#### MEMORIAL CONCERT FOR ANNE ELBOW

Anne Elbow, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Matthew Elbow, 41 Fernbank Ave., Delmar, was killed last Aug. 9 in an airplane crash in Peru. She had been in Peru since June as a foreign exchange student, under sponsorship of the International Fellowship.

This Saturday Night, Anne's friends in the Bethlehem Central American Field Service Club, of which she was an active member, will hold a folk-singing concert in her memory. The concert will begin at 8 P.M., in the High School auditorium. Tickets will be sold at the door.

All proceeds from the concert will go into a memorial fund in Anne's name, to help pay for future foreign exchange programs. Even though Anne died while on such a visit, her family and friends know that she believed whole-heartedly in the value of foreign exchange visits, enjoyed her own trip to Peru immensely, and would want more young people to have such travel opportunities.

As the International Fellowship Memorial Bulletin said about Anne: "She felt strongly that the opportunity to travel gives the future generation of leaders a chance to bring this world closer together and help to make the people in it one brotherhood."

Before leaving for Peru last June, Anne had completed her sophomore year at Bethlehem Central. An active student, she was a member of the Pacific and Asian Affairs Club as well as the AFS Club, sang in the Swing Choir, was on the feature staff of the Star and served as a member of the Student-Faculty Administration Committee.

She was a leader in her church Youth Fellowship, and her hobbies included piano, ballet and modern dancing, scouting, reading and sewing.

The following are some excerpts from the letters Anne sent to her family while she was in Peru:

"... It's funny how easily one settles into a routine. I feel as if I'd been in Peru forever, but I'm really happy..."

"I've been to two parties since I last wrote. One was a cocktail party to welcome three U.S. American Field Service girls to Piura. It was a real surprise when they introduced me to the group as well. They gave us each a rose and we each had to say a few words in Spanish. Everything was so nice and friendly, it was really very touching..."

"Saturday, the 11th, there was a fiesta in honor of Lily and me at our house. I had the best time I have ever had in my whole life. There was a live orchestra and I danced with almost every guy there... It lasted until about 2 A.M. and even then no one wanted to leave... It was perfect."

"I'm already thinking about coming back to Piura. I wish my stay here wasn't so short . . ."

"I am really happy here and I wish I were going to be here much, much longer. Liliana and I are real sisters and the Saavedras (her host family) are just like a second pair of parents. They worry about us almost as much as you and Mom do."

Anne's mother noted that she had drawn a line under this final sentence — the only time in the entire diary when she did so.



QUESTION: What do the High School guidance counselors do to help pupils get into colleges?

ANSWER: There are 401 seniors at Bethlehem Central High School this year, and about 85 per cent of them will be continuing their education, 55 per cent at four-year colleges and the rest at two-year colleges.

This means that the High School guidance counselors will be processing more than 1,000 college applications during this school year.

In addition, to help pupils narrow their choices of colleges, 75 representatives of college admissions offices have visited the High School from late September through November. 





#### **New Law**

Homeowners may have an extra battle to fight in their war against cockroaches, woodboring beetles and other household pest, a Cornell University researcher reports.

Raffensperger of the New York State College of Agriculture, Cornell, the enactment of the restricted pesticides section of the new Environmental Conservation Law will limit the use, distribution, and possession of a number of important pesticides to those possessing a special permit from the N.Y. State Department of Environmental Conservation.

Raffensperger explained that pesticides that were once commonly displayed on supermarket shelves will no longer be available on that basis. "Pesticides will have to be applied by those with the appropriate permit. These people will be professional

Since the new law prohibits the possession or storage of certain insecticides, many markets are presently liquidating their supplies and are left with a minimum number of the permitted chemicals.

Prof. Raffensperger emphasized that "the pesticide problem of the homeowner is a yeararound event." There are eight to 100 troublesome species and at any given time of the year one of these pests is at its maximum destructive ability.

"For this reason," stated Raffensperger, "we must now find improved methods of handling pesticides distribution to conform with the new law.'

Raffensperger noted that New York State "is setting a precedent with the new restricted pesticide laws."

"Many states will be waiting to see how New York handles the administration of this new law,' he added.

These comments were made last week at the 32nd annual meeting of the New York State Pesticide Conference held at Cornell.



QUESTION: What do the High School guidance counselors do to help pupils get into colleges?

ANSWER: There are 401 seniors at Bethlehem Central High School this year, and about 85 per cent of them will be continuing their education, 55 per cent at four-year colleges and the rest at two-year colleges.

This means that the High School guidance counselors will be processing more than 1,000 college applications during this school year.

