The crowning of the first Albany County Dairy Princess was viewed by a record crowd at the Colonie Center June 6th. Bonnifer Smith, the New York State Dairy Princess, officiated at the coronation ceremony on the mall. She placed the bejeweled crown on 18 year old Judy Slingerland.

Judy is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Slingerland of Delaware Turnpike, Delmar. Judy's father, a well known dairy farmer, early this year received special recognition. He was awarded the Century Farmer plaque in honor of carrying on the traditional family industry on the same farm.

Hazel eyed Judy is a student

at Oneonta where she is majoring in Elementary Education with an English concentrate. Seven years of training and experience in 4-H Club work have proven most beneficial to Judy as a member of the National Forensic League. Judy is an outstanding example that beauty and brains do mix. She is the recipient of a Regents Scholarship, and accomplished pianist, and an all around sports enthusiast. Her unique summer work involves trapping, banding and releasing Mourning Doves in her study of the nesting habits of Mourning Doves for the Conservation Departments Upstate Birds Project.

Judy began her reign the day after coronation by hosting with the New York State Dairy Princess and adjacent counties' Dairy Princesses and Dairy maids at the dairy exhibit at Colonie Center. This week long exhibit and program was in recognition of June as Dairy Month. Bethlehem Public Library Budget Goes Down

A large turnout of Bethlehem Central school district voters defeated a proposed 1969-70 budgets of \$7,303,512.

The budget, which would have meant a tax increase of from \$11 to \$14 for district property owners, was rejected, 2,739-2,039, according to unofficial figures.

Incumbent school board member John H. Clyne, who had criticized scored the budget as containing "excess fat," defeated challenger Mrs. Margrethe R. Powers, 2,923-1,831.

The austerity-minded voter also defeated a proposition that would have added 10 new teachers to the school system by a margin of 2,949-1,892. The addition would have cost

\$85,043 a year.

A proposal to buy three new school buses and employ new drivers estimated to cost \$52,761 was defeated, 2,646-2,125.

In another economy move, voters chose to extend the walking distance for sixth grade pupils from one-half mile from their school to one mile. The proposition was overwhelmingly approved, 3,516-1,231.

The 4,800 district voters decided to provide the funds to operate the school system's library for the 1970 calendar year, mandating a \$128,000 expense, 3,140-1,596. A public library trustee, Florence Newell, who was running unopposed, received 4,406 votes.

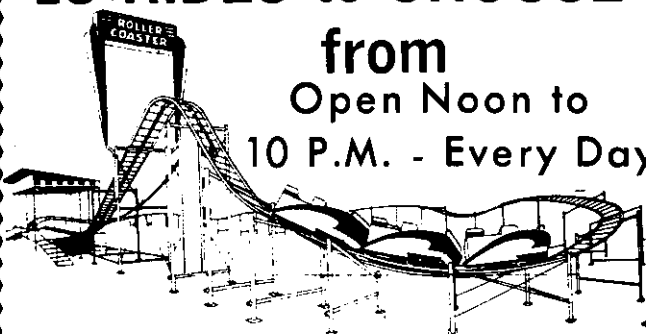

The strange and touching story of the last years in the life of composer Frederick Delius, as seen through the eyes of a young admirer Eric Fenby, will be told on NET PLAYHOUSE - Friday, June 27 at 8:30 p.m. on Channel 17.

The play dramatizes the years that Fenby spent in the mysterious Delius household, and of the incredible handicaps that had to be overcome before he finally helped the blind and paralyzed composer to complete several major orchestral works, including "A Song of Summer," which is the title of this drama.

several film biographies, among them award winning studies of Edward Elgar, Claude Debussy and Isadora Duncan.

