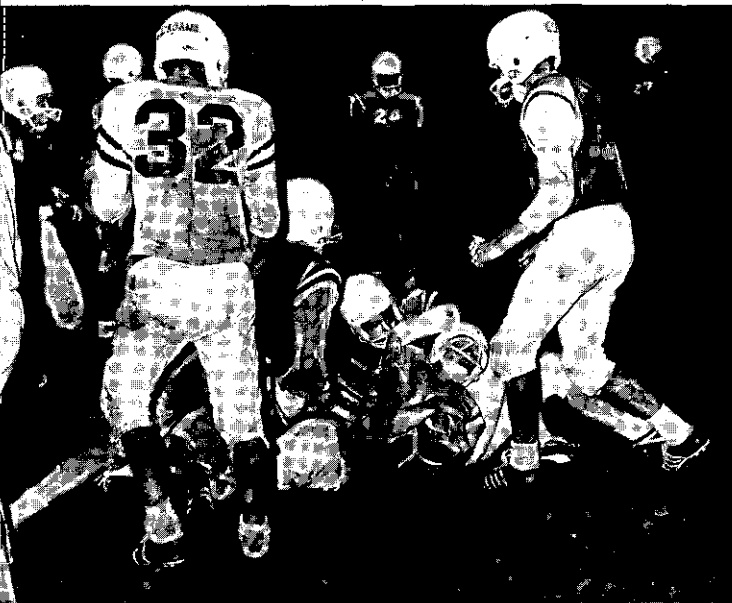

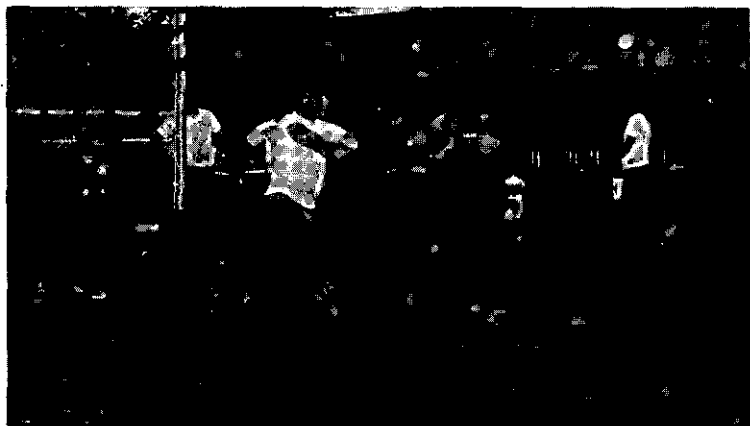

Teacher Loses

An appeal to the state education commissioner by a probationary gym teacher who was dismissed by the Bethlehem Central School District has failed.

Acting Commissioner Ewald B. Nyquist has irrevocably denied further consideration of the appeal of Michael Cardo for reinstatement in Bethlehem.

In an official decision, Dr. Nyquist stated that Mr. Cardo sought to review the termination of his employment by the Bethlehem Board of Education.

The commissioner ruled: "There is no basis in law for granting the relief requested. It is axiomatic that a board of education may at any time during the probationary period, upon the recommendation of the superintendent of schools, terminate the services of a probationary appointee without giving reasons for such termination.

"Respondent has exercised its statutory prerogative in this instance and has done so in the manner specified by statute. For this reason the appeal must be dismissed."

Commissioner Nyquist noted, too, that "many peripheral issues" in support of Mr. Cardo's application for review were considered - and rejected - in Decision No. 999 dated April 14, 1969.

Mr. Cardo was hired as a probationary gym teacher with the Bethlehem school district and taught there from Feb. 26 to June 30, 1968. He was not rehired the next September.

On Jan. 20, Mr. Cardo, acting as his own legal counsel, personally presented his case at a hearing before Commissioner Nyquist.

The former teacher told the commissioner that he was not rehired by Bethlehem officials because of a letter he wrote the Education Commissioner James Allen complaining about a problem in a neighboring school district. Mr. Cardo also expressed belief his age also was a factor. The teacher said, his work in Bethlehem was satisfactory and that the Board of Education had no evidence to the contrary.

