

THE PERISCOPE

This week we continue the transcript of the interview with the highway design engineer, who represents a profession that seems to be having all kinds of trouble with public relations. ENG: It could be either someone misnumbered the exits between No. 2 and No. 4, or it could be we have a new route colored in on some map that goes by there.

PER: Looks like people are building up around there. You better hurry or there won't be any place for an interchange.

ENG: Yeah, I guess you're right.

PER: By the way, why did your department give such high priority to the Washington Ave. Extension when there are already plenty of good roads parallel near by? I mean Route 20, the Thruway, Central Avenue.

ENG: Well, there was nobody in the Pine Bush to object to it. It seemed a good idea to put a

road through to Karner Road.

PER: But why? Who will use it?

ENG: I don't know. Just looked like a good place for a nice road.

PER: Will the new arterial from Exit 23 of the Thruway ever hook up with the Riverfront Arterial?

ENG: Maybe.

PER: I mean, it points to the new housing projects there and just stops. Can't you hook it into the new bridge complex?

ENG: Sure. I don't know how, but we will.

PER: Our time is up. Thank you very much for a most enlightening glimpse of highway design.

ENG: Not at all. My pleasure. And, Perry, don't worry about Exit 3. It'll be built.

PER: Thanks for assuring me. Bye now.

Hearing Set

On October 1, 1969 at 8:00 P.M. a hearing will be held at the Town Offices, 393 Delaware Avenue, Delmar, on the appeal of Benjamin Cohen who wishes to obtain an extension of time to complete the replacement of an old building with a new gasoline service station on the East side of Route 144, formerly known as the Klink property, from the Board of Appeals. The Board granted a Special Exception from Article V of the Bethlehem Town Zoning Ordinance to permit said construction, however, the service station was to be considered null and void if not completed on or before October 1, 1969.

The Good Book says that even God rested on the seventh day, and it is to be hoped that eventually all of us may come to do the same.

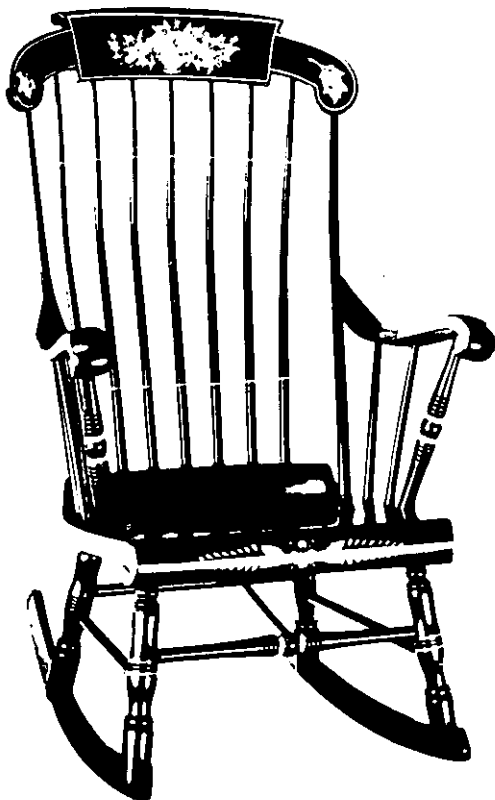

Rug-braiding, an art which would have been as familiar to Betsy Ross as sewing stars on the flag, is a method of braiding woolen strips together so as to form a sturdy, reversible rug or chair seat. Gloria Walker Scannell, who has been teaching the course to area Americana buffs at Bethlehem Central, also teaches in the Voorheesville Adult Education Program, the Schenectady YWCA and in her braiding room at "Country Rugs" on Wormer Road.

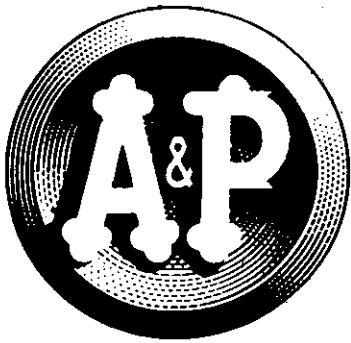

'Teen-age Coffee House

A site has been selected by Bethlehem town officials for use as a 'teenage coffee house but it is the youngsters who must signal final approval.

Today the potential social center smells more of ink than coffee for the location under consideration is a one-story building at 125 Adams Street housing the Caslon Press - across the street from the Bethlehem Police Department and a block from Four Corners in Delmar.

Yesterday afternoon, Town Supervisor Bertram Kohinke led a representative group of 'teen-age and adult planners who since last March have actively sought a suitable coffee house location in Bethlehem. They may now have found it.

The Delegation, led by Curtis B. Matterson, represents Tri Village churches who have pledged to support establishment of a coffee house for Bethlehem's high school pupils.

Supervisor Kohinke said the town now has the building under contract. Bonding attorneys are now working on the routine steps to acquire the property through a permissive referendum. If no petitions for a public hearing on the matter are filed, the town will own the property, the supervisor indicated.

Harry A. Offricht, Delmar resident and owner-operator of the Caslon Press, said the building is available, for he intends to retire. He has been a printer for 50 years.

Sometime next week the 'teen-age and adult coffee house committee members will meet to determine specifics of their proposed building - and how to decorate and layout the interior.

"(Farming on the Fringe)"

"The economic force of city growth on farming is more important than the actual loss of farmland."—Arley D. Waldo, economist.

This is evident in rising land values. Farmers find it difficult to expand operations through purchase of additional land.

Growing nonfarm populations in formerly rural sections create demands for public facilities. New schools, roads, and water and sewer mains are required. These lead to higher property taxes and higher land values.

Farm property taxes are higher near cities than in predominantly rural areas. A 1960 U.S. Department of Agriculture survey indicates a farm tax rise. Farm taxes in metropolitan counties were five times higher than rural counties. In 1959, average metropolitan county farm acreage was \$300 an acre. In non-metropolitan areas, it was slightly more than \$100.