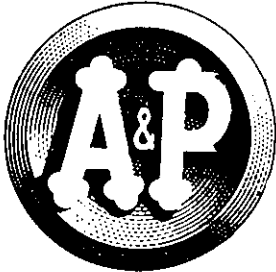

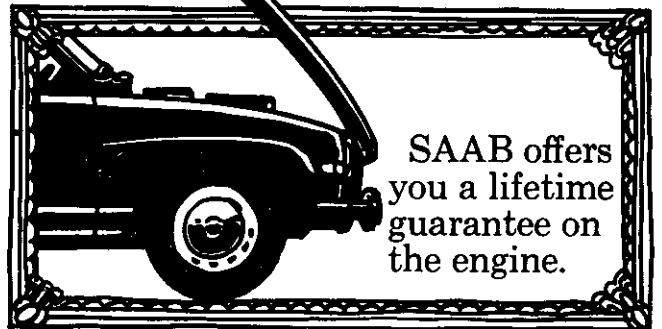

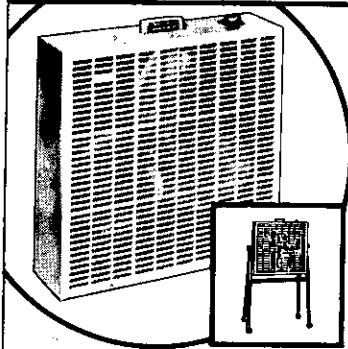

Miss Julia Metzger, niece of the bride was the flower girl.

