Blood Program Seeks 3,355 Pints in August

Nineteen communities throughout northeastern New York State will be visited by blood mobiles of the Northeastern New York Red Cross Regional Blood Program in an effort to collect 3,355 units of fresh blood in order to meet the needs of 32 area hospitals serving over one million residents in the 13 counties serviced by the program, according to William G. Fraser, blood program chairman.

Mr. Fraser indicated blood donations throughout the region for the month of July ran 30 per cent behind the quota necessary to meet the requirements of the 13 county area.

This shortage, he said, has caused postponement of some elective surgery at several of the hospitals serviced by the blood program.

Fraser said bloodmobiles will visit these communities during August: Albany, Amsterdam, Burnt Hills, Chatham, Delmar, Glens Falls, Green Island, Hillsdale, Knox, Lake Placid, Malone, Mechanicville, Niskayuna, North Greenbush, Plattsburgh, City of Rensselaer, Schenectady, Tupper Lake and Waterford.

Blood will also be collected at the Regional Blood Center, Hackett Blvd. at Clara Burton Dr., Albany, during its three regularly scheduled days of operation each week, Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

The blood collections in your area are scheduled as follows:

Whole blood will also be collected during the following hours at the Regional Blood Center in Albany: Monday's and Friday's from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., and on Wednesday's between 2 and 8 p.m.

Prospective donors are free to call the Center, 462-7461, if they desire to make an appointment to give blood. Individual walk-in donors may, however, visit the Center during its regular hours of operation without prior registration.

Quota for each bloodmobile visit is 100 units of blood and the Blood Center quota for each operational day is 35 units of blood.







Learn to Swim Campaign Successful



Lake to Leave Bethlehem Post

Kenneth C. Lake, veteran Bethlehem police sergeant, long credited for his work with juvenile lawbreakers, is planning to retire.

Just when is yet to be determined, but the sergeant's letter requesting retirement was red and accepted recently by the Bethlehem Town Board.

Informed sources report that Sergeant Lake is retiring because of increasing demands from the moving company which he has operated for some time, while continuing on the police force.

Sgt. Lake, who is 55, lives at. 3 Marlboro Road, Delmar, He was appointed a patrolman in December 1953 by C. Arthur Blodgett, then chief of the Bethlehem department. In March 1966 he was promoted to sergeant.

Town Supervisor, Bertram Kohinke explained that a police man may retire in Bethlehem providing he has a minimum of 10 years with the department and has reached age 55.

The Bethlehem Police Department was the first in Albany County to form a Juvenile Bureau to aid youngsters in trouble. The underlying idea was to counsel the young offenders and take other preventive measures to

deter them from acquiring a police record.

Sergeant Lake, along with Capt. Robert Foster, has been credited in the community for the Bureau's initial success. Recently a third man, Patrolman Leo "Pat" Dorsey, has joined the team.

Bethlehem Police Chief Peter Fish once noted that because of the work of the Bethlehem Juvenile Bureau, fewer than 10 per cent of the youngsters are apprehended for a second offense after they complete the bureau's supervision period.

Understandbly, to many troubled young people in Bethlehem, Sergeant Lake proved that he was a friend.

O - Why did you raise the rate on the highway use tax?
