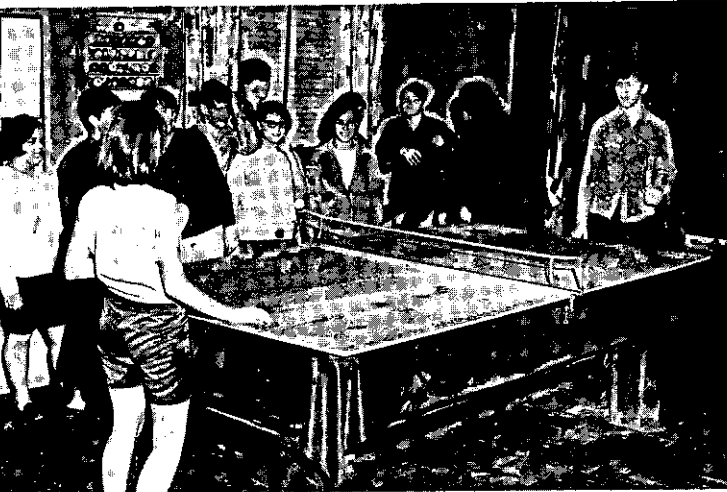

Soloists are William Eberle, Trombone; Michael Clark, Alto Saxophone.

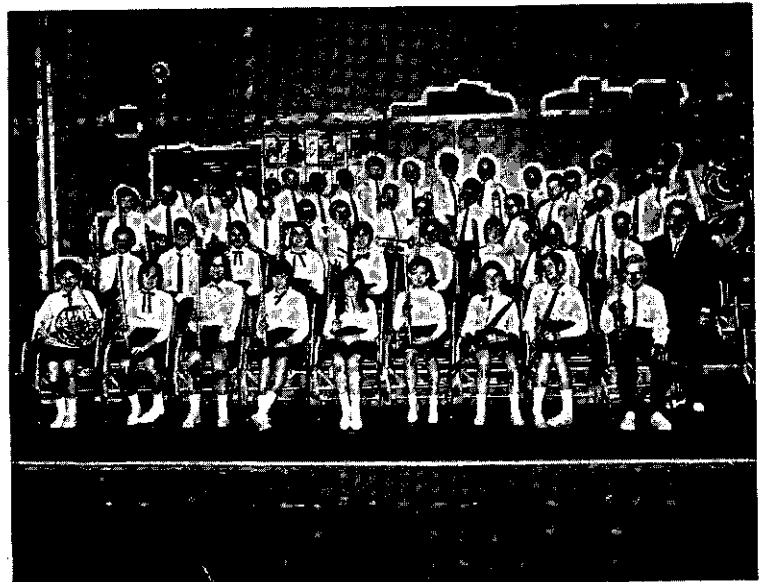

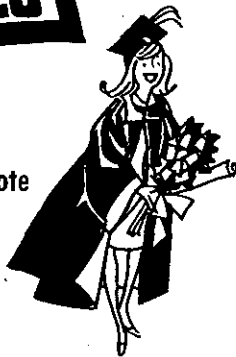

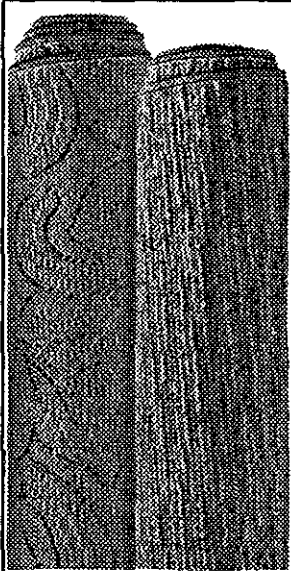

The 3rd annual spring tournament of the Bethlehem Tennis Association will be held on June 15-16 and June 22-23 at the Junior High School courts in Delmar.

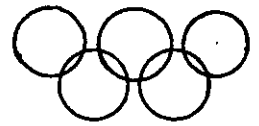
Events scheduled are men's singles, women's singles, and mixed doubles.