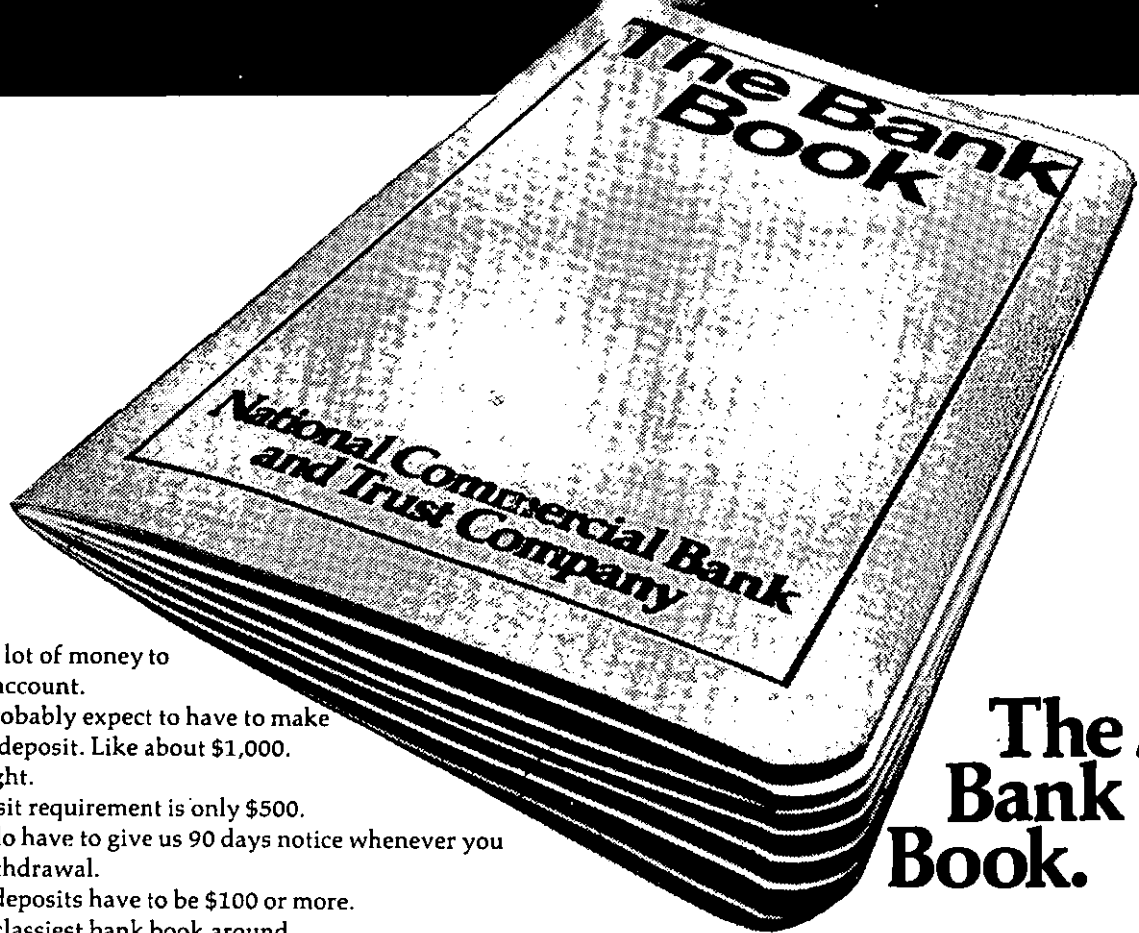

Adopt Budget

In contrast to rejections and narrow passages of budgets at Metroland schools in the Voorheesville Central District, over-whelmingly stamped "okay" on the 1969-70 financial statement.

The budget was approved by a resounding 140-28 with four void ballots.

"Although we've never had problems in passing the budget here, it's interesting to note the turnout was greater than last year," said William Brayden, supervising principal for the 1,700-pupil district.

Last year, the budget was passed by an 84-14 margin.

Voorheesville's new budget is

\$1,942,480 as compared to the \$1,725,380 for the expiring school year.

This increase means a hike of \$6 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation from the current figure of \$86.62 to \$92.62.

It was pointed out at the hearing that the \$200,000 budget boost was mainly in the area of personnel, costs where a \$118,000 increase was necessitated.

Charles Batchelder, president of the school board, explained the increase was due to "hiring of five new teachers because of an increased enrollment of 140 pupils next fall... plus pay raises for the present faculty."

Personnel costs also accounted for \$11,000 in district transportation and \$7,000 for maintenance workers.

Also contributing to the increased budget is a \$165,000 cost for teacher's retirement, the figure up \$42,000 over the current budget.

budget was in the area of debt service where principal payments declined \$17,000 to \$110,000 because the cost of building the 1949 addition to the grade school has been paid.

Robert L. Hayner, running unopposed for election to a five-year term on the board of education, received 67 votes as opposed to two write-in votes for William Morrison.

After the school board meeting, Voorheesville voters approved the \$30,375 public library budget and Wyman Osterhout, running unopposed, was reelected a library trustee. The library budget is up \$5,000 over this years.

Expanded Nutrition

Governor Rockefeller Monday appointed his secretary,

Alton G. Marshall of Glenmont, to supervise and coordinate the Food on the Table and other nutrition education programs administered by state agencies.

The job is unsalaried and will be in addition to Marshall's other responsibilities and duties.

In naming Marshall, the governor said a "coordinated state effort" is needed to assure

elimination of hunger and malnutrition in the state.

"It is essential," Rockefeller said, "that all New Yorkers are given the opportunity to have nutritious food through the expanded use of all existing food assistance programs for the needy."

"However," he continued, "merely providing sufficient food is not enough. It is equally important that the needy learn what food to purchase, how to plan its use, and how to prepare it properly to receive the maximum in nutrition."

The Legislature approved earlier this year a statewide food

program designed to expand the Food Stamp and Commodity Distribution programs available to welfare recipients and other low-income families.

The bill required social services districts to apply to the Federal government for participation in the stamp program.

Since the immediate statewide implementation of the stamp program will be delayed because of insufficient federal funds the districts were told to operate the Commodity Distribution program while awaiting federal approval of the food stamp program.

Arena Theatre

The box office for the Arena Summer Theatre at State University of New York at Albany opened June 18. "Angel Street" by Patrick Hamilton will be the first production of the season.

Located in the main lobby of PAC, the box office will be open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 12 noon to 2 p.m. on Saturdays. Information and tickets may also be obtained during the evenings of performances from 7:30 to 10. The box office may be reached by calling 457-8606.

Arena Summer Theatre will perform in both the open and proscenium styles of staging. Arena, which is in its 18th consecutive season this summer, will alternate its four productions between the Center's Studio Theatre (Lab No.1) and the Experimental Theatre (Lab No.2).

"Angel Street" will open the season July 9-12. Also being produced this summer are "Professor Filarsky's Miraculous Invention", July 16-19; "The Entertainer", July 23-26; "Act Without Words" and "In His Own Write", July 30-August 2.

The state plans to reimburse the districts for all local administrative costs.

