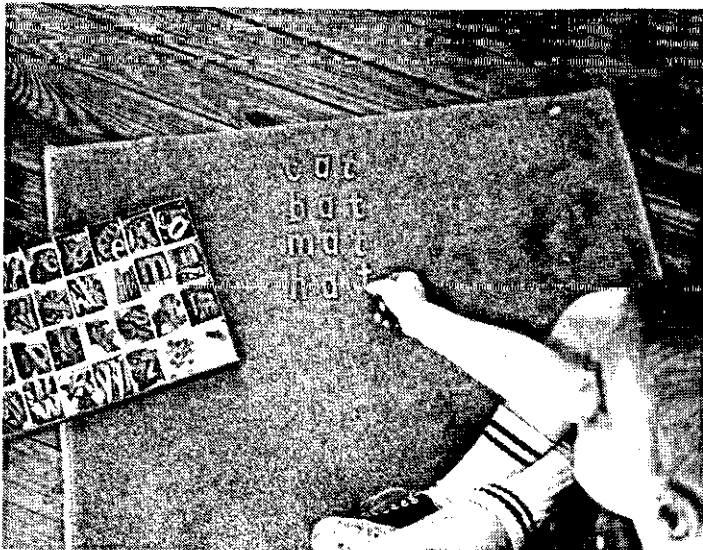

## Summer Jobs

Finding summer jobs for Albany teenagers who need work is the goal of the Summer Employment Task Force -- full-time jobs for 16 to 21 year olds, part-time jobs for 14 and 15 year olds.

This work was begun last summer by the Albany Area Council of Social Agencies, which formed three task forces to coordinate programs in employment, recreation and education.

The job picture is even more urgent this year, according to Lewis A. Swyer, employment task force chairman. So far more applications have come in than there are jobs, Swyer said, and probably the big shortages will again be in jobs for the younger teenagers.

The full-time summer job program is directed by the Youth Opportunity Center (telephone 474-8760) of the State Employment Division Of course full-time permanent jobs

will be welcomed too.

An Odd Jobs Bureau will open June 23, after school is out, at Trinity Institute to take information about part-time jobs for 14 and 15 year olds (telephone 434-6545). Before June 23, information about odd jobs will be taken at the Albany Urban League (telephone 465-3121), which administers this part of the program.

Youngsters who want odd jobs will apply at one of four centers:

- Neighborhood House, 224 North Pearl Street
- St. Luke's Methodist Church, 421 Clinton Avenue

## Decision Deferred

The Bethlehem Zoning Board of Appeals reserved decision on three requests to grant minor variances in the town's zoning ordinance.

The requests presented last night involved the reduction of the length of a backyard, permission to make an addition to a building and permission to construct a garage.

The only opposition to the routine requests surfaced during Mrs. Mildred Weigand's efforts to obtain permission to shorten her backyard at 9 Maple Tree Terrace, Delmar.

According to Mrs. Weigand, the backyard would be shortened from five to 11 feet below the town's minimum of 25 feet.

Mrs. Elizabeth Smith of 10 North Street, Delmar, protested the proposal pointing out that a decreased yard at the Weigand property might induce further damage to the trees on her adjoining land.

Mrs. Smith contended that trees on her property have been cut down since the land was purchased 10 years ago.

Questioned by the appeals board, Mrs. Smith said that she had not observed members of the Weigand family damaging her trees.

"I like the woods," Mrs. Smith added, "I bought the plot of land because I enjoy it."

During a prior hearing, the board heard a request by Carroll J. and Beatrice A. Kendrick of 63 Crossway Drive to construct a 216 square-foot addition to their home to be used as an additional bedroom.

A final hearing concerned the application of Fred J. Smith of 10 Bedell Avenue, Elsmere, to build an attached garage on his home.

No opposition was made to either request.

A capacity audience of 700 filled the new cafeteria of Bethlehem Central Senior High School last Tuesday night to hear Bob Cousy address the school's 24th annual Lettermen's Dinner.

Cousy, one of basketball's all-time greats, accepted position of head coach of the Cincinnati Royals in the National Basketball Association on May 9. The former Boston Celtics' star had completed a six year term as head coach at Boston College in March, when his team lost in the final game of the National Invitation Tournament.

The heavy rains which beset northern New York this month knocked out last weekend's planned opening of the State Conservation Department's Moose River Recreation Area in upper Hamilton County. Mud slides and bank-high creeks which weakened bridge abutments and washed out culverts made impassable some of the 50 miles of access roads in the 50,000 acre wilderness area.

