Robert K. Oliver has recently been chosen by the South Colonie Teachers Association as the district's candidate for the New York State Teachers Association's Outstanding High School Teacher Award.

Mr. Oliver joined the Colonie system in 1951 after receiving an A.B. Degree in Philosophy and a B.S. Degree in Music Education from Hartwick College in Oneonta, New York. Since joining the Col-

onie faculty Mr. Oliver has been very active in not only the music program but the athletic program as well. He has been assistant coach in Freshman Football, and sprint coach for the Varsity Track team. He was also coach of the first Freshman Basketball team, and served as official timer for the Varsity Basketball team for over ten years. In the spring of 1952 Mr. Oliver founded the Varsity Letterman's Club.

In 1951 Mr. Oliver formed the first mixed choral group of about 70 voices. Since that time he has developed some of the outstanding high school choral groups in the state. In 1964 Colonie Central High School entered four major choral organizations in the State Competition Festival in Grade VI Music (the most difficult): a Concert Choir of 190 voices; a Select Choir of 110 voices; a Girls' Choir of 65 voices and a Boys' Choir, "The King's Men," of 70 voices. All four groups received A ratings. It was the first time in the 25-year history of the N.Y.S.S.M.A. Competition Festival that four major choral organizations from the same school received A Ratings in Grade VI music. The King's Men have been described as the outstanding High School Boys' Choir in the East. This group has performed at many state conventions in Albany, Syracuse and Rochester as well as at the New York State World's Fair. The Select Choir has made many public appearances including the New York State World's Fair and EXPO '67.

Mr. Oliver has also been very active in professional organizations. He is past president of the Epsilon Pi Chapter of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia of America, the national honorary music fraternity. He was a member and secretary of the First Supervisory District Teachers' Association. He is a member and Past County President of N.Y.S.S.M.A. He is also an accredited choral adjudicator for the State Association. He was a member and Past Vice-President of the Albany County Music Teachers Association. He is a member and Past Chairman of Vocal Music for the Suburban Council Music Teachers Association. Mr. Oliver is also a member and past Zone Chairman of the American Choral Directors' Association.

He has been guest speaker and panelist at the Zone teachers Conventions in Albany and the N.Y.S.S.M.A. Convention at Syracuse.

He has been guest conductor at many county choral festivals throughout the state and will be conducting the Fulton County High School Festival Choir the 26th and 27th of this month. He was also invited to conduct the Mendelssohn Club of Albany in its annual Christmas Concert this past December.

Mr. Oliver resides with his wife, Joanne, at 22 Brockley Drive, Delmar. He is a graduate of Bethlehem Central School System and is an active member of St. Stephen's church and the Bethlehem Lions Club. He is Past Commander of Bethlehem Memorial Post, No. 3185, Veterans of Foreign Wars and is a member of the Blanchard Post, No. 1040 of the American Legion. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles A. At Meeting

The Town Hall in Voorheesville again was the scene of activity when the Village Board of Trustees met to hear the petition of the residents of Kling Terrace for an upgrading of that tract from B to A zoning on Tuesday evening, April 9.

The petition attempts to prohibit the building of multiple unit dwellings in an area which has hitherto been occupied by only one family homes. It has long

been felt that the terrain of this area is not conducive to septic tank sewage systems for more than one family dwellings. It was pointed out to the Board, that during the month of March, the new unit under construction had considerable cellar flooding and that much of the fill had washed on to other property, to the detriment of existing lawns.

Expansion

The estimated \$8 million sewer system proposed for the Town of Bethlehem would service 80 per cent of the Town's population.

Works George Hotaling said there are 9 1/2 miles of streets in the village. He said a new street cleaner would cost \$16,000 and a good used one would cost about \$8,000.

Mayor Robert Bailey pointed out although the county currently performed some maintenance work on Voorheesville Avenue and Main Street, it was really the responsibility of the village and the county could drop it in the village's lap at any time.

The mayor also explained that the sweeper could be used for snow removal. He said the machine would not permit the village to eliminate its snow removal contract, but could cut the cost of the snow removal service considerably.