Under the program, additional and better placed food pickup centers and increased hours and days of operation for them will be established.


It also provides for restaurant meals for welfare recipients who live alone in accommodations without cooking facilities.

In addition, the state will provide nutrition education, initiate a statewide public information campaign to help the disadvantaged learn about existing programs and a consumer protection program to help assure that the needy are not charged excessive prices.

"The new program, by using every resources available, will help meet the needs of the hungry and the poorly-fed in the state," the Governor promised.

From Ten Charge Cards To One Or Two?

The national average of 10 different charge cards per family is beginning to dwindle, according to James A. Graham, director of Marine Midland Banks, Inc., Card Department. Today bank charge cards account for 52.6% of the total local and national charge cards now in use, according to recent statistics.

The reason for the sharp rise in bank cards usage is directly attributed to two factors, claims Graham. The first is the international interchange feature of many bank cards through affiliation with an organization such as Interbank. Another is the large number of retail businesses, that are dropping their own charge card program in favor of the convenience and economy of affiliating with a bank program. Many national and regional oil companies, airlines, auto rental agencies, travel and entertainment outlets, also now honor charges on bank cards.

Graham, who oversees a \$100 MILLION CHARGE CARD PROGRAM BELIEVES "The plastic explosion is bringing about a dramatic evolution in

charge cards. It is literally survival of the fittest. In only a matter of time we can probably expect to see only a few bank charge cards in use on a national and international basis. One of those cards will undoubtedly have the name "Master Charge" on it. Master Charge cards are now honored in 49 states and 44 countries throughout the world. Despite the relatively new

entry of banks into the charge card field, over \$1.2 billion in sales were recorded in 1968 on Interbank cards. 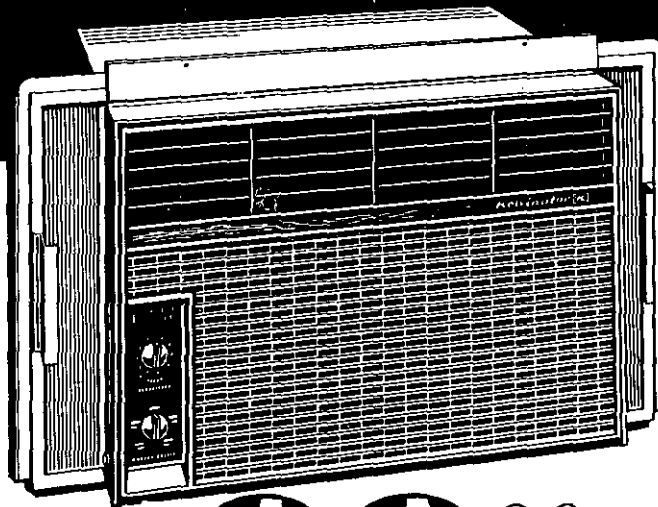





business education. The preparation was made possible through a grant from the Bureau of Occupational Education Research, New York State Education Department.

The study groups met at SUNY Albany to establish guidelines for the conduct of business education in the schools of the state. In his forward, Professor Tonne states that it is hoped that "these guidelines will lead to better understanding of business and use the goods and services of the American business and economic system."

According to the conference groups, "the goal or purpose of business education is to provide learners with the skills and broader competencies needed to obtain an initial job and, later, to qualify for promotions. It is recognized that job skills by themselves do not provide the total education needed for success on the job. Emphasis must also be given to related job skills, attitudes, and competencies in the fundamental processes." The booklet is a recent publication

of the Albany University.

Professor Tonne holds a Bachelor of Philosophy from the University of Chicago. His graduate degrees are from New York University where he earned his doctorate.

Dr. Tonne is the author of several texts which have become standards in the field. His **Principles of Business Education** is considered an authoritative text. Professor Tonne is senior author (with Pephany and Freeman) in producing the third edition of **Methods of Teaching Business Subjects**.

In 1966, Professor Tonne was elected president of the National Business Education Association. He received the Gregg Award in Business Education in 1962. The award is presented annually to an individual considered to be an outstanding business educator in the United States.