Local residents estimate that streams are at record heights for this time of year. Normally, streams peak in March or April with snow runoff and are down to manageable levels by this time. But earlier this month, one Adirondack community -- Boonville -- recorded five and a half inches of rainfall.

Although the Moose River Recreation Area, itself, was closed last weekend, campers were permitted to pitch their tents on the plan outside the Cedar River Flow Gate.

Entrance to the area may be gained from the east or the west. Limekiln Lake is the location of the western entrance, reached by a road running south from Route 28 a short distance east of the village of Inlet.

From the east, the Cedar River Flow entrance is reached by proceeding west on Route 28 from Indian Lake village, turning left on the Cedar River Road, and following that to its terminus.

There is no fee for tent camping which is allowed on 25 camping areas, as assigned by the Caretaker. A camping permit is

required for periods exceeding three nights. No trailers of any kind are allowed.

Car top boats and canoes are permitted, but no outboard motors are allowed. Parking lots are provided for day use.

Further information, including a map of the area, is available in the pamphlet "Moose River Recreation Area", available from the New York State Conservation Department, Bureau of Forest Recreation, Albany, New York 12226.

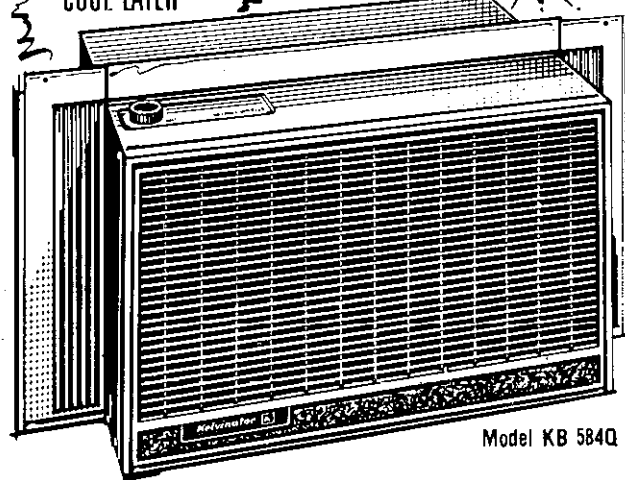

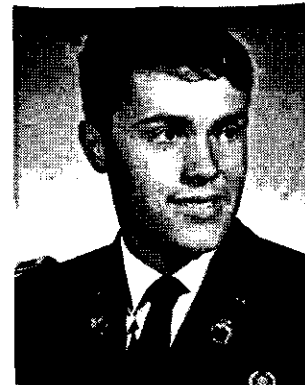

## People Factor

State Commerce Commissioner Neal L. Moylan urged members of the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce to think in terms of the "people factor" to help attract industry to the Town of Bethlehem in a speech recently at the Normanside Country Club, Elsmere.

"Historically, living conditions have been considered a secondary reason for plant location," he said. "Today, however, the trend is toward larger and more technologically complex plants. These require more highly skilled supervisory and operating personnel.

"The more skilled the staff -- and the higher educated it is -- the more likely it is to be interested in quality of living conditions in an area. This is a fact."

Commissioner Moylan cited a report published last year by the Midwest Research Institute in Kansas City, Missouri, which attempted to evaluate what sociologists call the "quality of life factor" and what he referred to as the "people factor."

"In most of the statistical measures employed," he noted, "New York State ranked second only to California, and paced that state in some very important individual criteria."

"Intangibles" measured by this report include individual status, equality and assessment of discrimination in terms of economic status and socio-economic impairment, quality of government, educational quality and quality,

economic growth, technological change, quality of medical care, status of existing agriculture, and the unemployment rate.

Commissioner Moylan singled out developments "right here in the Town of Bethlehem and Albany County that give plenty of grounds for optimism." He mentioned Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation's \$11 million, 180,000 kilowatt gas turbine generating facility now under construction; General Electric's Polymer Products operation in Selkirk, and Penn Central's new Alfred E. Perlman Classification Yard in Selkirk as typical developments.

"In short," Commissioner Moylan observed, "business and industrial activity in Albany County is proceeding at breakneck pace in the county and the Town of Bethlehem, eminently reflecting the sound business climate that exists in New York State as a whole."

president-elect, he was an Assembly vice-president, and he also served as president of the Rensselaer County Heart Association.

