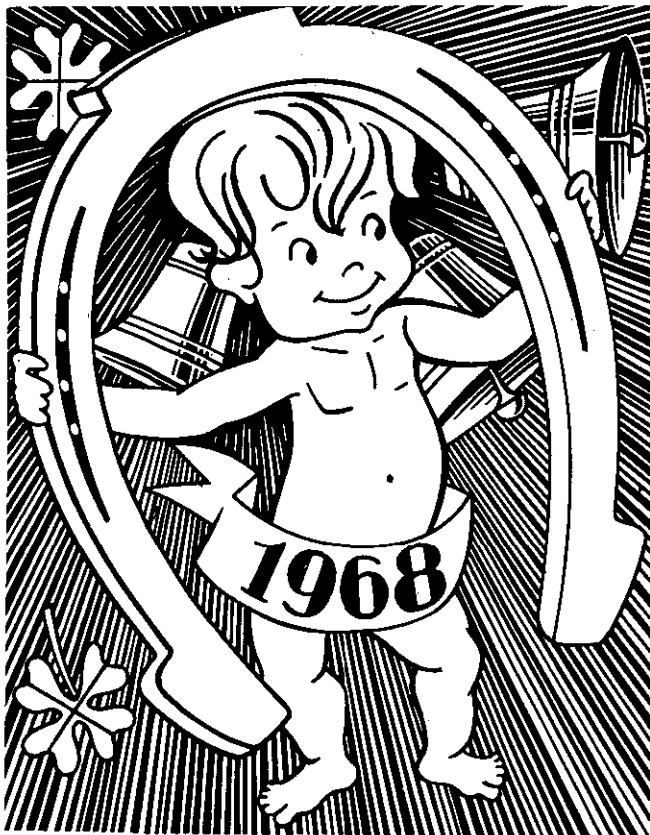
A Reminder

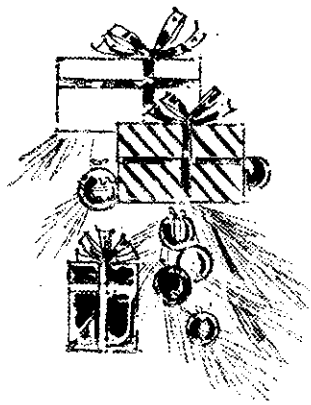

On Sunday, December 31, at the morning worship services of the First Methodist Church, Voorheesville, recognition will be given to college students home for the holidays.

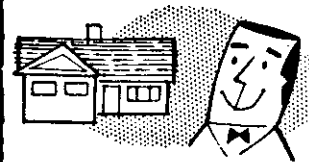

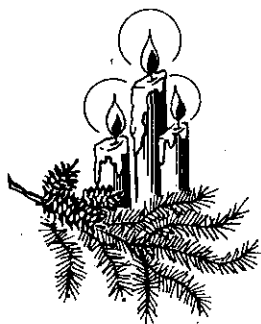

Mousetrap

The Mousetrap, record-smashing mystery play by the celebrated Agatha Christie, is the next production of the Slingerlands Community Players, who have just completed negotiations with Samuel French, Inc., of New York for local presentation. The play has been scheduled for the 19th and 20th of January.

Although Agatha Christie is the author of many other hits, including the famous "Witness For The Prosecution," "The Mousetrap" stands as her most successful to date. Having already smashed the all-time long run record for the English Stage; set in the early years of the century by the musical "Ce Chin Chow", with a run of 2,238 performances. "The Mousetrap" has now beaten the American record of 3,224 performances held by "Life with Father." Miss Christie's mystery chiller opened in London in November, 1952, and is still running there, apparently set, like the babbling brook, to go on forever.

Harlan Wilbert will be seen as the Detective, Inspector Trot-

ter, a part which Richard Attenborough created in the Original London Production and which made him one of the foremost stars of the English Stage.

The Players are pleased to announce that the rest of the cast includes many local actors and actresses that would be a welcome addition to any play: Dick Walsh as Giles; Tobey Thayer as Miss Casewell; Charles Losacca as Major Medcalfe; Gail Hatch as Mrs. Boyle; Gino Farinnacci as Paracicini; Peter Herron as Christopher; Gail Gilbert as Molly.

The Production will be directed by Richard Weeks.

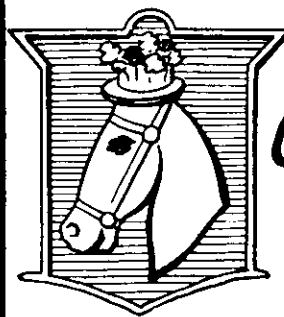
Dance

dro-carbon raw materials in addition to its crude-oil and natural-gas reserves.

Humble also said it expects to become a supplier of coal to industrial consumers.

M.A. Wright, the company's board chairman, said Humble has to date invested \$20 million in the new venture - for coal reserves, research and staff. The company's coal-program expenditures, he said, are currently about \$12 million per year.

Demand for petroleum to meet much of the country's energy requirements will continue to grow from the current level of about 12 million barrels daily, according to Humble's chairman.

Supplemental sources of hydro-carbon raw materials will be needed at some time in the future and, in consideration of this long-range need, Humble has had other energy sources than oil and gas under consideration for some time, he said.

Humble believes, said Mr. Wright, that coal "can and will play a significant role" in meeting these future energy requirements, not only as a direct fuel but also as a source of raw materials for synthesis of liquid products.

"We are convinced," he said, "That the acquisition of coal reserves is an important strategic

step for Humble at this time."

The company said it holds title to coal deposits in Illinois, Wyoming, Montana, Colorado and North Dakota. The extent of its mineable reserves of coal has yet to be fully determined, Humble said.

A Coal and Shale Oil Department was recently established by Humble to acquire resources, investigate, study, experiment and recommend uses of fossil fuels other than crude oil and natural gas.

Along with these activities, Humble's principal research affiliate has accelerated its program for examining the processes by which synthesis liquids - gasoline and other products - can best be obtained from coal.

"While it has long been technically possible to make gasoline from non-petroleum sources such as coal and shale, no truly economic means of doing so now exists," said Mr. Wright.

The coal activities of Humble's research affiliate are being conducted by a newly formed Synthetic Fuels Research Department which includes both experimental and engineering design work.

Pilot-plant facilities located at Baytown, Texas, are designed to demonstrate an improved liquefaction process now being developed. Engineers at Florham Park, New Jersey, will work closely with the Baytown groups in translating research data into designs for commercial-size equipment.

Development of a commercially feasible plant to convert coal into liquid hydrocarbons may be possible within the next decade
