Getting Ready

In preparation for conversion to the Intermediate School concept next fall, Bethlehem Junior High teachers and administrators are taking a fresh look at every phase of educational practice and procedure. Numerous in-service workshops have been scheduled for the spring semester in order to reassess and revise teaching methods to better meet the needs of the intermediate age group children (6th, 7th, & 8th) who will be grouped together in the Junior High building next year.

On March 4, Dr. Susan S. Smith, N.Y. State Consultant for School Libraries, spoke to the faculty on "The Library in the Intermediate School." Dr. Smith presented a 20-minute film entitled "Resources for Learning" which demonstrated methods for making more effective and stimulating use of library facilities. She told teachers to think of the librarian as their "silent partner" and the library as a "second classroom" for their students. She stressed the importance of informing the librarian of special subjects being studied in classrooms, so a coordinated independent study program could be established to stimulate and encourage student use of the library. With a coordinated effort between the school librarian and the classroom teachers, all resources pertaining to a given subject matter can be drawn together for enrichment of the educational process. Films, photographs, books, magazines, newspapers, etc. can all be used more effectively if they are cataloged and housed in the library as a central resource center for use by all students and teachers.

Other workshops covering such subjects as team teaching, social studies, integration of special art and music classes into the whole learning process, etc. have been held or are scheduled over the next few months.

VISTA — Volunteers in Service to America

VISTA, a national corps of workers concerned with the eradication of poverty within the United States, offers an opportunity for men and women who are at least eighteen years old to participate directly in the nation's war on poverty.

Vista Volunteers are assigned to projects in cities, small towns and rural areas — wherever they are needed and requested, from migrant workers' camps to agencies concerned with teaching the mentally handicapped. They may serve in any one of our fifty states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico or the Virgin Islands.

Volunteers receive a basic living allowance, which is enough for subsistence in the area to which they are assigned, plus housing, food, clothing and transportation. In addition, each volunteer receives \$75 per month for such personal expenses as laundry, haircuts and recreation. For every month of service, Vista sets aside \$50 for each volunteer which he may collect upon completing his tour of duty, a six weeks training period and a year of service.

Fund Drive

Vincent H. Crawford, 222 Westchester Drive, Delmar, has been named Chairman of the March 1969 Fund Drive of the Upstate New York District of the Leukemia Society of America. The campaign, during which homes will be canvassed in Albany, Schenectady, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Warren, Orange and Oneida Counties, has a goal of \$116,000.

Mr. Crawford, Executive Vice President of the Albany Savings Bank, was named to the Chairman's post by Dr. Simon Propp, 41 Jordan Blvd., Professor of Medicine at Albany Medical College and President of the Leukemia Society's Upstate District.

Leukemia, a disease of the blood-forming organs, ranks second only to accidents as a cause of death among children in the United States. A chronic form of the disease is prevalent in adults above the age of 40. The National Society supports research for a cure, and, provides monetary aid to Leukemia patients and their families for drugs and medical bills. The Leukemia Society now ranks No. 2 in voluntary health organizations directing funds toward research.

Annual Meeting

The Annual Shareholders Meeting of National Commercial Bank and Trust Company was held Friday, February 21, 1969 at The Bank's Heartland Auditorium at 40 Beaver Street, Albany, New York.


Good Year





YOUR INCOME TAX

This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.

Q — My boss still hasn't given me a W-2 statement. What should I do?

A — Employers are required to issue withholding statements to their employees by January 31, so it would be advisable to ask your employer about it.

Q — I received a package of estimated tax forms in the mail. Does that mean I have to fill one out and send it in?

A — You do not have to file an estimated return for 1969 unless you meet the requirements as explained in the instructions that came with the estimated forms.

Estimated tax forms have been sent to every taxpayer who filed an estimated return for 1968 as well as to those taxpayers who had a balance due of \$40 or more when they filed their 1967 return. The forms are identified with the taxpayer's name, address and social security number just as they appear in IRS files.

If you are required to file an estimated return, be sure to use the forms sent you. It will assure that your estimated tax payments are properly credited to your account.

Q — Can I deduct the assessment I had to pay for a new sidewalk?

A — No, the law generally does not permit deductions for assessments for local benefits that tend to increase the value of your property. The amount of the assessment can be capitalized, however, and added to the basis of your property.