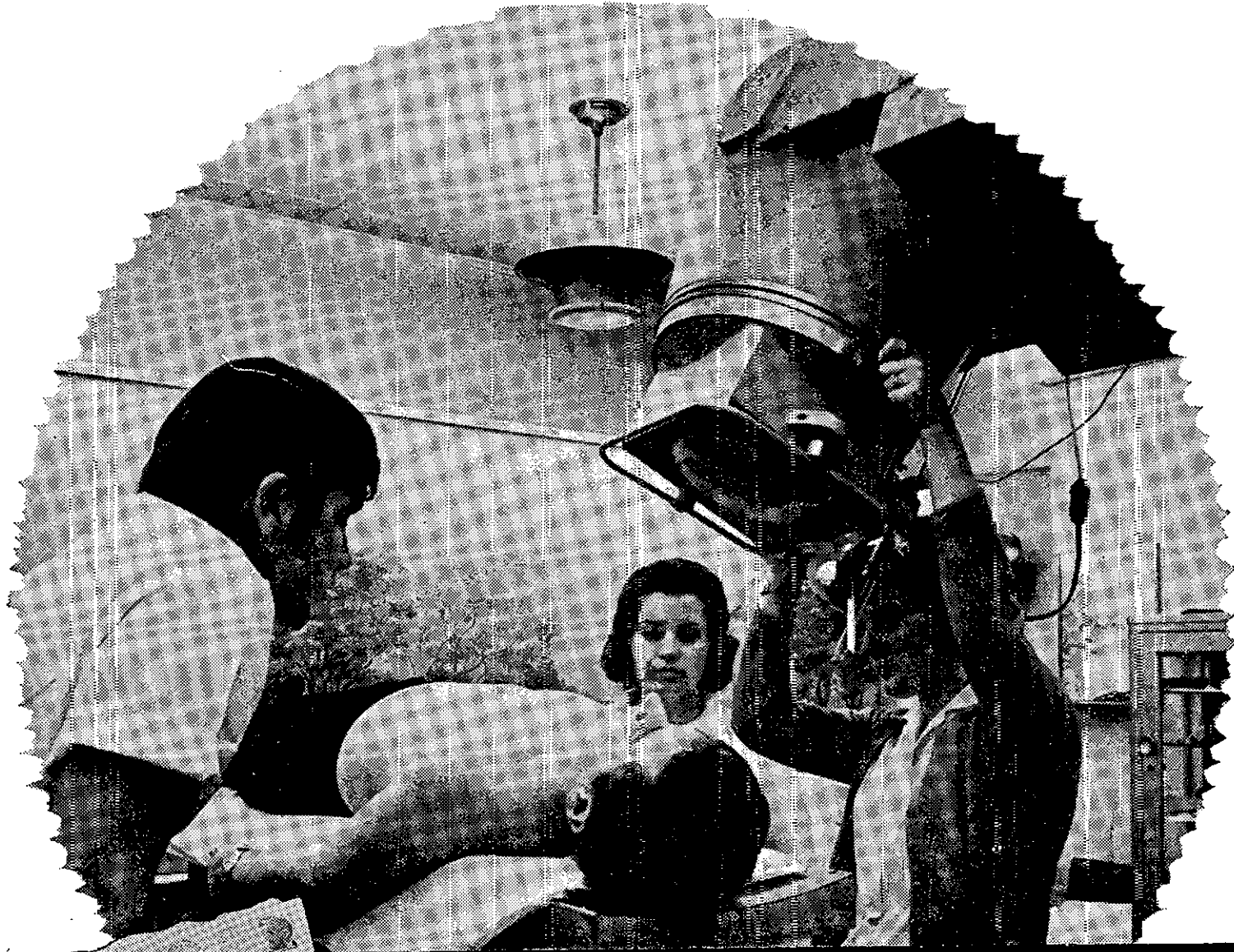
Dr. Riley is on the staff of Samaritan Hospital in Troy,

