Twenty-three swimmers from the Delmar Dolphins Swim Club participated in the 1969 Wiltwyck Country Club Invitational Swimming Championships in Kingston, N.Y., on August 2nd and 3rd.

Rick Bailey, who will swim in the Junior Olympics in San Diego, Cal., later this month, won the high point trophy for 13 and 14 year old boys by breaking five pool and meet records in the 100 meter Freestyle, 100 meter Breaststroke, 200 meter Individual Medley, 100 meter Backstroke, and 50 meter Butterfly. He also placed second in the 200 meter Individual Medley-Open.

Jim Powers, swimming in the 15-17 year old age group, broke the pool and meet record in the 100 meter Backstroke. He also won the 100 meter Freestyle,

and placed 2nd in the 500 meter Freestyle - Open, and 3rd in the 200 meter Individual Medley events. Mike Fitzpatrick broke the pool and meet record in the 25 meter Freestyle for 8 year olds and under.

Jean Winchel broke pool and meet records in the girls' open 50 and 100 meter Freestyle events and placed 2nd in the 200 meter Individual Medley.

First place in the 13-14 year old girls' 50 meter Butterfly and 3rd place in the 100 meter Freestyle were won by Linda Taylor.

Other members of the Delmar Dolphins, coached by Ned Monthie, placing in various events were Lorren Elkins, Steve Steele, Len Steele, Paul VanRyn, Chris Gilham, Roger Monthie, Dennis Fitzpatrick, Craig Doremus, Jeff Gilham, and Jack VanRyn.

Bethlehem OK's Third School Budget

Bethlehem Central School District voters passed a \$7,132,572 budget on the third try. The vote was 3,160 yes to 1,648 nos.

Reversal in voter sentiment was credited to the work of students and adults in the district who "got out the vote" with an organization called "CRISIS" - the Committee for Reason in Support of Improved Schools.

CRISIS used student power to ring doorbells and distribute flyers to counter the work of an anti-budget group called Parents and Taxpayers.

Projected tax rates under the new budget are \$89.43 per

thousand of assessed valuation for the town of Bethlehem and \$112.96 for New Scotland.

The hot summer day saw a steady stream of voters who were lined up at the door when the polls opened at 7 a.m. Some pro-budget voters stopped to vote before taking off for the hills with canoes and camping gear, according to a Bethlehem school official.

Commenting on the success of the final vote - which by law was the final possible vote on a complete budget before mandatory austerity conditions prevailed - the co-chairman of the CRISIS committee-to-get-out-the vote, Mike Edwards, said

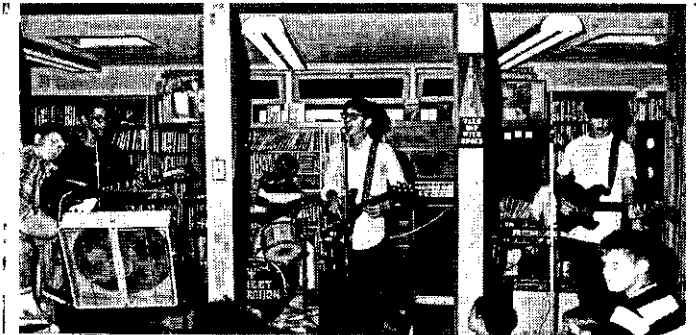

A native of Buffalo, Pfeiffer served as executive assistant to the state comptroller from 1943 to 1946 and as deputy comptroller from 1946-1948. He was elected to Congress from the 42nd District in 1948 and served a single term.

Last year, Rockefeller called upon Pfeiffer to serve as a member of the State Urban Development Corporation's Business Advisory Council.

Pfeiffer also is a director of the International Basic Economy Corporation, Diamond International Corporation, Continental Copper and Steel Corporation, Institutional Investors Mutual Fund Inc., and Struthers Wells Corporation.

Active in civic affairs in Albany, Pfeiffer is a trustee of Albany Medical College, vice president of Albany Medical College Foundation, a member of the Saratoga Springs Authority and the Saratoga Performing Arts Committee, and a director of the Albany Area Chapter of the American Red Cross; the Albany Chamber of Commerce, and the United Fund of the Albany area, and a member of the Board of Associate Trustees of Siena College.

Pfeiffer and his wife, the former Olive Edna Williams, live at 73 Thorndale Road, Slingerlands. They have two daughters, Mrs. William Lueth and Mrs. Frank Coburn Jr.

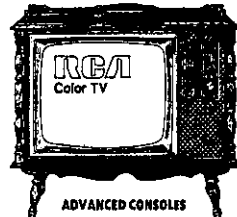

Albany Felt Co. started operations in the Menands - Albany section of Broadway in 1895, manufacturing a single





State Museum Brings Exhibits To Playgrounds

"A Museum on the Move!" So declares the caption on the State Museum's mobile unit now visiting area playgrounds and children's camps. Paul Weinman, Museum education

supervisor, signals his arrival in the manner of a modern-day Pied Piper with a few short blasts on the truck's horn, and the children gather around him for a forty-minute informal discussion.

Weinman, with the help of Museum instructor Peggy Palange, brings nature to the children by using objects from

the Museum's collection.

As the mounted specimens are brought forth, the children reach back into their own experience or knowledge to volunteer identification. Some of the animals are easy to identify--everyone knows a skunk when he sees one, even for the first time. Likewise, a porcupine. Both evoke

knowledgeable squeals from the audience. But the fine line of distinction between a cottontail rabbit and a snowshoe hare needs to be pointed out to the novice. And the buck-toothed face of a woodchuck so much resembles that of a beaver that a youthful audience may need to be reminded that the main difference appears at the tail end. Weinman explains how these similarities and differences in the creatures are adaptations to their life-style.

Some of the specimens are alive. Miss Palange sets a toad and a leopard frog on the ground before her, and prods them gently from the rear to make them jump. Tape-recorded sounds of toads and frogs demonstrate the wide differences in the voices of the various species at different ages and seasons of the year.

Choruses of crickets and cicadas are also presented on tape, so lifelike that one youngster was seen to glance about him upon hearing the sound. Most of these city-bred children have never before heard a summer concert such as this, Weinman said.

An animated book-of-knowledge, the Museum truck is unique in the area. Asked whether the exhibits are limited to creature specimens, Weinman noted that geology and Indian culture are also introduced during the summer. "We see some of the same children popping up several times in different camps as well as playgrounds, so we usually have a variety of objects to show them," he said.

The "Y" camps, Camp Thatcher, the Trinity Camps, and the Oceanside Brownsville children's camp near Windham are on the scheduled route of the truck in addition to Albany playgrounds.



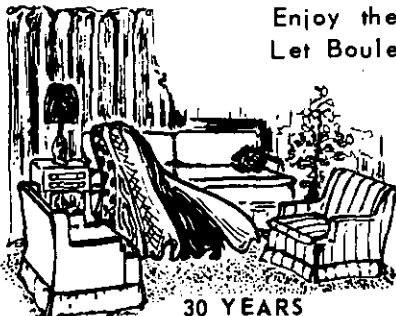
