## To The Editor

Having read the May 22 copy of Spotlight, I feel compelled to take issue with your editorial staff and the Citizens for Parental Rights regarding the article "Opposed to Sex Education in Schools" on page 5.

Paragraph four states, "SIECUS materials chosen by the schools are undesirable for teaching children because they are formed on amoral, rather than on moral teaching, such as the film which appeared in the Bethlehem Curriculum, for grade 3, on page 4: THE DAY LIFE BEGINS, by Carousel Films. The SIECUS brochure depicts this as a film showing a young girl's love affair and her reactions on finding herself pregnant. This was chosen for the third grade student, ages 8-9 years of age."

If this were an accurate description of the film, I would agree that it is not appropriate for third graders. However, upon

checking in the New York State Department of Health film catalog, I discovered that the film description above is entirely erroneous. In fact, it describes a film PHOEBE which is definitely not intended for any elementary grade. The following is the film catalog precis on THE DAY LIFE BEGINS: "it portrays the beauty and understanding of reproduction. The diversity of nature is underscored with scenes showing how various types of animals reproduce their own kind. The film advances step by step, tracing the division of the one celled amoeba to the more complicated two celled animals, and finally the reproductive processes of man. Excellent and unusual nature footage shows actual birth sequences of turtles, sea horses, snakes, and puppies. The development of the human baby at three and six months is graphically depicted." Does this sound like a young girl's love affair and her reactions on finding herself pregnant???

My criticisms are twofold; first, I think your editorial staff should have checked with the Bethlehem schools to verify the statement by Citizens for Parental Rights prior to printing it; and secondly, the Citizens for Parental Rights, knowingly or unknowingly, has committed a strong injustice to the sex education study in the Bethlehem Schools and elsewhere through their false and misleading statement.

The damage has been done, the seeds of doubt have been sown. However, I feel the readers of Spotlight should be apprised of this inaccuracy, for the suspicion and doubt it creates may well reflect on their feelings about continuing or incorporating sex education in their school districts.

In the past three weeks, the Swiss JETS have become familiar figures in the community. To date, more than \$25 million has been utilized by ESADA to explore advanced concepts designed to improve the efficiency of nuclear power

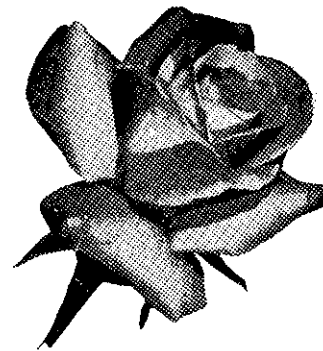
plants. Presently the organization, jointly with the General Electric Company, is conducting a research and development program which could lead to construction of a demonstration 300,000-kilowatt, liquid-metal, fast-breeder reactor in New York State. The fast-breeder concept would produce more fissionable material than it consumes in its operation, thereby holding promise of reducing nuclear fuel costs considerably.

# Budget Advisory Report

At a meeting on May 29, the Bethlehem Board of Education met with members of its Citizens Budget Advisory Committee to thank them for their work this year and to make a formal response to the many

recommendations put forth by the group this year. The Budget Advisory Committee is the main citizen organization through which the Board of Education solicits community recommendations and assistance in budget planning.

Some of the recommendations which have been, or will be, implemented for the coming year are:

1. A master plan as recommended in the 1968 and 1969 Facilities Sub-committee reports is now in the initial stages of organization. This survey will study school facilities as they apply to educational needs over the next 10 years. As recommended, an Ad Hoc citizens and teachers committee will be formed to serve as a Steering Committee to design

and implement the Master Plan study.

2. As recommended by the Program Sub-Committee, summer driver education has been expanded to meet the demands of greater student enrollment. It is anticipated that all students eligible to take this course will be able to do so this year.

3. A directory of community residents who would be willing to serve as resource personnel to assist high school students in independent study projects will be compiled this summer, as recommended by the Program Committee.

## THE SPOTLIGHT

4. While it has not been feasible to create a new position of Art Supervisor for elementary grades this year, an art curriculum committee (made up of elementary art teachers) will be organized this summer under the chairmanship of elementary principal, Ray Stephany. This group will work on developing a revised and upgraded art syllabus.

5. As recommended by the Business Management Committee, the Board will continue to support local government efforts to attract business, commercial and industrial concerns to the Bethlehem area in order to increase tax revenues.

6. The format of Central Highlights has been changed to a less expensive one, to allow for more frequent publication without increasing costs as suggested by the Communications committee.

7. Wherever possible, with present maintenance funds, recommendations of the Facilities Committee will be implemented to upgrade the condition of school buildings. Implementation of the second \$40,000 maintenance plan, recommended after a thorough inspection of all school buildings last year, has been included in the 1969-70 budget, and the first \$40,000 phase was completed this year. A complete list of the action taken in this area is contained in the Board report.