The proposed budget calls for an increase of about \$13,000 in the areas of street cleaning, maintenance and snow removal. Most of the total bill would be used for equipment purchases.

The additional \$5,000 appropriation for street maintenance would be used to purchase a truck and to rebuild the Pine Street Bridge, Mayor Bailey said.

The mayor added that, with the additional equipment, "it is hoped the village could initiate some sort of refuse and leaf collection to supplement the village garbage collection."

An estimated \$17,000 of the proposed budget increase is to be used toward paying for the new fire hall and firefighting equipment.

Army Commendation Medal, the Purple Heart, 35 Air Medals, the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry and has two other awards pending. He fought in the battles of Duc Hoa and Dong Xoai, for which his unit was awarded Presidential Unit Citations. Capt. Young is a graduate of Louisiana State University and is listed in "Outstanding Young Men of America."

The AH-IG attack helicopter

is carving new pages in the annals of combat aviation history. The tandem seat aircraft carries a crew of two and is capable of speeds of over 200 miles-per-hour. Revolutionary in design, it has both a conventional rotor system and stubby fixed wings, and it is the world's first true attack helicopter. It is capable of carrying up to 76 air to ground rockets and 11,000 rounds of machine gun ammunition. Its slim fighter-plane-like body and built in armor plating gives the aircraft a degree of protection never before possible in helicopters.

As the Operations Officer of his company, Young is responsible for the planning and scheduling of all missions flown by the unit, which presently operates in the fertile Mekong Delta of South Vietnam.

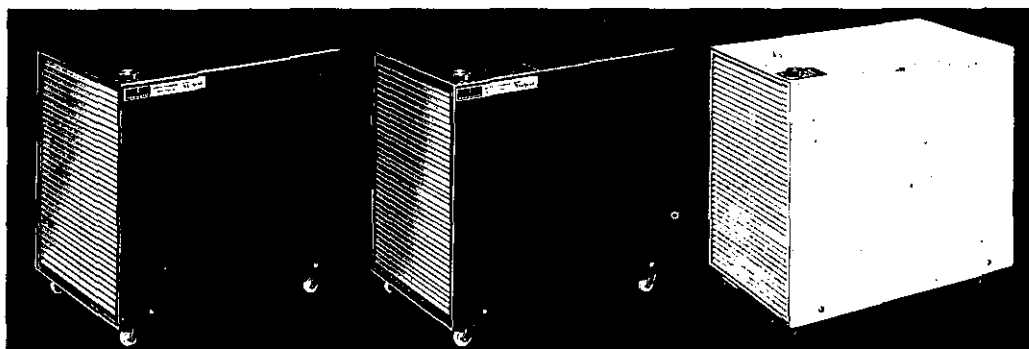

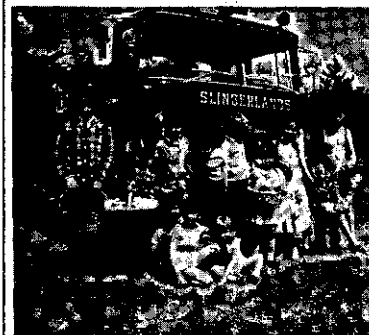

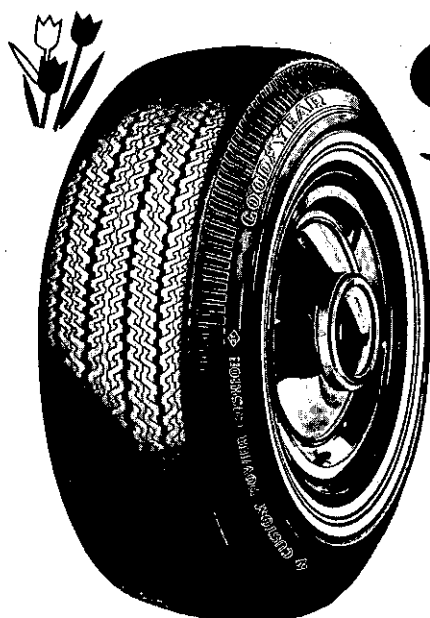
Cited

Reading Course

Bravo for M.D.F.'s letter about the need of a traffic light at the intersection of Kenwood and Elsmere! It is an observation that should have been made years ago.