During the hearing, however, it was indicated that Mr. Cardo had experienced difficulties with two of his superiors and the matter had reached "stage three" of the grievance procedure prescribed by the Taylor Law.

Dr. Nyquist ruled in April that the Bethlehem Board of Education would have to reinstate Mr. Cardo as a probationary teacher.

After the commission's April decision, the Board of Education voted to terminate Mr. Cardo's employment.

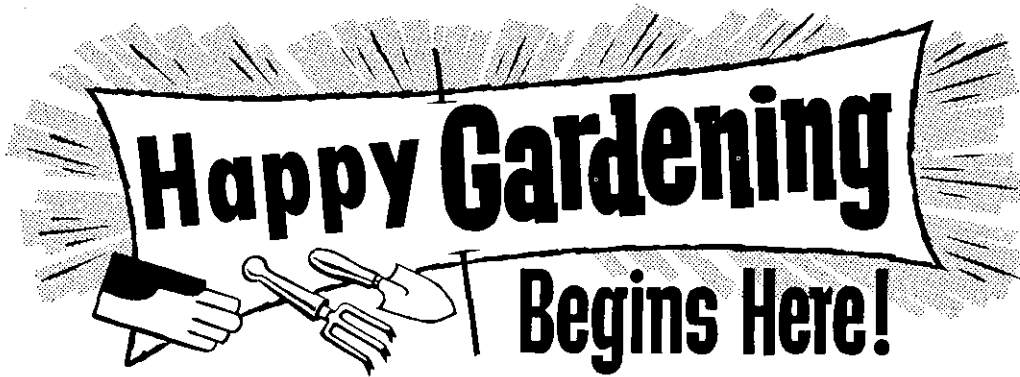

... And It Came to Pass ...

Three years ago the Town of Bethlehem Zoning Board of Appeals denied an application for a permit to construct a McDonald's Drive-In Restaurant on Delaware Avenue in Elsmere. The board decided that traffic created by the business would create a traffic hazard.

Today a Neba's Restaurant is currently under construction on Delaware Avenue in Elsmere about three-tenths of a mile south of the site that was ruled out three years ago. And a McDonald's Restaurant is scheduled to be constructed directly across the street from the Neba Restaurant.

The Neba Restaurant being constructed by Williams Brothers Construction Co. of Delmar, is immediately south of the Albany Public Market Parking Lot.

In 1966 after the initial McDonald's proposal was vetoed by the zoning board of appeals, Elsmere developer Robert Strong appealed the decision to the Supreme Court and the court ruled against the town zoning board.

Soon after the court ruling, the town board amended the zoning ordinance and, among the changes was one prohibiting the construction of drive-in restaurants in CC Commercial zones where the proposed site was located.

The two sandwich shops, which are known for their drive-in service, will operate as restaurants at their Delaware Avenue locations in accordance with the Bethlehem Zoning Ordinance.

The zoning ordinance permits restaurants in a CC Commercial zone, but will not permit the operation of drive-ins without special permission of the zoning board of appeals.

"They are designed to be restaurants and will have to be operated that way," said Bethlehem Building Inspector Robert Collins. "All food will have to be served inside the premises."

The zoning ordinance also requires that an establishment provide a minimum of six tables to be classified as a restaurant.

The site McDonald's proposed in 1966 is just south of the Norman-skill Bridge on Delaware Avenue about two-tenths of a mile from the Albany Public Market parking lot exit.

At the Supreme Court hearing on the initial proposal, Bethlehem Police Chief Peter Fish testified that a traffic count at the location on Nov. 29, 1966 between 7 A.M. and 7 P.M. showed a total traffic

