The announcement was made at the Players' membership meeting last Sunday at which time new offiers were also elected.



New Budget Vote June 26

On May 8 the budget of \$6,911,-585 proposed for the school year 1968 - 69, Bethlehem Central School District, was rejected. In response to this decision, the Board of Education has revised the budget, reducing planned expenditures by \$216,169 to a total of \$6,695,416. An election to approve this new budget will be held Wednesday, June 26 at the Junior High School, Voting will take place between the hours of 12 noon and 9 p.m. An open meeting to present the budget to the community will be held Tuesday evening, June 25 at 7:30 p.m. in the Senior High School auditorium.

The reduction of \$216,169 has been cut from all parts of the budget. Major cuts have been the removal of \$125,000 from Interfund Transfers; \$39,220 from Instructional Services; \$10,727 from the Central Administration category; \$33,000 from Transportation. Other reductions have been made throughout the budget.

The cut of \$33,000 from Trans portation refers to the purchase and operation of two additional school buses. These are being submitted to the voters in a special proposition in order to give the community an opportunity to decide whether to maintain the present level of transportation service.

A detailed copy of the budget is available in the offices of all Bethlehem Schools or may be obtained from the Office of the Superintendent of Schools by calling 439-9964. A special budget bulletin has been sent to all members of the community this week.

In its meeting of Thursday evening, June 13, the Bethlehem Council of Parent-Faculty-School Organizations passed a resolution approving the new budget being presented and urging all of its members to vote favorably for its passage in the election of Wednesday, June 26.



To Institute

Gordon W. Molyneux of the history department of Bethlehem Central Sr. High School, has been appointed to the Wiliam College NDEA Summer Institute, according to Director Professor Robert G.L. Waite. The institute will consist of forty teachers selected from public and private schools in the Eastern United States. Participants will study European Cultural History at the Williams institute from July 1 to August 5.

Director Waite states that the institute hopes to provide an enriching educational experience which will improve the knowledge and insight of secondary teachers with respect to the heritage of European cultural history. The staff includes professors from Williams, Skidmore, La-Salle Colleges, and Rutgers University. An experienced high school teacher will conduct a demonstration seminar with high school students from the Mt. Greylock Regional High School of Williamstown.


The program will emphasize an inter-disciplinary approach to the study of European cultural history. Participants will be involved in a series of interpretive lecture-discussion courses which select key problems for intensive study. Coordinated lectures will include materials in European art, music, and literature. Important books of Western civilization will be discussed in seminar sessions. The Taxus Weevil


The taxus weevil or black vine weevil as it is also known, is the most serious pest of yews. It can also be a serious pest of broad leafed evergreens such as

rhododendrum, mountain laurel, and azealeas.

The adult taxus weevil is black, about 3/8 of an inch long and is wingless. Since it cannot fly, it's damage is usually confined to individual plantings and in nurseries. The adult weevil emerges from the soil in late June to feed

on the foliage and to lay eggs in the soil. Since the adult weevils hide during the day and feed at night, they are seldom seen. However, the crescent shaped feeding marks give the edge of the leaf or needle a scalloped appearance that is easy to recognize.

Although it is the feeding of the adult weevil that can be seen, it is the injury caused by the grub or larvae that is most damaging to the plant. After the eggs hatch during July and August, the grubs or larvae enter the soil and feed on the roots. As few as

eight larvae have been known to kill large sized yew.

Now and during the next few weeks, is a good time to inspect your plants for signs of weevil feeding injury. These crescent shaped notches may be as small as an eighth of an inch or ex-

tended feeding may remove one side of the needle or leaf. In some cases, the yew needles will have the end completely cut off.

If you see damage of this nature, spray the soil around the plant, the trunk and the branches with a spray containing chlordame. Use a mixture of 2 teaspoons of the 72% liquid concentrate or 5 level tablespoons of 4.6 wettable powder in each gallon of water used. Dieldrin is also effective against this pest. The usual time to spray is the last week in June. Timing of the spray is quite important in order to kill the adult weevil while it feeds and before it lays eggs. Spraying the soil will kill any small larvae that do hatch.

Be sure to inspect your yews and broadleaf evergreens for evidence of this pest. Newly planted shrubs often carry the larvae in the ball of earth, so be sure to check them carefully. On spray should take care of the taxus weevil.