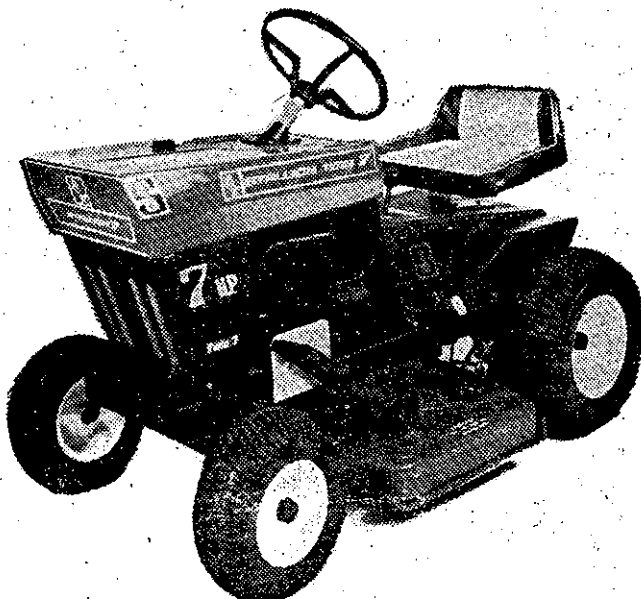
Only last week I watched some six cars try to negotiate the intersection from all four corners at the same time. It was a wonder that there was no collision. Although there is a stop sign on

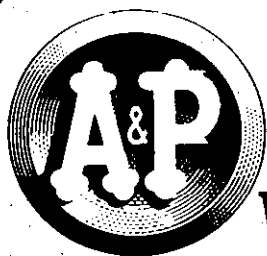

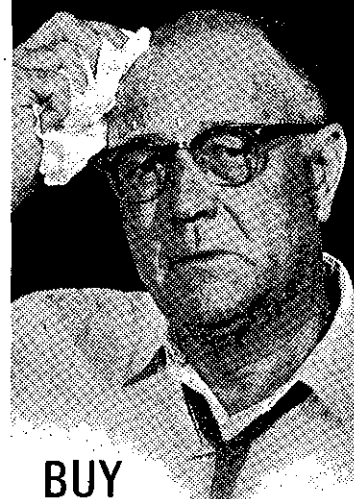

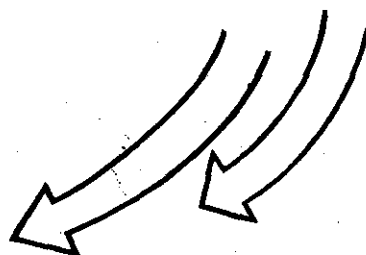

Audio-Visual

In a relatively few years we have gone from scarcity to a wealth of audio-visual materials. As a result of this change, a director of educational communications is needed in most schools today, according to Lee E. Campion, keynote speaker at the all-day conference on "Technology in Education" held April 11, at Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Junior-Senior High School.

Mr. Campion, director of the Division of Educational Communications, New York State Education Department, spoke to about 160 teachers and administrators of the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk School District. Using slides and film clips to illustrate and emphasize his remarks, he told the educators that teachers must carry on a continuous evaluation of films, film loops, film strips, records, overhead transparencies and other educational

media to help the communications director in the selection of materials for the school. Audio-visual materials are not just aids, the speaker said, they should be an integral part of the educational program.

Following the main address, four members of Mr. Campion's staff gave illustrated talks on various aspects of educational media. The topics included educational television, instructional materials centers, regional centers such as Boards of Cooperative Educational Services, and use of media in the classroom.