In addition, to help pupils narrow their choices of colleges, 75 representatives of college admissions offices have visited the High School from late September through November. Have you ever thought of creating an indoor garden area in your home — in the form of a planter box? This is an excellent way to divide a room, or provide a focal point in a room, suggests Dave Reville, Albany County Cooperative Extension

Agent. Plants add life to a room and the thoughts of something alive and growing in these drab winter months offers us inspiration for spring.

As an example of how plants add life to a room, consider a tropical fish aquarium, with plants. It offers an amazing contrast to the aquarium devoid of aquatic plants. Plants, in this case, are focal points.

In your outdoor landscape plan color and texture are important components of your entire landscape. So also, in a different way, foliage plants can add texture and color. The Norfolk Island Pine — Arauacarie — for example, is delicately fine textured compared to some of the larger leaved plants such as Ficus (rubber tree) and Philodendron. Color is also offered in abundance from foilage plants such as Caladriums, Dracaenas, and Wandering Jew, to name a few.

Mr. Reville states that in designing a planter, be original, use your creative talents and do not be afraid to try something new and different. Try and utilize unique containers you may have around the house. It makes no difference if they have holes in

them or not, drainage can be provided by a bottom layer of gravel. The type and size of plant material will help determine planter size, especially depth because large foliage plants require good anchorage. Regardless of the planter size, it is a significant addition to the decor of a room. This fact should be considered when planning and maintaining it.

In selecting plants for an indoor planter, many factors must be considered. Two of the most important are: light requirements of the plants chosen and relating the plants to the location.

The Cooperative Extension Association of Albany County states that indoor light may be in the form of direct sunlight where the sun shines through the window onto the plant. Indirect bright light can be achieved by placing a plant in a window that does not receive direct sun or near a sunny window beyond the sun's rays. If indirect low light is needed, it can be found on or near an inside wall, or well into the middle of a room. But the light quality needed for normal growth, should be the same for all plants used in an individual planter. This is also true regarding the water requirements.

In relating the plants to the location, first determine where the planter will be located. If it is to be on a table, then foliage plants of average to moderate heights should be used. This would include plants like Ficus, Dracaena, Philodendron and Peperomia. The floor planters permit using larger plants such as Dieffenbachia, Schefflera and Monstera. If you choose to have a wall planter, utilize plants that are climbers and vines such as Ivy, Hoya and some Philodendrons.

In designing a planter, be sure the plants used will form a balanced design in proportion to the scale of the room.

#### **Fund Appeal**

George M. Elsey, American National Red Cross president, announced recently, that a nation-wide appeal for funds to provide life-giving help for some three million Pakistan victims of what may be the worst disaster in world history was launched recently by the American National Red Cross. Earlier, the American society cabled an initial grant of \$25,000 to the East Pakistan Red Cross. Thusfar, some 25 Red Cross societies

throughout the world have contributed some \$2 million in relief for Pakistan.

In announcing the urgent need for funds, Mr. Elsey said, reports of the devastation and suffering coming out of East Pakistan exceed anything his organization or the League of Red Societies in Geneva have ever before encountered in a natural catastrophe.

The ultimate death toll is beyond calculation and up to three million survivors in the disaster area are in desperate need of food, shelter and emergency medical aid. All resources of the world Red Cross organization and other relief sources will be required to

prevent this from becoming an even greater catastrophe through starvation and spread of disease.

Jerry, Coren, Manager of the Hawaii American Red Cross chapter, is flying directly from Hoholulu to the East Pakistan Capital of Dacca to help that country's Red Cross Society with its relief program. He will join teams of other Red Cross relief experts from around the world now in Pakistan or on the way.

Because of the great distance involved and the differences in clothing style and diet, most American Red Cross help and other U.S. aid is going to Pakistan in the form of funds for the purchase of relief supplies in that country and surrounding nations.

Our government has moved speedily and generously in this crisis, and it is now up to all of us to contribute whatever we can to help save millions of lives in Pakistan. The need is so great and unprecedented that all people everywhere must share this gigantic task.

Mr. Elsey said, all Americans Red Cross chapters are being asked to serve as a rallying point for the American people's generous fund contributions to this life saving relief operation.

He, also stated, that contributions made through the American Red Cross and marked for "Pakistan Relief" are tax deductible, and may be sent to the Albany Area Chapter, American Red Cross, Hackett Blvd. at Clara Barton Dr., Albany, N.Y. 12208. A number of contributions have already been received here in Albany and have been submitted.





A) No, employers are reguired by law to withhold social security taxes on the first \$7,800 of wages paid to each of their employees. If more than the maximum is withheld from your pay this year because you had two or more employers you should take a credit for the excess against your income tax. This is explained in the instructions you will receive in January with your tax forms.