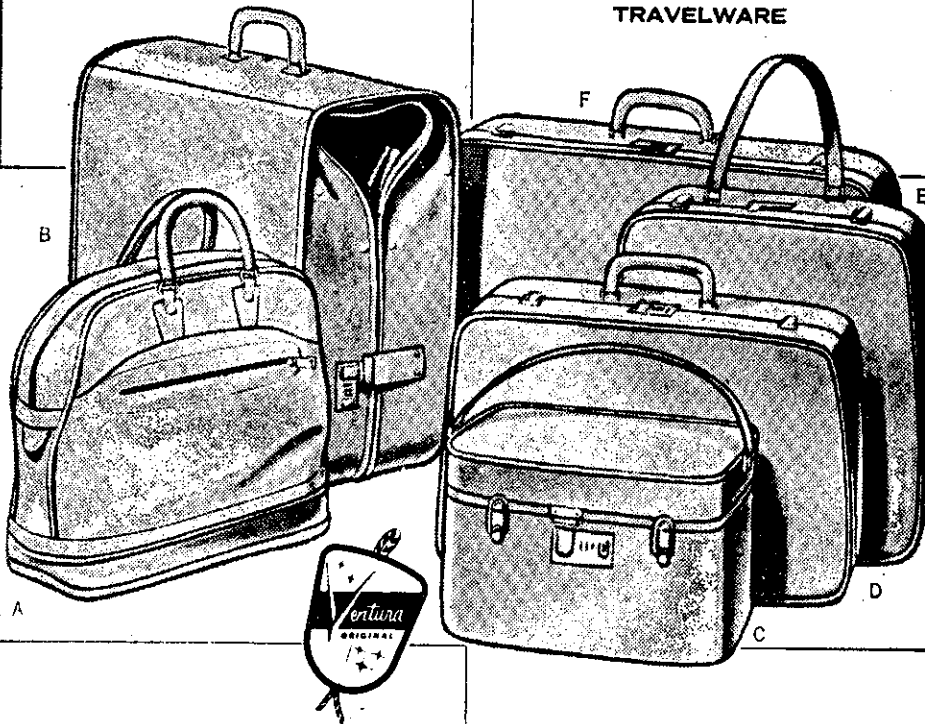

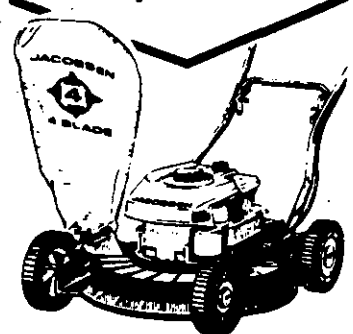

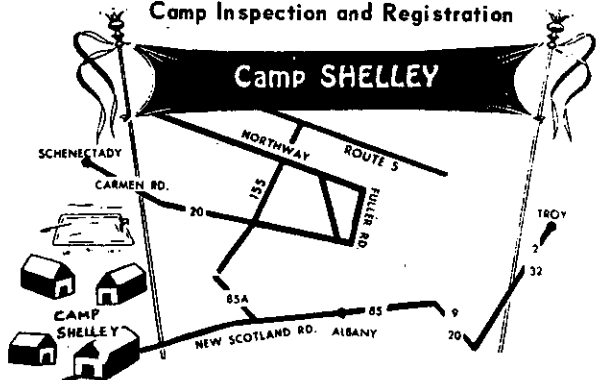

## Oil Co. Wins

A special exception to build a service station on the corner of Feura Bush Road and Route 9W was granted to Atlantic Oil Co. Wednesday night by the Bethlehem Zoning Board of Appeals.

Representing Atlantic was Sibarco Co., the realty division of Atlantic.

Conditions on the permit to build included safety and aesthetic requirements, including regulations on display banners, flashing lights and tire racks.

The board also required the company to construct a four-foot high chain fence along the border of an adjoining property.

A new condition imposed by the zoning body requires that only one A-shaped, three-foot sign may be used per thorough-fare (in this case Atlantic could use two, since it is situated on a corner).

The small signs must not be placed closer than 12 feet from the nearest edge of the road.

The board also heard a request of Mildred Weigand of 9 Maple Avenue, Delmar, to overrule article 13 on yard restrictions to permit an addition to her house.

The request was supported by four statements and opposed by Mrs. Elizabeth Smith, who owns land directly behind the Weigand property.

Claiming "unauthorized use" of her woods, she reasoned that

shortening the length of the Welgand yard would further threaten her trees.

Decision on the disputed construction will be announced at a future time.

Also, Niagra Mohawk wants to establish a sub-station and a hearing has been slated for June 11.