One of the interesting presentations of the afternoon session was a multi-media demonstration in which a movie projector with sound and two automatic slide projectors threw synchronized pictures on three screens at the same time. Also shown during the afternoon were video shots of R-C-S students and teachers taken in the gym, laboratory, and classrooms two days earlier. The small television camera and microphone system is made for educational use and a number of schools in the state are using video-tape systems to record programs from regular TV stations for later use in the class-

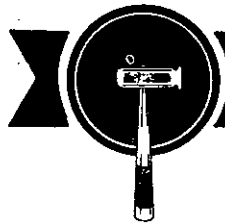

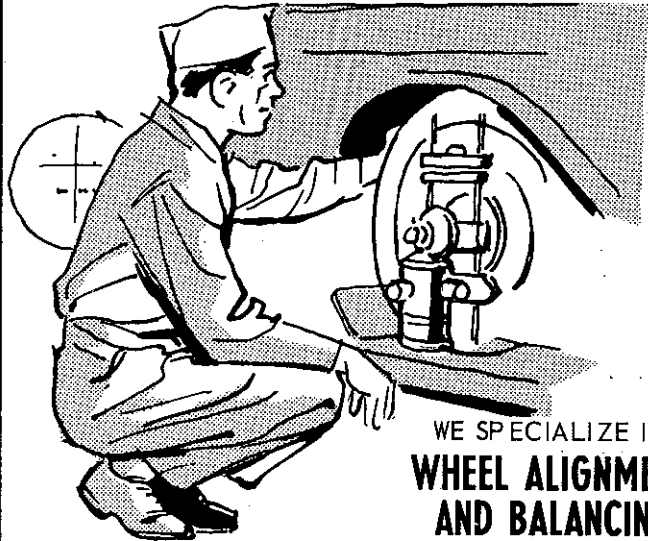

June brides who are busy shopping for cookware should remember to select a pan for its intended use. For example, a pan used to cook sauces and puddings should conduct heat very evenly and not scorch foods. Some metals are better heat conductors than others so pans should be chosen accordingly. Colorful and attractive pans may not necessarily be the best choice, when performance is checked.

Aluminum, stainless steel,

cast iron and porcelain pans will be highlighted along with suggestions for caring for various metals.

Vegetable Gardening

Many people are now planning and getting a start on their vegetable gardens. We don't always have a big choice of where to put a vegetable garden, but fortunately a garden will grow wherever weeds will grow. If possible, avoid steep slopes, stoney soil and areas that are low and wet. A loamy soil is best, but heavier or sandier soils may be used. The heavy clays and the sandy soils can both be improved by adding organic matter such as farm manure, compost, peat moss, etc.