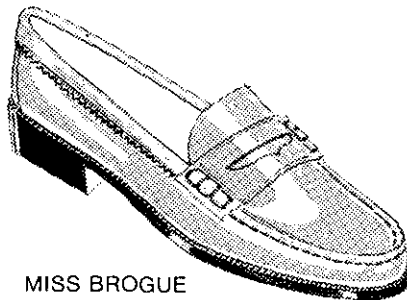

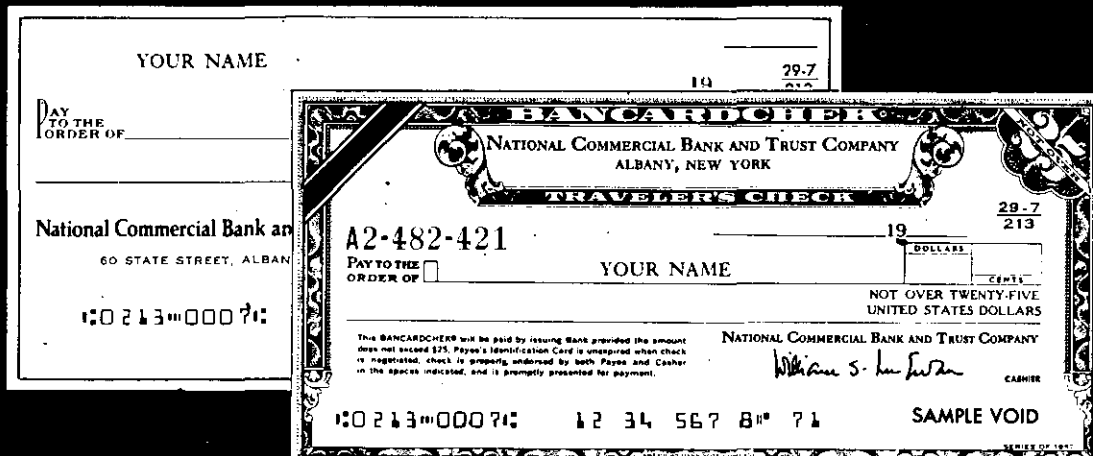

volume of 11,591 vehicles. The chief said it would "be a very poor place to have cars running in and out."

Townpeople also expressed fear in 1966 that the proposed drive-in would create traffic congestion because southbound traffic on Delaware Avenue would have to cross two lanes to enter the drive-in parking lot.

State Supreme Court Justice Harold E. Koreman reversed the zoning board of appeals rejection of the 1966 proposal stating "there was not substantial evidence before the board of appeals to support its decision."

The site of the proposed 1966 restaurant has been approved as the site for a three-story, 70-unit apartment building with parking facilities for 150 cars.

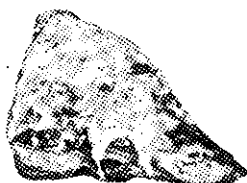

students from colleges and universities in 31 countries are in Boston for three days to consider their responsibilities and mission on the campus and in the world. The theme of the meeting which extends through Saturday, August 30, is "Building in a Revolutionary Period."

Mr. Canham cautioned the students that nihilism, or destruction for its own sake, is tragically misguided.

Law-breaking, he also warned, has no basis, except on rare occasions when one is preparing for court action to test a law's validity.

Christian Science, by its very nature, Mr. Canham told the students, is committed to the mission of radical healing of individual and social ills.

He quoted Mary Baker Eddy, who discovered and founded Christian Science: "One infinite God, good, unifies men and nations; constitutes the brotherhood of man; ends wars; fulfills the Scripture, 'Love thy neighbor as thyself; annihilates pagan and Christian idolatry, — whatever is wrong in social, civil, criminal, political, and religious codes; equalizes the sexes; annuls the curse on man, and leaves nothing that can sin, suffer, be punished or destroyed" (Science and

Health with Key to the Scriptures).

Note well, Mr. Canham emphasized, that "it is God who does this liberating and revolutionizing."


In day-to-day living, he explained, Christian Scientists must strive to understand the meaning of God and to apply this knowledge to all aspects of human experience.

It takes great wisdom and courage, Mr. Canham said, to apply one's growing understanding of God to the needs of the times. He continued, "We should realize that impatience, even idealism, are not enough to cope with a situation. There are many valid facts which govern a given human problem. Solutions are rarely simple."

He counseled the students to be patient with "harried administrators" of colleges and universities, who are frequently "doing the best they can."

The ferment in thought today, he said, can be guided into extremely constructive channels.

