

## The Slingerlands Toll Gate



We are happy to be able to present to Spotlight readers two historic views of the tollgate which stood astride the plank road at Slingerlands. The toll road was opened in 1859 by the Albany, Rensselaerville and Schoharie Plank Road Company. This group of investors was incorporated to issue stock to the amount of \$100,000 at \$25 per share, although little more than \$50,000 worth of stock was ever sold. John I. Slingerland was one of the original directors and he was grandfather of C. H. Slingerland who operated the printing company.

The Slingerlands toll house was one of four gates, the first in New Salem, the second in Slingerlands, the third about one hundred yards on the Slingerland side of the Walley Farm on New Scotland Road and the fourth near Quail Street in Albany. Payment at the first gate permitted the driver and horse to pass the second without another toll charge, but toll was again required at the third or fourth gate. Teams coming in at intermediate points beyond Slingerlands paid only once. Five cents for a one-horse rig and ten cents for a team or load of hay passing through the gate was the usual charge. The toll gates were in operation for about 50 years.

There was an actual gate which could be closed to intercept those offenders who chronically skipped their toll or those whose rate of speed promised to evade the tollkeeper. The toll house stood astride the two strip roadway, the right side to permit but one team to pass through. The plank road

### TOLL GATE (Continued)

as originally built extended from New Salem to the intersection of New Scotland Road and Madison Avenue, then known as Lydius Street. The gate was still standing at the turn of the century; it was torn down about 1908.

We are indebted for the gift of the pictures to Mrs. John Rutherford of Slingerlands. Part of the information was originally gathered by Mrs. Chris Hartnagel, Slingerlands, which she was regent of Tawasentha Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, and the following poem, written by a former Slingerlands resident was incorporated into the DAR Yearbook:

#### A MEMORY OF THE OLD SLINGERLANDS TOLLHOUSE

Time was when roads were built  
of planks,  
And tollgate keepers barred the  
way  
Of vehicles that sought to pass  
From left to right: by night  
or day.

The way was barred, but only  
'till

The modest five-cent toll was  
paid,

The money went to buy the  
planks

And pay the men who got them  
laid.

### New Exhibit

This is timely as she is exhibiting pictures, campaign buttons, tokens, slogans, match holders - all kinds of things that were used to promote party candidates through the election years, long ago.

Of great interest is a replica of a rail fence carved by her father with a jack knife and carried by him in Kinderhook, N.Y. during Lincoln's campaign. A parallel can be drawn between our troubled days and the Draft Riots in New York City in 1863 when Horatio Seymour ran for president of the U.S. (and was defeated by U.S. Grant) There is a petition to prove this. Another parallel is a large token

depicting a negro praying for equality. This was used in the 1838 campaign when the Abolitionist Movement actually started.

Mrs. Buchanan inherited her interest in the collection from her father. Both collected and recorded and became students of American political campaigns. There is a wealth of material to see making this a unique, memory provoking exhibit.

## New Home for Slingerlands Players

The Slingerlands Community Players signed a closing this week on the 100-year-old Warrick Hotel on Delaware Turnpike in Unionville. Legal representation for the Players was Miss Ruth Miner, a patron of the group since its inception, 17 years ago.

The purchase culminates a five-year search on the part of the players to find a permanent home. The crowded schedule at Bethlehem Central High School has made it increasingly difficult to arrange rehearsal time and production dates. This year, when the group decided to offer a fourth show, as a bonus attraction, they found it necessary to schedule it during the week as the weekends were booked with school activities.

Added to this difficulty was the drawback of having to construct sets in the crowded meeting rooms while rehearsals were going on. The sets would then have to be trucked to the school and erected, sometimes removed before opening night to clear the stage for some other use. Meanwhile, the actors were burdened with limited exposure to the actual surroundings in which they would perform.

The first theater in which the Players performed was the gym-

nasium at the Slingerlands Grade School. This was seventeen years ago, when a group of 18 thespians from the Slingerlands Community Church met and decided to form a community theater. Rehearsals were held in the basement of the home of charter member, Ruth Wilber. They canvassed door to door to sell tickets and when the 200 "set-up seats" were a sell-out, they moved to the Bethlehem Central Jr.



## Icelandic Wedding Ceremony

The church ceremony took place at 6 P.M. in Neskirkja, a Lutheran Church in Reykjavik. The ceremony which was traditionally Icelandic except for the Icelandic-English used, was presided over by Sera Frank M. Halldorsson.

The father of the groom served as best man.

As is customary in Iceland, the groom and best man were seated

near the altar of the church prior to the arrival of guests. As each guest entered the sanctuary, the groom and best man would rise and bow. Men were seated on one side of the church, ladies on the other. The bride was escorted to the altar by her brother-in-law.

The ceremony was begun with the singing of two hymns by the choir during which the bride and her escort and the groom and his best man sat across from each other. The double ring ceremony concluded with two hymns with the bride and groom seated together.

Following the ceremony a reception for 100 guests was held at a private reception hall in Reykjavik. Cocktails were served followed by a buffet style dinner called a "cold table" in Iceland. Guests at the reception included Icelanders and Americans.


Following the reception, a private party for the close families and friends of the bride and groom was held at their apartment in Reykjavik.

tors, Dr. Brind said that the board received bids from nine area contractors and that the lowest bid was submitted by John P. Sewell corporation. Construction will start immediately and the anticipated completion date is November 28, 1969.

The estimated total cost of the project (\$2,330,000) includes land, fees, site development and construction. Essentially a two-story structure, with a one-story lobby and reception area facing Maher Road, the New Blue

**Q. How is Sherry made?**

In Spain, by a secondary fermentation, or "flowering" of the wine and blending by the traditional "Solera" system. In the U.S., by aging or "baking" the wine in oak or redwood containers at from 100° to 140° F. from three months to a year, at the producer's preference. This may be done in a heated celler, in tanks heated by coils or by the heat of the sun. The heat carmelizes the grape sugar and with the prolonged contact of the warm wine with air develops the "nutty" flavor typical of Sherries. Later, it is allowed to cool gradually to cellar temperatures and is aged like other wines.