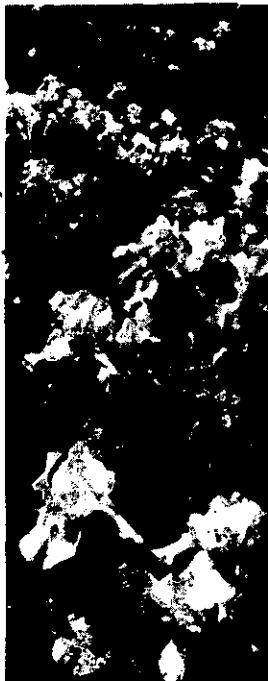

# Trouble Shooting Contest

The 1969 Plymouth Road Runner has been selected as the car that the nation's top student auto mechanics will use in competition at the National Finals of the Plymouth Trouble Shooting Contest.

A record 103 teams will compete in this year's event, which will be held June 16-18 at

the famed Indianapolis "500" Speedway.

The contest consists of two competitions: a written exam worth 30 percent of a team's final score, and a mechanical challenge worth 70 percent. In the mechanical competition, teams race the clock and each other to find and fix several

identical malfunctions deliberately placed under the hoods of the new cars by Plymouth engineers.

John H. Moore, Jr., national manager of the contest, said that every Plymouth Road Runner used in the contest will be equipped with a 383-cubic-inch engine, a 4-barrel carburetor,

automatic transmission and power steering.

"Each school that has a team competing in the finals will receive a 4-barrel carburetor within the next few days for the boys to practice on," Moore said.

The 103 cars used at the National Finals will be painted in four new bright colors now available on Road Runner -- Vitamic "C" Orange, Bahama Yellow, Performance Red and Rallye Green.

"The contest will be colorful as well as exciting," Moore said.

Some 2,000 high schools and colleges in all 50 states are taking part in this year's contest. Contestants are competing for \$125,000 worth of scholarships and awards.

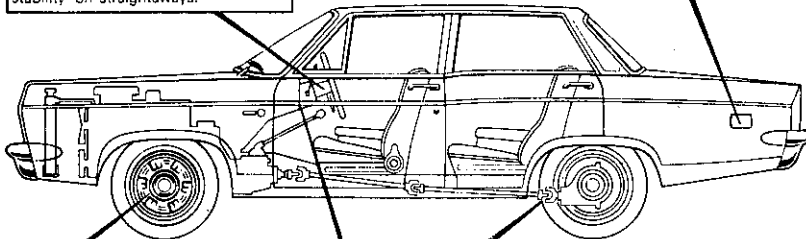

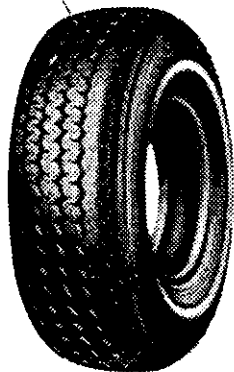

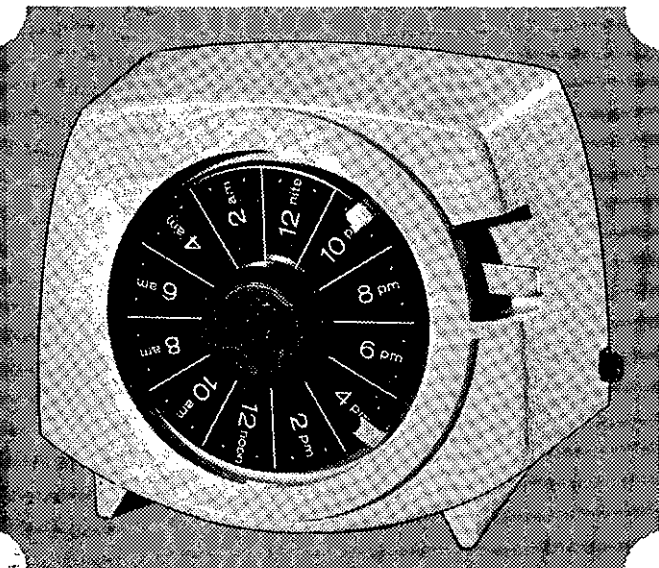

### The Mortgage

The modern home mortgage has come a long way since the 1920's. Mortgage practices were so unsound at the time of the stock market crash that in 1934 the Federal Housing Administration was set up to revise the existing mortgage situation to help put the housing industry back on its feet.

Previous to this action, real estate was financed chiefly through the old-fashioned "straight", "standing", or "fixed" mortgage. The home buyer made a down payment of as much as half of the purchase price and received a short-term loan usually requiring the balance to be paid off in three to five years.

The FHA developed the amortized mortgage, which provides for fixed monthly payments over a long-term period, often 30 years.

The amortized mortgage, now obtained through a variety of sources has made home ownership easier.