Editor

Daniel L. McKinley, assistant professor of general science at State University of New York at Albany, is an editor of **The Subversive Science: Essays Toward an Ecology of Man**. The book is a collection of thirty-seven essays by eminent scientist-writers with editorial commentary dealing with the environmental crisis facing man today.

Professor McKinley received his Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts from the University of Missouri before coming to SUNYA in 1966. He also taught at Lake Erie College and Bowdoin College.

The volume, which is available in paperbound and hardcover forms, is published by Houghton Mifflin Company, Boston. Paul Shepard, senior editor of the work, is a visiting lecturer at Williams College.

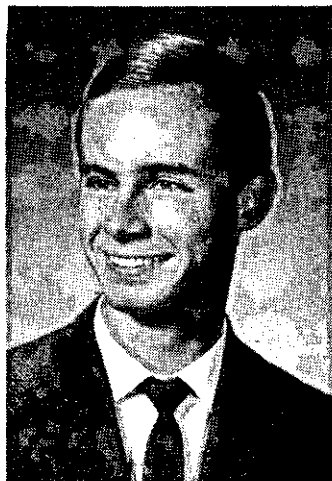

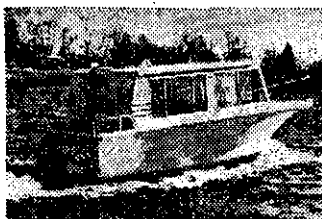

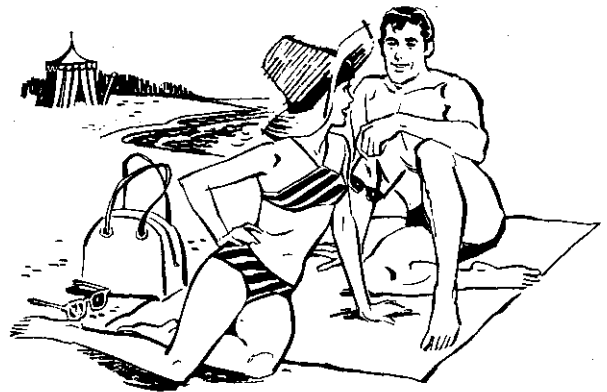

IRS News

Donald T. Hartley, District Director of Internal Revenue for Northeastern New York State has released important information concerning Federal occupational tax stamp requirements.

Persons who manufacture, maintain for use, or deal in or with the businesses or products requiring a Federal occupation tax stamp must, on or before

July 1, 1969, register and pay for occupational tax stamps for the new fiscal year ending June 30, 1970.

The kinds of business or products requiring a stamp involve gaming devices, wagering, narcotics, marijuana, distilled spirits, wines, beers, and firearms.

Those planning to start a business which requires a stamp should register and pay the tax before commencing business, Mr. Hartley said.

Publication 510, "Information on Excise Taxes for 1969," which furnishes

detailed information on this subject, may be obtained by dropping a post card to FORMS, P.O. Box 731 ALBANY, N.Y. 12201.

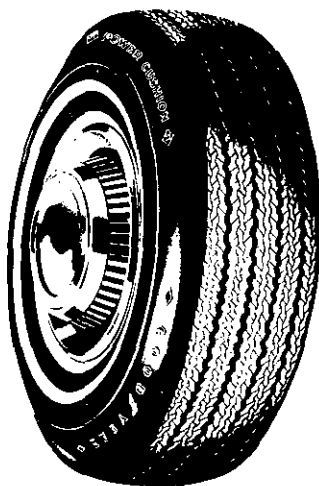

Title Differences

What is the difference between an abstract of title, a certificate of title, and a title insurance policy?

An abstract of title is a condensed history of the title. It consists of a summary of the various links in the chain of title. It also includes a statement of all liens, charges or encumbrances affecting a certain property.

A certificate of title gives the net result of a title search. It shows the name of the owner and the encumbrances and defects of title as of the date of the certificate.

A title insurance policy insures the title in a given name, subject to noted exceptions and encumbrances listed in the policy. It renders the insurer liable to compensate the insured for loss arising from

errors of search and legal interpretation, in an amount not exceeding that stated in the policy.
