Doubles Ladder Tournament Set

A mixed doubles ladder tournament is now being organized by the Bethlehem Tennis Association, and will continue throughout the summer.

The ladder tournament is open to everyone. You may send a note or call Maynard Parsons (439-1076) after 5 p.m., to sign up to have a team placed on the ladder.

When a sufficient number has been received, all the team names will be placed in a hat, and then pulled out and placed in consecutive order. The ladder list of mixed-doubles teams will then be posted in a corner of the building nearest the Junior High School tennis courts.

After the posting, it is up to each team to arrange for matches at the convenience of players. Every team may challenge a team either one or two places above them on the ladder. If the challenging team wins, it moves up to the spot of the defeated team.

At the end of the tennis season, if all players have been active, the order of the ladder will show which teams have been most successful in competition against others.

The Bethlehem Tennis Association is starting the ladder tournament mainly to encourage wider contacts among area tennis players. It will provide the opportunity for men and women to meet and play tennis with people they might not have known before.

If the mixed doubles ladder is successful and popular, the Association might organize other ladder tournaments for men's and women's singles and/or doubles.

Two Ladies' Classes

There will be two ladies' classes in tennis instruction this summer, due to the enthusiastic response the Bethlehem Tennis Association received from its preliminary notice in The Spotlight two weeks ago.

One of the six-week clinics began last week, with Donald M. Camp as group instructor. This class meets Wednesdays from 1 to 2 p.m., at the Junior High School tennis courts.

The second class met for the first time this past Tuesday, July 2. John Stevenson, a sophomore at Middlebury College and finalist in the Association's spring tournament, will provide instruction on Tuesdays from 10 to 11:15 a.m., at the Senior High School tennis courts.

The local women participating in the tennis program furnish their own rackets and balls, receive demonstration and practice in the basic tennis strokes, strategy, and court courtesy. Cost for each participant is \$6 for the six-week course.

The Bethlehem Tennis Association is underwriting additional expenses for the clinics. Further information may be obtained by calling Mrs. Jean Balint at 439-3876.

John Stevenson of Delmar, a sophomore at Middlebury College, and Dr. Dan McGoldrick of Albany were the men's finalists in the spring tournament of the Bethlehem Tennis Association. The final match in the men's singles was scheduled to be played last Saturday afternoon. (The Spotlight news deadline prevents us from announcing the winner as of this writing.)

Ann Treadway won the women's singles event, defeating Helen Linett, 6-0, 6-2.

Stevenson and Miss Linda Camp copped the mixed-doubles trophy, defeating Jim Jackson and Miss Daisy Ishibashi, both coaches at Shaker High School by the close score of 6-2, 7-9, 7-5.

Dr. McGoldrick reached the men's singles finals by defeating Harold Ronson, 4-6, 6-4, 6-4 while Stevenson won his semi-final match over Dr. Art Tomlinson, 6-4, 6-2.

In the semi-finals of the mixed-doubles competition, Stevenson and Miss Camp won by a score of 1-6, 6-4, 6-1 over Bob Herman and Mrs. Treadway, while Jackson and Miss Ishibashi defeated Ronson and Tina Strasser, 6-1, 6-2.



He will tell how, fresh from the Coast Guard, four aspiring young singers were given a con-

tract with CBS and suddenly found their own lives and fortunes hitched to the rise of a show business legend. That legend was the red-headed, controversial, and always unpredictable Arthur Godfrey.

Much sought after as both singer and speaker, he now describes himself as "a slave of Jesus Christ" and hastens to add that no life has ever been so satisfying and good to live as the life he now leads.

He is married to a former mezzo-soprano and is the father of 5 children.

Mr. Karl will be greatly involved in the work of the Bethlehem Christian Workshop, July 8-July 12, to which the young people of the community are cordially welcomed. 
Meeting

Setback

A rehearing will be requested on the request of a construction permit for Governors Hall — a \$950,000 apartment proposal — by developer William B. Strong.

Requests for a special permit and variance to construct the 82-unit apartment complex and parking facilities were rejected by the Bethlehem Zoning Board of Appeals recently.

The proposed structure, which would house about 150 persons,

would be located on a 3.7 acre tract on Delaware Avenue just north of Grant Street.

"Our only knowledge of the board's decision has had to be deduced from newspaper accounts," Mr. Strong remarked. "The reported uncompromising rejection of the project on the basis of its being detrimental to the further development of the district would appear to rule out any chances of success at a rehearing."