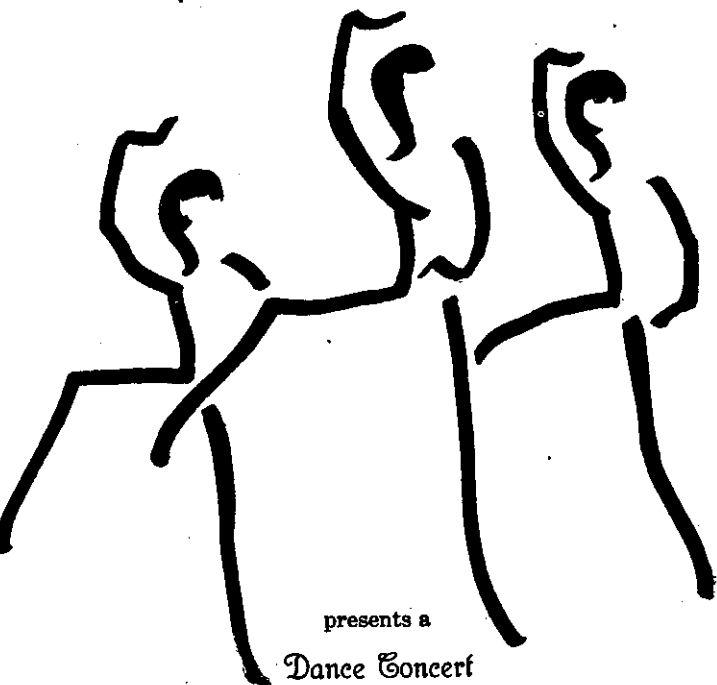

Summer Swim

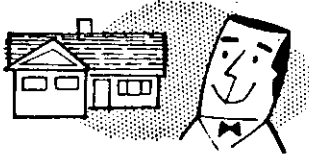

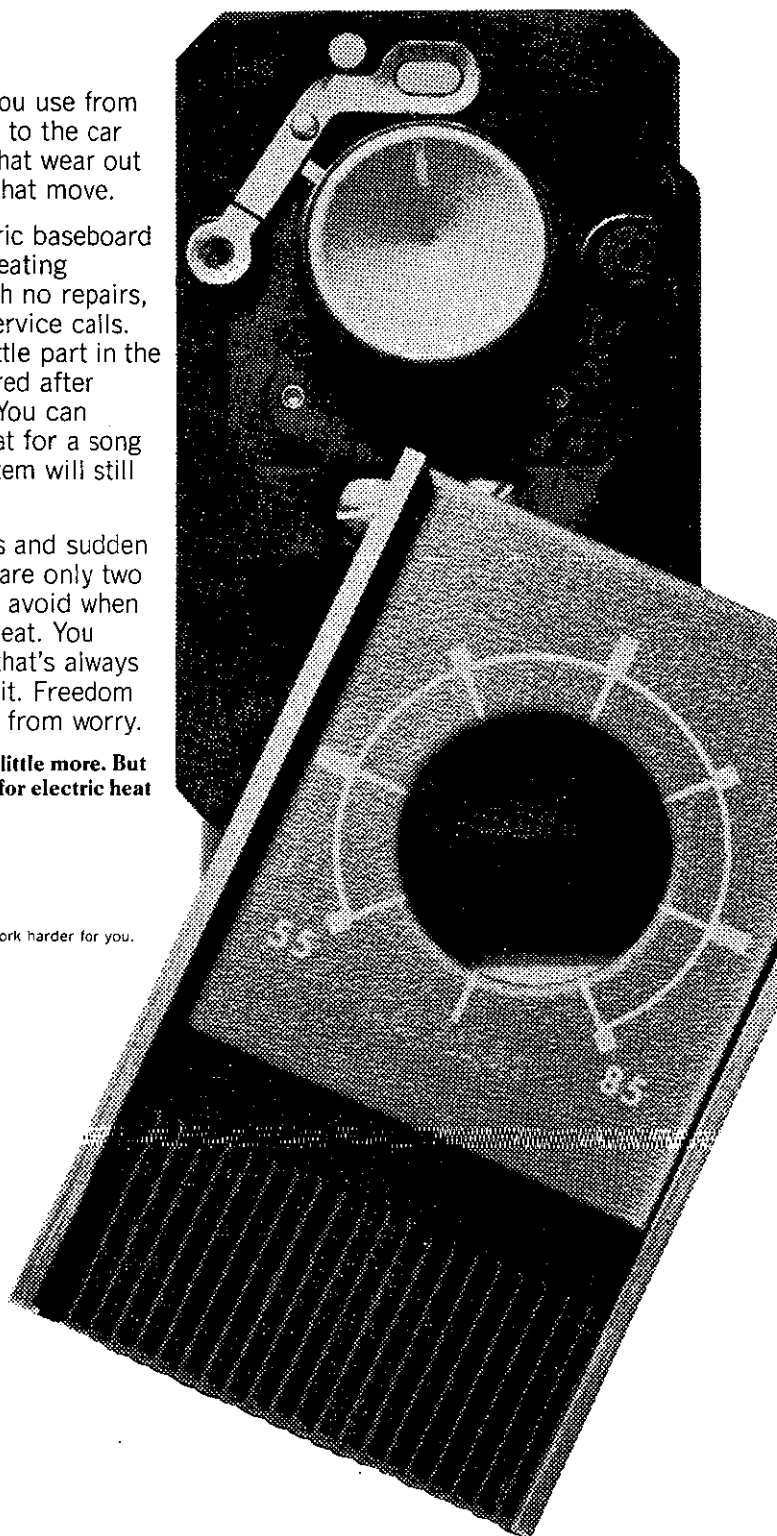

The Club will be made up of men and women and meet at the Bethlehem Jr. High School, Monday-Friday mornings at 8:00 A.M. during the summer. Mr. Fuller will supervise and "lead" the participants. No fee will be charged for this activity and school facilities will be used for dressing and showers.

Outdoor Project

On June 4, 75 fourth and fifth graders will travel to Lawson's Lake near Clarksville to participate in a four-day outdoor educational experience. With their teachers: Mrs. Joanne Oliver (Delmar Grade School), Hugh Williams (Delmar), and Donald Brown (Glenmont School), these boys and girls will participate in a continual program of shared experiences beginning with swimming and boating safety and first aid taught by Mr. Carnahan and other leaders from the Albany Chapter of the American Red Cross.

On Wednesday, June 5, members of the State Museum Staff will provide instruction in the natural science areas. These will include: Entomology with John Wilcox; Botany under the direction of Dr. Eugene Collins and Stanley Smith, and Geology headed by Dr. Y. William Isachsen.

Thursday's program involves the creative arts. Coming in as guest consultant is Mrs. Corinne Weeks of the Heldeberg Workshop Staff. Mrs. Weeks will work with Miss Sammie Ives in creative

ramatics. Stanley Reich plans to spend the day working with children in artistic ways using natural materials and the visual possibilities of the area. Paul Vanderhark is to serve as recreational consultant for the entire program. Under his leadership there will be a program of folk dancing and opportunities to participate in games suitable to the locale.

Frank Leavitt of the United States Soil Conservation Department has made the arrangements for a "Conservation Day" on Friday. Working with him will be people from the United States Department of Conservation and the New York State Conservation Department. Emphasis will be on wild life, soil and the water cycle. This will also be a day of evaluation when the leaders spend time with small groups discussing the program, making suggestions for future programs and comparing ideas and new learnings.

40 parents have volunteered to assist in the food preparation and in supervision throughout the week. 8 BC alumni are planning to spend the first days of their vacations from college assisting in the program. All of these student assistants are currently in teacher training.

Part of the program cost has been defrayed through the efforts of these fourth and fifth graders. Between a paper drive and a bake sale nearly \$200 was earned.

The Lawson's Lake Outdoor Education Project will provide

these boys and girls with many opportunities to learn about and appreciate their environment. Perhaps it is even more important to think of the fine opportunities for cooperative living that the program will provide. From the "briefing session" on Wednesday, May 29, at the Delmar School through the time that the cabin doors are closed and the buses arrive to take these young people to their homes on Friday, 75 students and 3 teachers will be experiencing study in a "natural classroom"