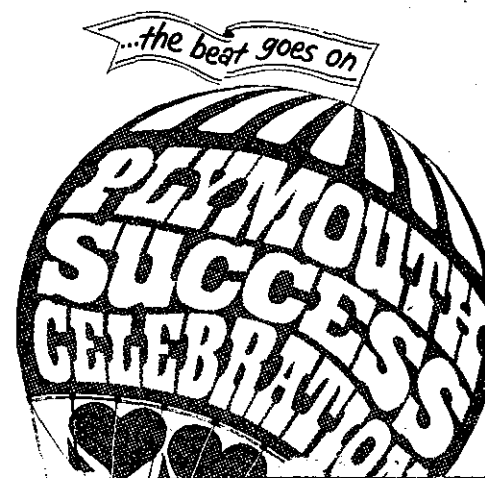

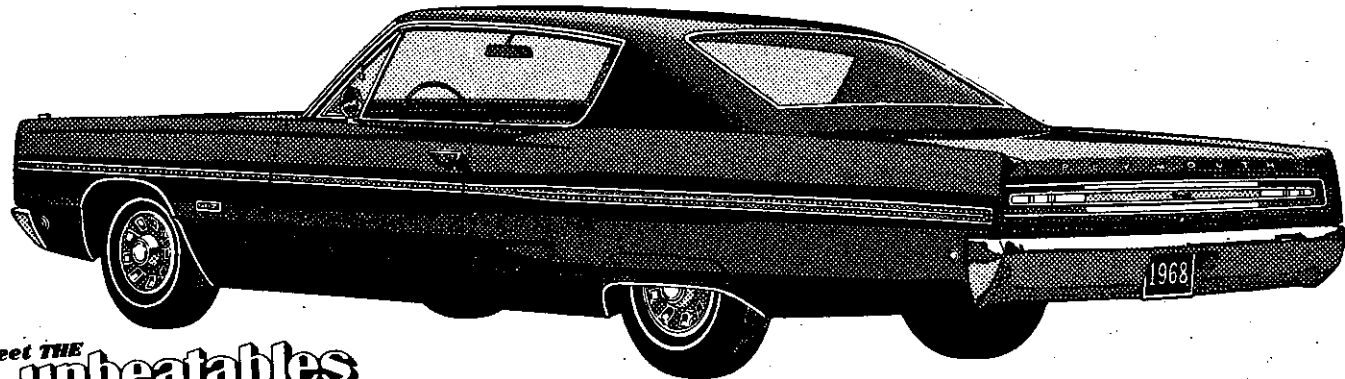

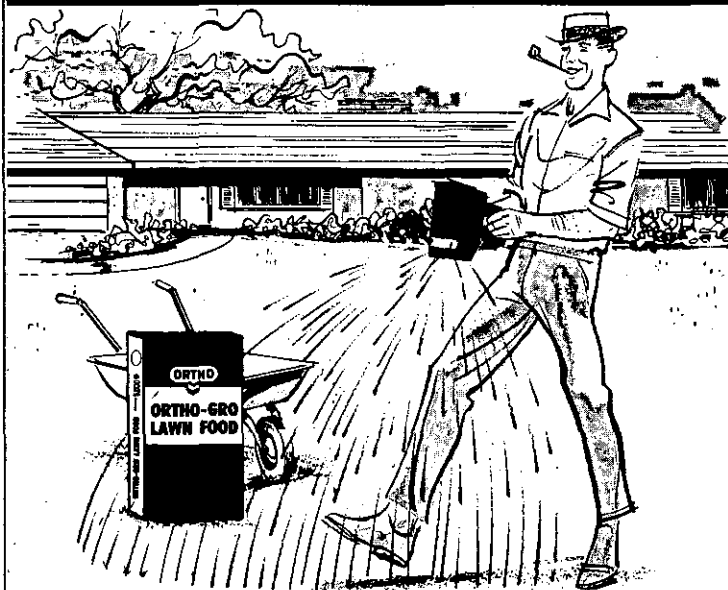

a minimum of 5-6 hours of full sunlight in the middle of the day. If there is a choice, put the root crops, tomatoes, corn, potatoes, cucumbers, and melons in as full sunlight as possible. Broccoli, snap beans, cabbage and the leafy crops can tolerate some shade.

Before you dig your garden, it is advisable to have your soil tested for lime needs. Many soils in Albany County are too acid for most vegetables. However, the only way to determine whether or not you need to add lime and how much lime is needed, is to have your soil tested. This can be done in a few minutes at the Extension office or at most garden centers. If you do need lime, apply half of it before you spade the garden and rake the remaining half in after spading.

A complete fertilizer is needed annually in most gardens. Two or three pounds of a 10-10-10, 12-12-12, or 5 pounds of a 5-10-5 for each 100 square feet of garden should be enough. Most of this can be worked into the soil before planting. Part of the fertilizer can be applied in a trench three inches to the side of the row and at least 2 inches below the seeds or plants. This puts a supply of nutrients close to the young plant. If you use manure, use one bushel of manure for each 50-75 square feet of garden and spread one pound of superphosphate over the same area. This much manure will replace the commercial fertilizer.

Many crops are not injured by light frost and can be planted now. These include asparagus

crowns, beets, cabbage, broccoli and cauliflower, swiss chard, lettuce, parsley, carrots, parsnips, peas, potatoes, radish, spinach and sweet corn.

"Are we relevant to the scene?"

"Recent events have focused our attention on what happens when the accumulated weight of frustrations forces itself to the surface."

"Late in March," Commissioner Murphy went on to say, "The National Budget and Consultation Committee looked at America in crisis: —

— It concluded that the same crisis faced the voluntary agencies in America.

— It suggested that we might consider the establishment of a special local fund to meet the crisis of urban problems.

— It recommended that we might reconsider allocations to give priority to agencies already engaged in the struggle against racism, poverty, crime and related fields.

— It urged that member agencies serving a clientele able to pay for their services obtain more of their support from fees; and,

— Finally, it exhorted member agencies to commit a larger proportion of their resources to a solution of the crisis."

