is the affluent society. We eat more high protein foods in general."

Also, attractive supermarket prices have made turkey more acceptable the year around, he said. Ten years ago 80 per cent of the crop was consumed during Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays.

Most turkeys are raised in Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, and California. The title of the largest producer alternates between Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, and California. The title of the largest producer alternates between Minnesota and California. New York State produces less than half a million turkeys a year.

Most New York birds are specialty birds - fresh-dressed turkeys sold in medium-sized supermarkets.

The average dressed turkey weighs 18 pounds. Toms average over 20 pounds. Hens weighing eight to 16 pounds and smaller toms are used for household cooking while very large birds are used in institutions. Besides roasters, the most popular form of turkey is the all-meat roll.