"However, we will request one and hope the board will reconsi-

der its decision. After all, it apparently overlooked the zoning ordinance on density and, other than on the garages, the rulings were matters of judgment."

A survey conducted by Town Engineer Al Worth revealed that 40 parking spaces to the front of the proposed garages would be located on Town of Bethlehem right of way. The study also indicated that the location of the garages would not meet the zoning setback requirements of 55 feet from the road.

"All we would have to do to remedy that problem is set them back another 20 feet," Mr. Strong said. "It was just an oversight to regard to the zoning ordinance on our part."

The judgement rulings Mr. Strong referred to were the boards conclusions that "There would be an excessive amount of people on the proposed site. A number of town residents including town officials attended the May 2 hearing and "unanimously voiced no objection to the pro-





ject," Mr. Strong said.

Admittedly they have been given the right to do so, but we wonder why the appeals board has placed its objection over that of so many responsible citizens.

"All of us are becoming increasingly aware of the need for commercial and industrial tax income to help with the schooling of our children and the providing of municipal services," Mr. Strong added. "That portion of the real estate taxes from Governors Hall which would have gone towards the school budget would have paid two-thirds of the cost of two new buses in one year.

Based on the school tax levy called for in the proposed school budget, Governors Hall would provide the school district with about \$22,000 a year in tax moneys, he said. The Town of Bethlehem would net about \$36,000 a year in taxes, he added.

"Meanwhile," Mr. Strong continued, "the property will be placed on the market. If our hear-

ing is unsuccessful, we hope to be recompensed for the thousands of dollars and hundreds of hours we have invested in hearings and other procedures before our option expires in September.

"No problem in selling is anticipated because one may construct such neighborly heavy-traffic generators as bowling alleys, motels, theaters, discount stores, supermarkets, etc., on this site. If we are unable to sell the land, Mr. Brimmer, the owner of the wooded section of the site and a conservationist has said he will deed it to Nature Conservancy to remain 'forever wild.'"



are considered, you can see why all can be satisfactory. Mulches control weeds by their smothering action. Generally a two inch layer of mulch will prevent most weeds from growing.

The layer of mulch also acts as an insulator to moderate soil temperatures. The soil will be cooler in summer and warmer in winter.

A mulch also reduces water loss from the soil surface. This helps to maintain a more even moisture supply in periods of dry weather. In spite of the wet weather so far, this could become important during July and August.

In addition to these more obvious virtues, mulches can protect plant roots by reducing the amount of cultivation near the plant.

Many materials can be used for mulches. Some last a long time and some decompose rapidly. The long lasting ones, such as wood chips, chopped bark, small stones or marble chips and calcined clay pellets, are ideal for use around shrubbery. Black polyethylene plastic is another material that can be used around shrubs, but its appearance will be improved if it is covered by one of the other mulches.

Materials such as peat moss, pine needles, peanut or cocoa bean hulls and peat humus decompose fairly rapidly and are a good choice for annual gardens. The partially decomposed mulch can then be worked into the soil each year to build up the organic matter in the soil.

No matter which material you choose, a mulch will improve the appearance of your garden, improve the plant growth and help make gardening more fun.

Rabies

The New York State Conservation Department's Division of Fish and Game reports a continued decline in cases of active rabies infection in animals in New York State during the first five months of this year.

From January 1 through May 31, ten cases were reported with only five counties involved. During the same period last year there were 23 cases of rabies in

ten counties. There were 89 cases reported during all of 1967 which tied 1963 for the lowest annual total in over 22 years. The ten positive cases discovered during the first five months of 1968 resulted from tests conducted by the N.Y. State Health Department on approximately 600 dead animals suspected of being rabid.

In this year's survey, Clinton and Franklin counties have each had three cases; St. Lawrence county had two; while Ontario and Ulster counties reported one case a piece. Franklin county had three rabid foxes; Ontario county one fox; Clinton County had one fox, one cow and one skunk; St. Lawrence county one fox and one horse; and Ulster county reported one rabid bat.

The statistics were developed by personnel assigned to the Conservation Department's Wildlife Rabies Control Program in cooperation with the N.Y. State Health Department. Under this program, wildlife trappers have been employed to reduce the population of foxes and skunks, the primary vectors, or carriers of wildlife rabies. Emphasis in recent years has been directed to research studies to find a reproductive inhibitor effective in controlling fox abundance. Tests of several inhibitors in caged foxes have been very promising.

People using outdoor recreation areas this summer are urged to prevent possible contact with rabid animals by not disturbing or picking up young animals they might find while in the woods.


