

KOHINKE AND TOWN BOARD VOTE TO CONTINUE PICKUPS

Supervisor Bertram E. Kohinke and the Bethlehem Town Board continue their policy of "good government in action" with the announcement that the weekly program of collecting grass clippings, leaves, hedge clippings, brush and tree branches will go into effect again this year on May 12. The Spring trash clean-up program ended on April 29.

The above items must be placed at the edge of the road by 8 A.M. on the day of the scheduled pick-up. Clippings and leaves must be in disposable bags, cartons or metal containers, not to exceed 50 lbs. per container.

All brush and tree branches must be tied in bundles not over 3 feet long, and not to exceed 50 lbs.

From "The Guidance Newsletter" of Bethlehem Central Senior High School

Community Colleges of The State University of New York

Because many students do not realize the variety of opportunities for further education that exist in our system of locally-sponsored two-year Community Colleges under the program of the State University of New York, we are devoting a major part of this and next week's issue of **The Guidance Newsletter** to an explanation of the role of these colleges in higher education in New York State.

The first Community Colleges were established in 1950 at Jamestown and Middletown, New York, and the growth of the Community College has been so phenomenal that today, less than twenty years later, there presently

exist in a broad network extending from Long Island to Buffalo over thirty Community Colleges. In our local area, Hudson Valley Community College has been operating since 1953, and Schenectady Community College, a newly-established institution, will open its doors to its first class in September 1969.

Although the concept of the Community College is a community-oriented one, that of providing a college to which area students can commute while furthering their education, students are not restricted to attending the institution in their immediate area. Rather, our graduates may apply to any of our Community Colleges throughout the state, and if accepted may attend at a tuition fee ranging from \$240 to \$400 per year depending on the particular college. A few Community Colleges, such as Mohawk Valley Community College in Utica, have dormitory facilities so that a student may live on campus, and all these colleges have college-approved housing in the community in which they are located, usually within easy travel-

All the curriculum of the colleges are registered by the State Education Department of the State of New York, leading to a two-year degree of Associate of Arts, or Associate in Science. In addition, an increasing number of Community Colleges, including

Hudson Valley, are offering certificates or diplomas for the successful completion of one or two year programs in various fields, such as Auto Mechanics and General Business.

Students attend Community Colleges for a variety of reasons. Those who plan to obtain employment immediately following graduation enroll in career-oriented diploma or degree programs, while students intending to transfer to the third year of a four-year college to study for a bachelor's degree upon completing their associate degree normally enter the Liberal Arts or Engineering Science (Pre-Engineering) program. 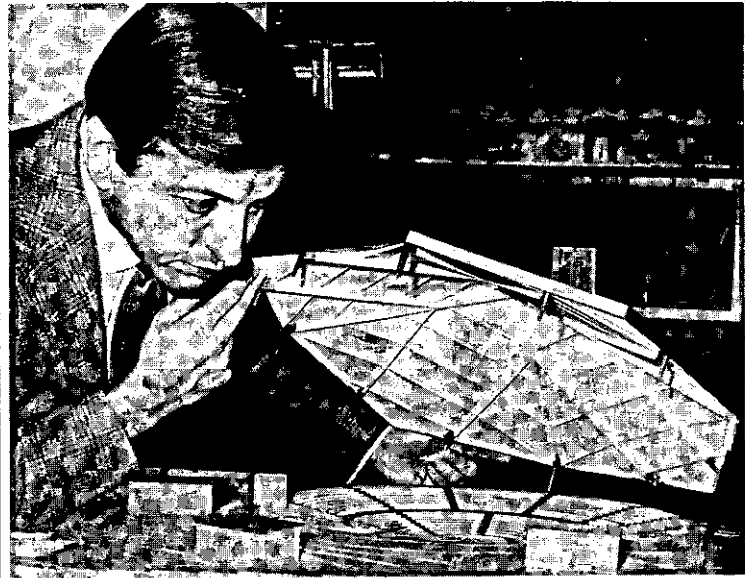
