At ages of three or four they were content with a quarter each, now with the passage of time to ages of thirteen and twenty, they have responded to the current inflationary philosophy that has been implanted in the young."

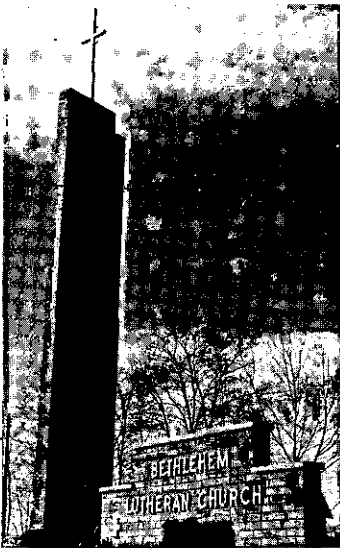
First Church of Christ, Scientist

The Belgians are pleased to let you know that they drink more beer than anyone else and have the strongest digestions in the

world. Although there is much competition from other drinks, they are faithful to their beer.

In addition to the beer haven already mentioned, the Belgian's delight in telling you that they have the finest restaurants in the world. Top Brussels restaurants include: l'Ancienne Barriere, Le Thermidor, Le Cygne, Le Carlton, l'Epaule de Mouton and dozens of others. These compare quite favorably with the best found on the Continent.

If you speak with a local Belgian - one with an expense account preferably - you are sure to be told that the best food in town is in the private club. How do you get into a private club? Easy. Almost everyone belongs to a "private club" and it's no problem to get someone to take you as a guest.

The private clubs exist, not because of snobbery, but because of the drinking laws. There are certain restrictions on drinking hard liquor, but not on their mainstay - beer. This, no doubt, is to protest their economic situation. The private clubs are moderate-sized, not too expensive and pride themselves on their food and service.

colorfully-dressed service people.

Other than the top restaurants and private clubs, the streets are literally full of places to eat, from the barrows selling perfectly browned chips, bought by the bag and dunked in a dollop of mayonnaise between bites, and the carts of snails, and oysters, and sweet waffles. There are shops that sell cheese and sausage. Snack bars feature ham

smoked with Juniper, barbecued chickens and soup.

"Chicoree de Bruxelles," which Americans insist on calling endive, is served in every manner possible. But always with sugar to remove the bitter taste. It is particularly delightful when stuffed with ground meat, or with ham and white cheese sauce, or breaded and then browned lightly in the oven with a slice of ham and more cheese sauce.

"Choesels au madiere" is a stew of oxtail and other meats simmered and then cleared, then simmered covered in beer, after which tiny balls of meat and plenty of mushrooms are added, the sauce being finally smoothed with Madeira until it glistens, or "blinks," to use the Brussels term.

This conference will be the last in a series of three held at R-C-S this school year. The November conference dealt with two topics, creative teaching and the humanities. The February meeting examined problems and possibilities in developing a sequential curriculum.

This marks the first time in this area that blood donor recruitment has been sanctioned as a formal, accredited activity of the scouting movement. Scouts who recruit five or more donors

will receive an achievement badge, and there will be a special award to scout troops in which at least 75 per cent of the members enlist donors.

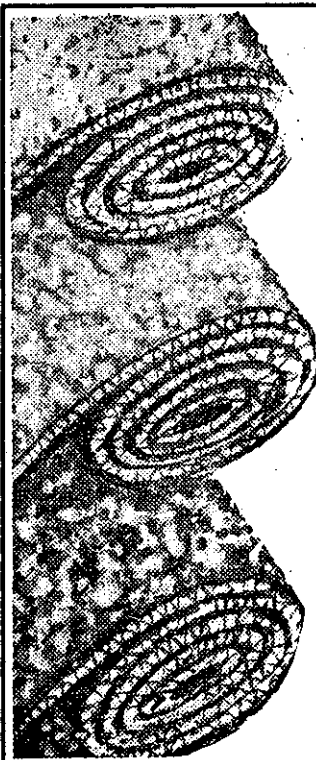

Prof. Robert G. Mower of the New York State College of Agriculture, Cornell, reported that most of the common varieties of forsythia in college test gardens will not bloom this year. The buds were killed in January by temperatures colder than 15 degrees below zero.

According to Mower, the only forsythia likely to be in bloom in New York State by the end of April is a Korean variety, "ovata." This hardy plant will withstand temperatures colder than 20 degrees below zero. The buds of other forsythia varieties such as "Beatrix Farrand," "Karl Sax", and "Spring Glory" are more easily frozen.

Forsythia in parts of New York State where temperatures fall below 15 degrees will probably be affected, Mower said. Exceptions may be Long Island and Buffalo, where the temperatures are modified by large bodies of water.

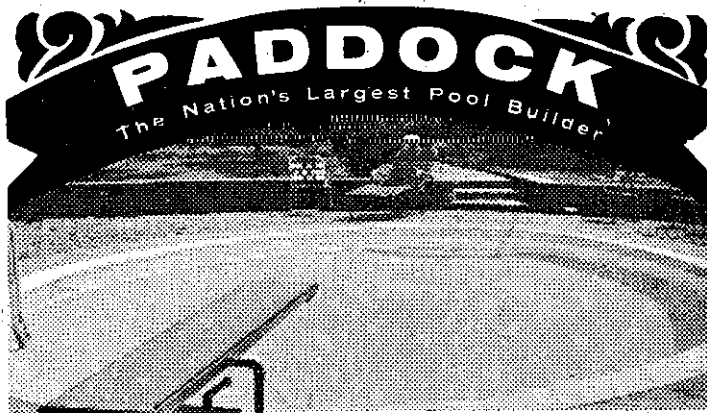

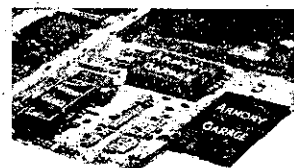

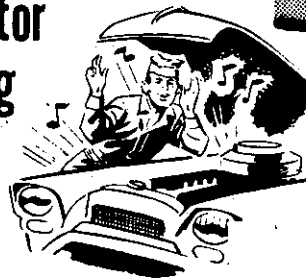