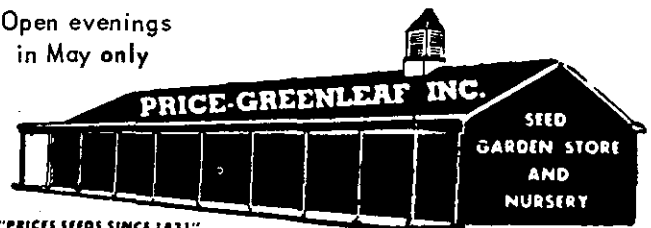

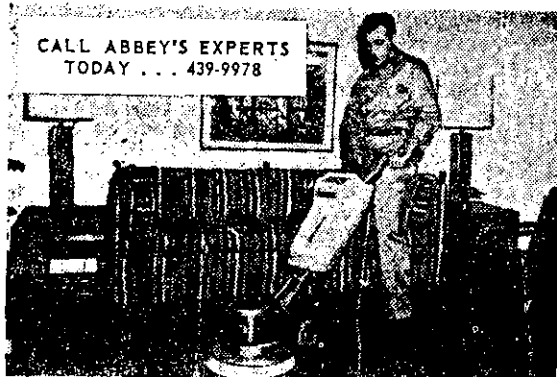

Workshop

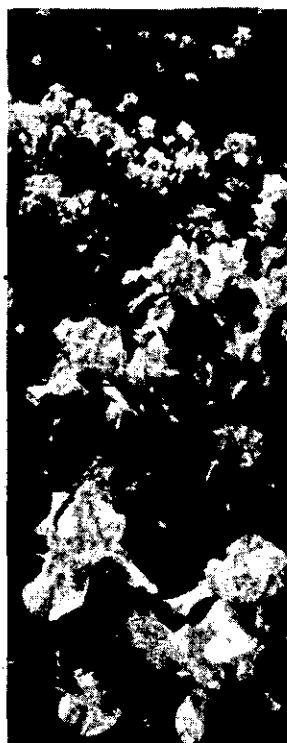
On May 14 and 28, members of the Heldeberg Workshop Staff met at the home of Miss Sammie Ives, 92 Jordan Boulevard, Delmar, to set up working plans for the creative dramatics section of the 1968 workshop. Attending these "ideas sessions" were two Delmar members of the volunteer group that has worked throughout the year on Heldeberg. Mrs. Jean Nostrand's immediate concern is with curriculum. Mrs. Joan Uhrick will head the volunteers in creative dramatics in August.

Regular members of the staff are: Miss Ives and Roland Bover of the Bethlehem Central School Faculty, Mrs. Corinne Weeks veteran workshop leader, and Thomas A. Hughes, Jr. of the Schenectady Public Schools - Speech Teacher. A team of teachers from the Guilderland Central Schools will carry on an experimental program in "sybiotic learning" with boys and girls from their district and a number of children involved in the workshop program. These

two teaching groups will combine forces to provide broad and stimulating experiences in creative language and the staging arts. Heading the Guilderland group is Patrick Flynn and meeting with him in the "ideas sessions" were Miss Pat Finin and Jordan Conboy who will work with first graders in the summer program.

Plans have been made to include video taping, photographic stills and the Super 8 movie camera. Staging areas will be set up by volunteer groups and then as the program evolves, by the children themselves. Hopefully many of these experiences will be on "the land" (proposed new property on the Crouse Farm in Voorheesville).

These planning sessions represent only a small segment of the summer's program. It is outlined in the course offering brochure now being distributed throughout the area. Heldeberg Workshop has become an institution in the Capital District. It provides hundreds of young people with adventures in learning in science, the arts, cultures of our land, - in many areas not a part of the offerings of the schools. It provides a time to explore with teachers and volunteers guiding these explorations.

Consummation of the proposal is subject to approval by the stockholders of all the banks concerned and also by State and Federal regulatory authorities.

It is not expected that stockholders will vote on the Holding Company until after approval has been received from the regulatory authorities.

Mr. Herzog stated that the Third Banking District, in which the Yonkers bank is located, composed of the Counties of Westchester, Putnam, Dutchess, Rockland, Orange, Ulster, and Sullivan contains some of the fastest growing territory in the State and that it is highly desirable that the First Empire State Corporation be represented in this dynamic area. The inclusion, Mr. Herzog said, of the First National Bank in Yonkers will add substantially to the growth potential of the proposed new Holding Company.

First Empire State Corporation will have affiliates in four of New York State's nine banking districts and will operate 153 offices serving 83 communities stretching from Yonkers north through the Hudson Valley to Plattsburgh and from Albany