"I have a feeling," Mr. Canham said, "that a good part of the revolt is a conscientious expression by people who have been the beneficiaries of privilege and who are rejecting a society which they feel is not suf-

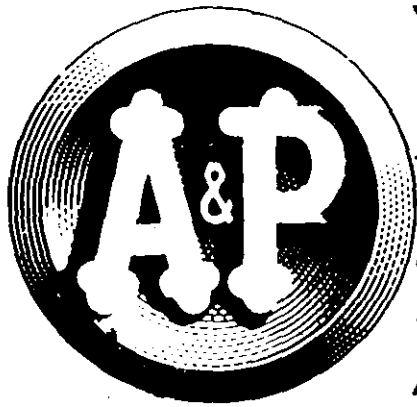

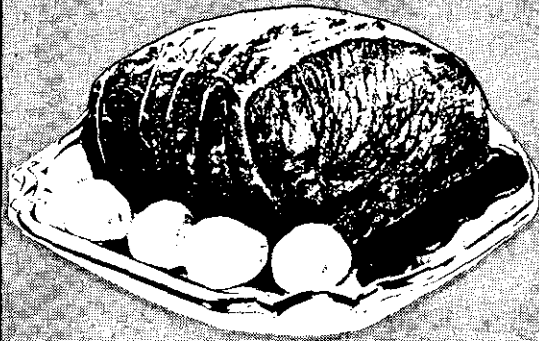



ficiently and honestly reformatively. Very well, let us make it so."

Students came to the meeting from around the world. They represented colleges and universities in Indonesia, South Korea, India, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Nigeria, South Africa, as well as other countries. Nearly 200 students came from Europe.

Subjects dealt with during the meeting included international conflict, violence and revolution, campus unrest, morality, the drug problem, and academic opportunities and challenges. In group and panel discussions the students explored ways that re-

ligion can bring constructive change to all of these areas.

Christ Jesus never tried to "go it alone" in his efforts to reform society, the students were told in the keynote address. Jesus turned to God as a power that makes itself relevant to men through right intuitions and truthful ideas, said Joseph G. Heard, a Christian Science lecturer.

Lore Gore-Booth, recently retired as head of Britain's foreign service, told the students that Christian standards are not self-righteous or stuffy. Being Christian, he said, "is simply a matter of choosing the best and not letting go."

A number of young people told how Christian Science had helped them find and develop activities and careers that are of service to mankind. A Christian Science nurse noted that Jesus had said: "Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you" (Matthew).

William Milford Correll, an associate editor of the Christian Science periodicals, told the students that "what you love will take the lead in your life."

"If you love God supremely," Mr. Carroll said, "you will find yourself in His service. You will find yourself working in ways that meet human needs, that uplift humanity, and help to solve the problems of society. This is in spite of the bigness of society, the mammoth corporation, the huge military complex. Nothing can smother that real desire to serve God. It will find its way in your life."

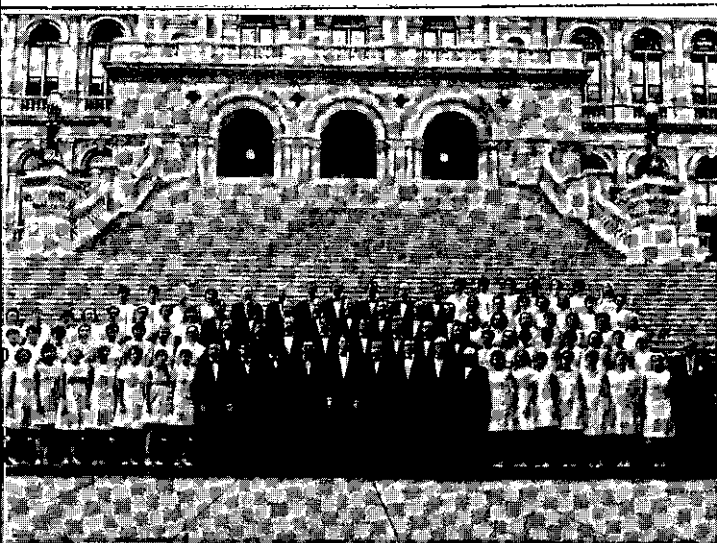
President Decker said that his own Club's involvement was still being planned. The first event to inaugurate the program will be a public meeting open to all of the local residents where special-