As indicated by the Board, many very worthwhile ideas and suggestions could not be implemented this year due to the pressing financial situation. Many of these items are under further study for possible implementation in later years.



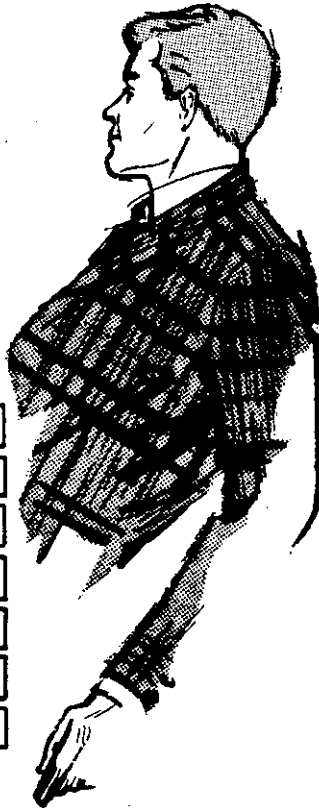

# Board Race Stiffens

Bethlehem Board of Education candidate Mrs. Margrethe Powers said Tuesday night in a debate against her incumbent opponent John H. Clyne that she is concerned about the "possible" defeat of the 1969-70 budget.

The proposed \$7.3 million fiscal plan received a "no" vote from Clyne in a 4-1 favorable board vote. He repeated a charge he made a week ago: "I think the present budget is being presented to the public dishonestly."

Mrs. Powers and Clyne spoke, debated and answered questions before a group of about 75 parents, teachers and administrators attending the Slingerlands Elementary School Parent Teachers Association.

Seeking to become the only woman on the five-member board, Mrs. Powers is campaigning - as is Clyne - on clear-cut platforms which differ considerably. "Re-examine the system," said Mrs. Powers, and "find sources of revenue other than the property tax."

She is in favor of the new budget which would increase the tax rate approximately \$11.26 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation in Bethlehem and \$14.08 in New

Scotland. Clyne says there is "fat" in the budget.

He noted that since he spoke out against the budget about a week ago at Clarksville, the proposed tax rate has dropped from \$12.40 to \$11.26 in Bethlehem. The newer figure "keeps the tax rate under \$100 per \$1,000," said Clyne - "just a little more palatable to the voter."

When Albert Restifo, a Clarksville teacher, accused Clyne of violating standards set by the State School Boards Association by charging his fellow school board members "dishonestly" presented the budget, Clyne said his code is one of loyalty to the taxpayer, not the association."

When Mrs. Powers was asked a question in connection with how she would have reacted if she - as a member - cast a lone vote against a budget, she said she would then give her support to the board's final action.





## Establish Affiliation

Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and Hudson Valley Community College, both of Troy, New York, are pioneering by establishing an affiliation between the private technological university and the

publicly supported two-year community college. Today's signing of the affiliation agreement at H.V.C.C. formalizes cooperation which has been gradually developing during the past seven years between these two institutions of higher learning.

Dr. Arthur Burr, Dean of the School of Engineering at Rensselaer said, following the signing, "I don't think the availability of this approach has been fully realized by parents or guidance councilors as a

satisfactory means to secure a Bachelor's degree."

"The concept of the combining of the two year transfer program with the upper division of education in four year colleges is a growing one both in New York State and the nation."

Dr. Joseph Marcelli, Divisional Director of Engineering Science and Mathematics at H.V.C.C. noted, "Many Community College students who might aspire to a career in Engineering have

forgone their opportunity because they felt they could afford but two years of college. If a student begins his Engineering Science education at the Community College, and proves himself, this program will enable him to enter the Engineering College at the third year level with a greater degree of confidence than he might have had as a freshman.

As a result of this affiliation, no qualified student need be deprived of an Engineering career solely because of finances if he has the intellectual ability and aptitude to pursue such a profession."

The essential purpose of this affiliation is to promote the transfer of qualified Engineering Science graduates from the community college into the engineering school of the university. The objectives of the affiliation are:

1. To promote the recruitment of qualified transfer students into Rensselaer's engineering programs.

2. To assist the Hudson Valley Community College to further develop its Engineering Science program and attract qualified students to it.

3. To give recognition to the Community College-University combined programs as an alternative route to a quality engineering education for a large number of students who may not have the resources to follow the traditional one-college program.

The Engineering Science curriculum of the Community College is one established under the Uniform Engineering Science Program pioneered by the New York State Department of Education in conjunction with the Association of Engineering Colleges of the State of New York.

This "Uniform Arrangements" curriculum has been designed to serve as the first two years of an engineering degree program. Hudson Valley Community College was among the first colleges in the state system to establish such a program.
