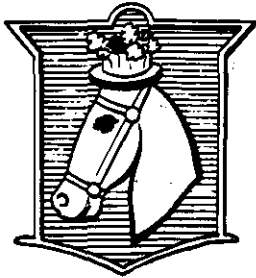

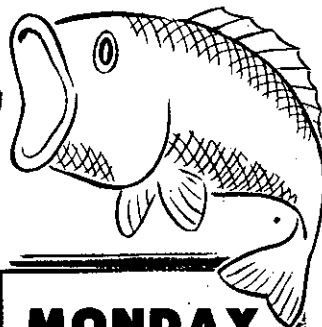
The open house is planned for April 4 at 7:30 P.M. at the Na-

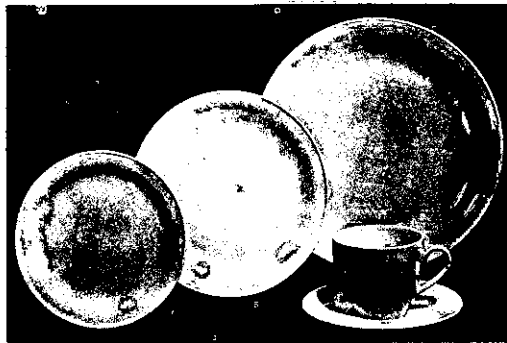

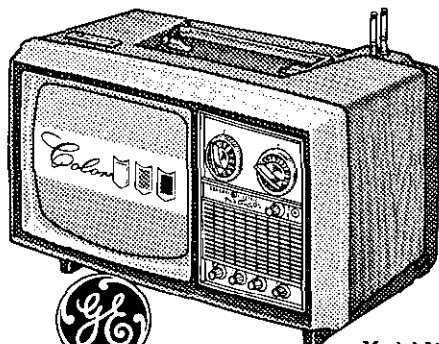

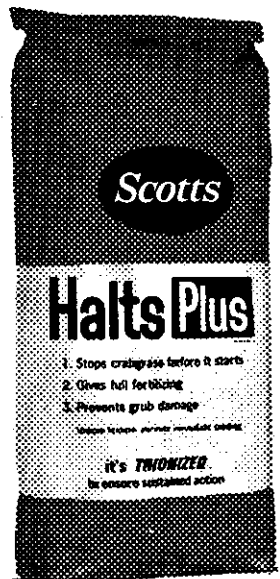

Four Bethlehem Central Senior High School shorthand students earned awards during February for their speed in taking dictation.

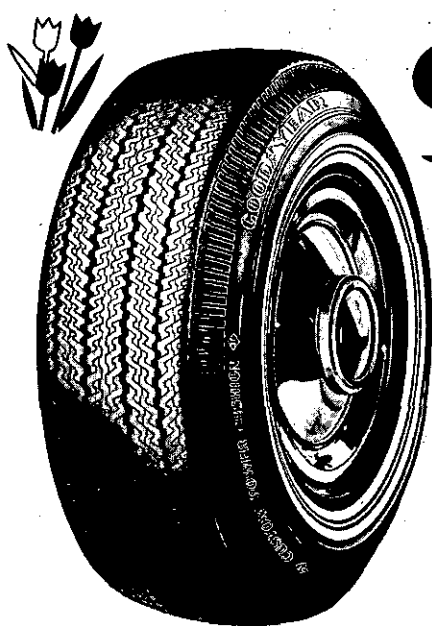