"This not only underlines the crisis which urban America is facing today. It highlights the role which the Joint Appeal must play if it is to remain relevant to the American scene."

"To a great extent we have been meeting this challenge over the years."

"But to maintain our level of past achievement — for the most recent of which are today expressing our appreciation — we must carefully evaluate the direction of our Joint Appeal effort and its effectiveness in meeting the

Ski Centers

Cooperation between privately and publicly owned ski centers throughout the State is expected to be the result of a recent meeting of the New York Ski Area Operators. The Association held its annual business meeting on Tuesday, April 9, at the Randolph House in Syracuse.

Orville Slutzky, General Manager of the Hunter Mountain Ski Bowl, Hunter, New York, was elected President. Other officers and a board of directors were also elected.

The purpose of the Association is to foster, promote and protect the business of ski area

operators in the State through a cooperative and unified effort on the part of ski area management.

Mr. Slutzky emphasized the importance the Association attaches to cooperation among the private, municipal and State-operated ski centers to improve skiing and attract skiers to New York State. He stated that the differences that had existed in the past have now narrowed down to the point where they do not pose the same competitive threat to the private industry. "In fact, he observed, "the major differences between private and State-operated areas have improved to the point where they are no longer a problem."

Conservation Commissioner R. Stewart Kilborne concurred with Mr. Slutzky's statement. The Commissioner said, "Our State-operated ski centers are glad to join the Association and do all they can to promote skiing in New York State through cooperative efforts of ski area management."

The New York Ski Area Operators Association plans to work on problems that concern skiers and operators across the State. Three committees appointed indicate the problems that the Association will be attacking first.

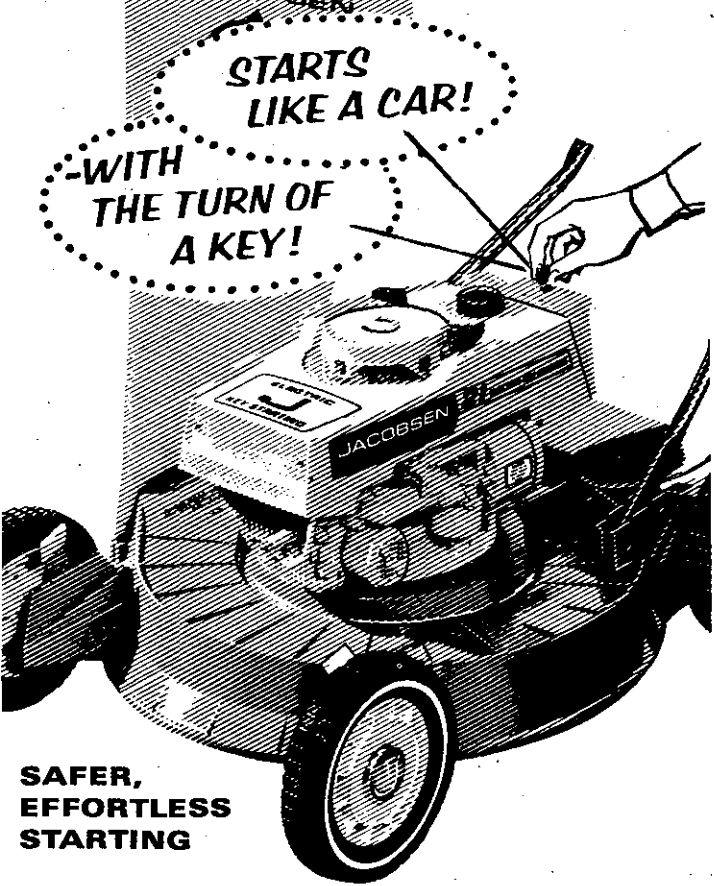

They dry out last year's grass and leaves and result in tinder-dry conditions all too suitable for the annual spring fire season.

