





gramming," Donald Schein, general manager of the public television station announced recently.

"The Auction was successful. The Auction warehouse is completely bare. About 1,200 successful bidders are enjoying the bargains they bought at the Auction. The items donated by so many generous area businesses sold for about 70% of their retail value.

"Though we sold every item we had in the warehouse, we missed by \$30,000 the 15% of our operating expenses we have budgeted as proceeds from the Auction. 

starting to show that polluted lakes and ponds may have more ability to bounce back to life than was previously assumed.

Pollution from nutrients occurs when there is release of fertilizers, detergents, and certain industrial wastes into ponds, lakes and streams.

It takes on a particularly ugly form when vast quantities of microscopic algae bloom in the water, cutting off sunlight, turning the water a murky green, befouling the shorelines and preventing the growth of bottom weeds.

Continuous evidence of this sort of pollution in the past has led to predictions of the "death" of some lakes in recent years, Mulligan says.

"Our tests at the Cornell Experimental Ponds seem to contradict the dead lakes theory," Mulligan explains.

A year after excessive fertilization of some of the test ponds, he found that bottom weeds had grown back to normal quantities and heavy summer blooming of algae no longer occurred. The implication is that nutrient pollu-

tion is readily reversible once excessive fertilization has been halted

"The experimental ponds represent the same sort of environment that you find at shorelines of ponds and lakes," Mulligan says, "and our hope is that one more year of surveillance on these formerly polluted ponds will bear out our guess that nutrient-polluted waters can recover quickly."

If that succeeds, we think we can predict the response of the algae and plant population if various quantities of fertilizing chemicals reach lakes and ponds."

Major sources of over-fertilization are phosphorous and mitrogen, and these were used by Mulligan in his states at the experimental ponus.

Continuous monitoring by Mulligan showed that the nitrogen in the pond water returned to normal levels one year after fertilization had ceased. Phosphorous levels in the water remained high. Large quantities of both nitrogen and phosphorous were "tied up" in decaying plant mat-

"Excess nutrients held in this manner will only be released gradually," Mulligan explains, "since the plants and algae decompose much more slowly than they are formed."

To qualify as a counselor at this day camp for handicapped youngsters, you must be at least sixteen years of age. Preference will be given to high school students who are sincerely interested in entering career fields which are related to treatment of handicapped children.

Camp Patches is devoted to opening a new door to life to Cerebral' Palsied youngsters between the ages of seven and eighteen, each of whom is given individual instruction in such activities as arts, crafts, games and swimming.

Salary for counselors will depend on the candidate's education and previous experience.

If you are interested in being considered as a counselor at Camp Patches, complete an application which you may obtain from the Guidance Office, and return it to the Albany Cerebral Palsy Treatment Center. If you qualify, the Center will contact you for an interview.

a New York State two or four year college, a hospital nursing program, or a registered private business school. The maximum amount of the Scholar Incentive Award is \$500 per year, but the student is required to pay \$200 of his tuition. Application for the Scholar Incentive Award will be mailed soon from the State Education Department.

To the Editor:


Because it is difficult to enforce Part 190 of the new Air Pollution Control Regulations considering the large pollution living

in the Tri-Village area, and also because it is quite expensive for the homeowner to pay for the removal of burable wastes, I make the following recommendations:

1. That the Town of Bethlehem make available one or two large dump trucks conveniently located (for example, at the Town Hall) during weekend hours so that residents can dump burable wastes at a nearby location. A physical setup similar to Albany's where there is a platform for easy dumping into the truck would also be helpful. Such an arrangement, I am sure, would greatly diminish outdoor burning and would also save money on enforcement (which could then be used to finance the truck idea). The inconvenient location of and distance to the Town Dump are factors which greatly contribute to the continuation of open burning.

# Merger Set

# Extension Gardener

How to Plant Balled and Burlapped Shrubs and Small Trees

Getting ready to plant a balled and burlapped shrub or tree? The following steps listed by specialists at the New York State College of Agriculture may be of real help to you if that is the case.

Have the hole dug before the balled and burlapped tree or shrub is delivered to the site so that planting may be done immediately. Dig a hole somewhat larger and deeper than the ball.

The next step is to prepare a mixture of 1/3 sand, 1/3 soil, and 1/3 peat moss (or comparable mixture) to be placed about the roots of the plant as backfill. (Where soils are shown to be poorly drained or poorly aerated it is frequently desirable to build

a raised planting on top of the soil rather than to set the plant in the ground. In shrub plantings, it would be necessary to lay about 2' or more of the sandsoil-peat moss mixture on top of the soil. For trees, over 3' is needed. The raised planting should be 3' or more in width for a shrub and 6-15' or more for a shade tree. You would place the plant in this raised planting rather than in the ground. This raised plant-; ing makes for a more satisfactory water and air condition about roots of these plants.)

The actual step-by-step operation in ground beds, or in raised beds in poor soil areas, would be the following:

- 1 Prepare the raised bed if one is being used.
- 2. Place soil mix described above in the bottom of the hole. Place the plant in the hole and rest the ball on the soil mix. The plant should be at the same depth as it was in its previous location. This depth is determined by the top of the burlap, which should be an inch or so below the soil surface.
- 3. Fill the hole about 1/3 full with the prepared soil mix. Seat the plant so that the best side shows to advantage. Firm the soil mix in carefully.
- 4. Half fill the hole with soil mix.
- 5. Fill the hole with water to settle the soil mix about the hall
- 6. Cut the rope from the top of the ball; leave burlap in place.
  - 7. Fill in the rest of the hole