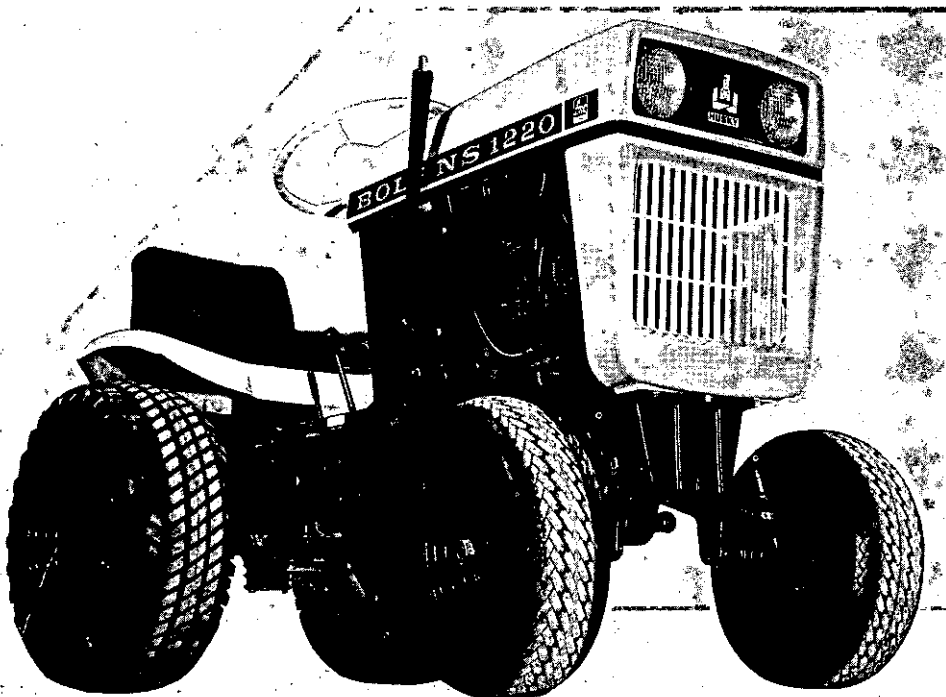
The absence of snow cover in most areas of the state this year compounds the problem. The warm sun and brisk breezes dry exposed leaves and dead grasses very quickly. And, with the stiff breezes of the past few weeks,

the drying out has been dangerously complete.

Although forest fires often are thought of as an autumn phenomenon - and the largest, most destructive forest fires do occur in the fall - there are more fires in the spring than in the fall. Most spring fires involve grass and brush, but can endanger woods, homes and human lives. The spring menace extends through April and May, greatly lessening about June with the appearance of the new season's grass and foliage.

The risk of spring fires now is heightened by the fact that the season coincides with spring cleanup time for farmers and homeowners as well as the start of the fishing season. Forest rangers, fire departments and volunteer firemen throughout the State are hard pressed to keep up with the rash of blazes, particularly on weekends. The Conservation Department, therefore, advises anglers, farmers, and housewives - as well as hikers, campers, woodsmen and everyone else out-of-doors - to

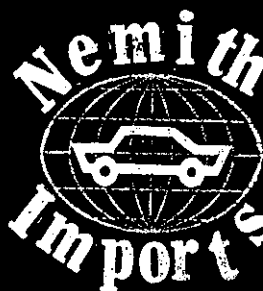

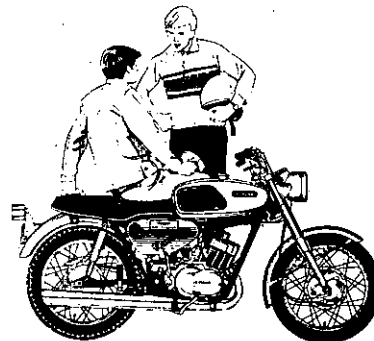

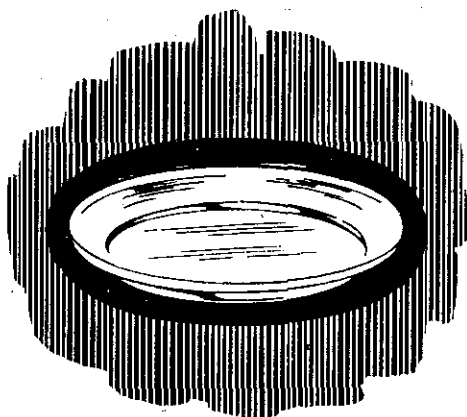
